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## COPUBLISHING AGREEMENT

For the 'Development of a Special Issue that explores synergies between poverty and malnutrition reduction efforts within the food systems transformation agenda.'

(hereinafter referred to as "UNDP")

### Article 1 – Purpose

Whereas FAO and UNDP agree to co-publish a Special issue entitled **Exploring synergies between poverty and malnutrition reduction efforts within the food systems transformation agenda** (hereinafter the "Special Issue") to the journal entitled **Policy in Focus** (hereinafter the "Journal").

**NOW** it is mutually agreed between parties as follows:

### Article 2 – Rights, Editorial and Production

- 1) The Guest Editors of the Special Issue will be commonly agreed between UNDP and FAO.
- 2) The contents of the Special Issue will consist of 14 articles, 9 of which shall be contributed by FAO.
- 3) UNDP undertakes to inform the authors that submission of a paper implies that it represents original work not previously published and not being considered for publication elsewhere.
- 4) If any material from third parties is incorporated in the manuscript, UNDP shall have procured, prior to the date of manuscript delivery, permission in writing from each copyright holder of such material to use such material in the manuscript.
- 5) The manuscripts will be written in English, clearly and completely edited as to grammar and contents. UNDP shall ensure that the formulation of each paper is clear and unambiguous and that the usage of

technical terms are in accordance with what is generally accepted in this field. Special attention will be given to the language corrections of authors whose native language is other than English.

- 6) UNDP will publish the manuscripts in the same typeset and letter type, format and layout as for regular journal issues.
- 7) Copyright for the Special Issue will be jointly vested in both Parties, along with the right to disseminate the material for non-commercial purposes.
- 8) The reverse of the title page shall include the text of the below copyright disclaimer:

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- 9) The FAO logo shall be displayed on front cover of the Special Issue. FAO shall provide a high resolution version of the logo to UNDP. The specifications for the use of the FAO logo are designated in Appendix 2. UNDP will grant FAO the right to view and approve the use of the logo on the cover prior to publication.
- 10) The Parties share the right to make the Work available on their respective Web sites.
- 11) No royalties shall be due between the Parties.
- 12) No party has the right to assign or delegate this Agreement, or any rights and obligations relating hereto, without prior written approval of the other party.

### **Article 3 – Validity and termination of agreement**

- 1) Validity and term. As of the date of signature by all Parties, this Agreement shall be valid for the duration of copyright in the Work, so long as the Parties comply with the terms and conditions herein. No amendment or waiver of any provision of this Agreement shall be valid unless in writing and signed by the designated signatories to this Agreement. Each party represents and warrants that their respective signatory is duly authorized by all necessary corporate actions to execute this Agreement.
- 2) Termination. This Agreement may be terminated with immediate effect by any of the Parties by providing three months' written notice thereof to the other. Any such early termination shall be subject to the settlement of any outstanding obligations. Article 2.7, Article 3 and Article 4 shall survive termination of this Agreement.
- 3) Signature. The Parties agree that electronic signature of this Agreement shall be treated as valid and legally binding, and that the Agreement shall be treated as original.

### **Article 4 – General conditions**

- 1) Privileges and immunities. Nothing in this Agreement or relating thereto shall be construed as constituting a waiver of privileges or immunities of either Party.
- 2) Correspondence. All communications to FAO related to this Agreement shall be addressed to Chief,

Publications Branch, Office of Communications, Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations, Viale delle Terme di Caracalla, 00153, Rome, Italy. All communications to UNDP shall be directed to Fabio Veras / Research Coordinator.

## Appendix 2 – Use of FAO logo

The FAO logo can only be used in black or in a specific tone of blue, Pantone 279, which is the one used by the United Nations and its specialized agencies.

If the logo is placed on a white background the pantone 279 must be used. If it placed on another background the white or black logo must be used.

The size of the logo should be 2.5 cm width and 1.5 cm height (this is a minimum). The minimum space for clearance between the FAO logo and other elements on all side of the logo is 40 percent of the diameter.
