In 2016, Cameroon recorded a real GDP growth rate of 4.5 %. The GDP growth rate per capita dropped 1.2 percentage points, from 3.2% in 2014 and 2015 to 1.8% in 2016 2016.

Heads of States and Governments of the member countries of the United Nations adopted in September 2015, a new Agenda for Sustainable Development by 2030. This new agenda, which proclaims that "noone should be left behind", includes 17 goals, 169 targets and about 231 indicators. The latter help s tracking progress made towards the elimination of poverty in all its forms and in all its dimensions, access to basic infrastructures such as water, education, health, earth, etc. In order to achieve those goals, the principle of indivisibility of these objectives calls for simultaneous environmental, economic and social implementation.

The process of contextualization and appropriation of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) was conducted in Cameroon by the Ministry of the Economy, Planning and Regional Development. National Institute of Statistics coordinated the drafting of the report on the baseline situation of the SDG monitoring indicators in Cameroon. This situation is presented as follows: 146 targets out of 169 were selected, ie 86%. Out of the 146 targets, 60% have indicators with baseline values available in 2016.

In the National Statistics Development Strategy (NSDS) 2015-2020 aligned with the SDGs, 217 indicators out of approximately 231 were selected to monitor the 146 targets. Among the 217 indicators selected:

- 48% are informed (baseline situation);
- 34% are in progress or may be included in statistical operations of the NSDS:
- 18% can be produced if means are available. Otherwise, statistical operations requiring new methodologies.

- Group 1: These are the indicators produced by the SNIS (National System of Statistic Information) and whose value exists for the reference period.
- **Group 2:**These are indicators that are in process or that can be included in the statistical operations of the 2015-2020 NSDS.
- Group 3: These are indicators which feasibility is possible if means are available.

" 48% of indicators inform the baseline situation in 2016".

This baseline situation calls for taking into account statistics and indicators of the SDGs in data production methodologies. Therefore, areas where methodological work must be quickly undertaken are :

- Administrative sources statistics, especially vital statistics;
- Environment and climate change statistics
- Rural sector statistics

Between 2004 and 2011, the maternal mortality ratio continued to deviate from the national target (350 per 100,000 births).

One person out of ten (9.9%) suffered from undernourishment between 2014-2016 in Cameroon.
