## Partnership Strategy:

The Engage (2011-2013) project functions on the idea of networking and partnership formation. As an integral part of the Peace It Together (PIT) Network, it aims at further fostering collaborations within it first as well as beyond it. Within PIT, ENAGE will collaborate with the **Cyprus 2015** and **Interdependence** projects on advocacy at Track 1 level as well as the development of Active Dialogue Networks (ADNs) and enhancement of the Active Citizenship Campaign; **MIDE** on sharing research results related to multi-perspectivity in order to promote democratic values and active citizenship; **Youth Activism** on the youth component of the project; **CCMC** for outreach; Future Together on the Peace and Reconciliation ADN. In terms of external partners, ENGAGE will work with **authorities, unions, civil society, the private sector, academia** and **opinion leaders** who will be invited to be part of the ADNs and advocacy campaigns.
