Welcome and introductions

Dr Kyra Paul welcomed the group and invited members to introduce themselves. She thanked members for their participation in this important meeting. She invited Ms Evanson to present on project progress.

Progress update on activities and project targets

Ms Evanson referred to the status of project progress as described in the December 2019 report and proceeded to review each output, and the intended targets for the final quarter of the project.

Members were invited to share updates on each target and actions until project end. These are summarised below:

Stakeholder Response Mechanism

Mr LaCorbiniere provided a summary of UNDP's corporate Stakeholder Response Mechanism (SRM) which is available to affected project stakeholders for the resolution of grievances arising from the project.

The SRM ensures individuals, peoples, and communities affected by projects have access to appropriate grievance resolution procedures for hearing and jointly addressing complaints and disputes related to the social and/or environmental impacts of UNDP-supported projects. It helps project-affected stakeholders, governments and others partners jointly resolve concerns and disputes. It is available when Implementing Partner and UNDP project-level stakeholder engagement processes have not successfully resolved issues of concern.

Any person or community potentially adversely affected by a UNDP-supported project may file a request. If they have raised their concerns with Implementing Partners and/or with UNDP through standard channels for stakeholder consultation and engagement and have not been satisfied with the response. Once the UNDP Country Office determines that the request is appropriate for the SRM, the involvement of the SRM will continue as long as the stakeholders believe it is beneficial, or until agreement is reached.

The SRM Guidance was circulated after the meeting.

Project closure

Ms Evanson advised the group that with the project ending on 31 March, there were a number of actions needed to bring it to an official close. Among these are:

- The final project review of the results achieved, their sustainability and lessons learned. This should have input from a range of stakeholders engaged in the project, including PSC members who are encouraged to engage actively in the consultation process.
- Quality Assurance Report
- Final financial report

Ms Evanson summarised the action points emerging from the discussion:

- Organise meetings with the NDA, UNDP and Consultants (CBO and Gender Specialist).
- The civil society Technical Working Group and NDA are to meet before month-end.
- PS Joseph to follow up on the GoCD GCF Focal point nomination letter.
- Consultants to develop joint GCF proposal with private sector and civil society.
- Conduct lesson learnt survey with input from PSC and other stakeholders.
