Brief Description:

Under the Global Thematic Programme on Anti-Corruption for Development Effectiveness, project aims to apply the essential lines of action and intervention proposals surveyed and systematized by the UN publication "Fighting Corruption in the Health Sector: methods, tools and good practices" in preventive actions recommended by the Internal Affairs Division Unit at the State Secretariat of Public Health near the State Secretariat of Public Health as a pilot project for further analysis of impact and expansion of initiatives undertaken. In a detailed analysis of the material produced by the United Nations on combating corruption in the health sector, could be identified a series of best practices and tools that could be used to:

- Introduce the issue anti-corruption in operating activities of public health.
- Guide public officials in this sector through technical manual based on international expertise, adapting it to the parameters of reality and needs of the State of Sao Paulo.
- Train public officials in the health sector, with direct technical assistance from UNDP Brazil, from the perspective of local needs, or to hang in the prevention of corruption.

Among these objectives, it is included the preparation of an investigative map, that can demonstrate potential red flags about risks on corruption, where the mentioned guide could be priority applied. After producing the risk map, it will be possible to formulate an anti-corruption plan for the pilot project, including all those steps above. So the anti-corruption agenda, the manual guide, and the training course will be focused in red flags considered mostly important for an effectively anti-corruption prevention, rationalizing in this way the core of the project. Promoting a campaign against corruption at the public health sector and investing on human sources, will also contribute to risk reduction. Educational campaign will help to create a more compliance culture and to promote a stronger commitment among population, professionals and governors.
