

Narrative

To address the persistence of conflicts and disasters in the region, the project will give primacy to building regional and national capacity to prevent conflict, manage risk, respond to, and recover from crisis. The project will: (i) develop gender responsive conflict analysis methods and approaches; (ii) strengthen national and regional capacity to integrate conflict and disaster risk assessments into regional and national policies and strategies; (iii) build regional surge operational capacity for rapid response and immediate damage assessments; and (iv) restore the foundations of development by providing technical advisory services for sustainable economic recovery. Proposed activities will be supported by building on the current Regional Program for Capacity Building for Risk Reduction and Recovery in Tsunami affected countries; the Pacific Crisis Prevention and Recovery regional project, and through systematic exchange of lessons learned and good practices.


