Thank you for the submission of the project proposal "*Appui au Dialogue Social et Communautaire Inclusif pour la Paix en République Centrafricaine*" to the Secretary-General's Peacebuilding Fund (PBF). I am pleased to inform you that the Peacebuilding Support Office (PBSO), following the review of the Peacebuilding Project Review Group and the recommendation of the Project Appraisal Committee, has approved the project under the PBF's Peacebuilding and Recovery Facility with a total budget of \$3,508,593 to be implemented by UNDP and UN Women in the Central African Republic over 24 months.

The project proposal aims to enhance inclusive community dialogue in the North-West and South-East regions in the lead up to the local elections scheduled for 2022, with a view to reducing intercommunal conflict, increasing youth and women engagement in the democratic and dialogue process and fostering responsive local governance.

As per the PBF guidelines, project funds will be disbursed by the Mutli-Partner Trust Fund Office in three instalments. The first and second tranches will each amount to 35% of the total budget and the third tranche to 30%. The second and third tranches will be transferred following a demonstrated project implementation rate of at least 75% of the previous tranche and the submission of any PBF reports required during that period. The payment of the second and third tranches is also contingent upon availability of funds in the PBF. Prior to the disbursement of funds, we also expect the entities implementing PBF projects to ensure the timely financial closure of all PBF projects that have ended.

We count on the team to ensure the timely implementation and conclusion of the project and encourage them to apply any lessons learnt from previous implementation experiences and best practices from existing PBF projects. We

As you are aware, monitoring and reporting on peacebuilding impact is a core responsibility of the Fund's mandate. This includes: a) ensuring a timely submission of the PBF project progress reports due annually on 15 June and 15 November and PBF end-of-project report; b) ensuring robust monitoring of project progress, risks and results and advising PBSO if project amendments are required or if obstacles arise that may impact project outcomes; and c) managing a high-quality independent evaluation, engaging PBSO in the evaluation process. An audit is also required at the end of the project.

Please note that all entities receiving an allocation from the PBF are obligated to ensure the visibility of the Fund. This should include both the identification of success stories within routine reporting as well as through the recipient United Nations organization's strategic communications products.

I look forward to continuing to work with you. I trust you will keep us appraised of the situation on the ground and any issues which may have an impact on this project.
