Brief Description of the Project

The government of Ethiopia's overarching energy objective is to ensure reliable supply of energy at the right time and at affordable prices, particularly to support the country's agricultural and industrial development strategies. The sustainable energy component is an integral part of UNDP's continued support to the Climate Resilient Green Economy (CRGE) programme and Government of Norway Energy+ cooperation that aims to contribute in achieving the countries overarching objective of the energy sector. Thus, this project intended to play a catalytic role in strengthening coordination capacity of the MoWIE, with a view to implementing the energy components of Ethiopia's CRGE strategy and ensuring Sustainable Energy for All (SE4ALL). Specifically, this capacity building project will contribute to enhancing the coordination capacity of the MoWIE and facilitate framework setting to implement the CRGE strategic objective for the energy sector and the three intertwined objectives of the SE4ALL which Ethiopia is part of an opt-in country. In addition to targeted capacity development, the interventions will contribute evidence-based knowledge and experience to enhance Ethiopia's energy sector development through grid and decentralized or beyond the grid energy supply system.

Background

The Government of Ethiopia has a vision to be a renewable energy hub in the Eastern Africa Region by 2015. The mission is to play a significant role for socio-economic development and transformation of the country through provision of a sustainable, reliable, affordable and quality energy service for all sectors in an environmentally benign manner. Thus UNDP in collaboration with other key development partners such government of Norway has developed a project, Strengthening Capacities for Increased Access to Sustainable Energy, to support the Government of Ethiopia in achieving the sated mission.

This project on sustainable energy is a component of UNDP's comprehensive assistance through its Climate Resilient Green Economy (CRGE) Programme¹ to the implementation of the strategy particularly the energy component and the Government Norway Energy + cooperation with the government of Ethiopia. As a well-functioning energy sector is a crucial factor for development and poverty alleviation undertakings in Ethiopia, enhancing institutional capacity and setting bold, ambitious but achievable targets is a fundamental factor to ensure long lasting and transformational change in the sector.

In this connection, the government has set robust targets in its Growth and Transformation Plan (GTP) which are further elaborated in the CRGE strategy that identified electric power expansion and electricity generation from renewable energy for domestic as well as export markets; and leapfrogging to modern and energy-efficient technologies in transport, industrial, and other energy consuming sectors as two of its four major green economy pillars. The government has also recently undergone in setting up of new institutions such as Energy Authority, Utility and Power Generation institutions to address this dynamic sector.

Despite continued efforts of the government in Institutional arrangement, robust visions for the sector; there are major constraints that need immediate intervention including inadequate institutional frameworks to expedite the development of the energy in which the private sector can play a big role. And lack of integrated and coordinated mechanisms to leverage nationally and internationally available financial resources and technologies. Moreover, the absence of sound monitoring and evaluation framework and insufficient investment in research and development (R&D) in the sector still remain a challenge and obstacles to achieve the sated vision.

This project is therefore developed in collaboration with the Ministry of Water, Irrigation and Energy (MoWIE) and development partners, including the Government of Norway, to strengthen the coordination capacity of MOWIE to implement the CRGE strategies of the energy sector. It will also help the country in attaining the three intertwined objective of the SE4ALL initiatives at the country level which aims to doubling energy access, efficiency and renewable sources by 2030. This project expected to strengthen the capacity of MoWIE through specific outcomes:

Output 1) Institutional capacities of MoWIE strengthened and national level coordination mechanisms established

Output 1.1: Coordination unit frameworks in place: framework established to provide high level advisory and technical support to implement CRGE strategic priorities with other initiatives such as Energy + SE4ALL, ENDEV/GIZ, Power Africa, World Bank Rural Energy, EU/EDE.

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- Output 1.2: Coordination capacity unit established: combination of national and international experts in place within the ministry to assist in having an energy sector coordination mechanism established and operationalized.
- Output 1.3: Coordination mechanisms in place: mechanisms established to promote that coordination within the energy sector is reflected and guided by relevant policies notably the CRGE and the GTP, for MRV including the national database CRGE registry, and the flow and link with the national public financial management and budget system both the regular one and the CRGE facility.
- Output 1.4: Gender mainstreamed in the energy sector: provided capacity building support to implementation GAP³ (Gender Action Plan)
- Output 2) CRGE strategic objectives specifically the energy sector implementation framework, established at all levels through active private sector involvement and by leveraging nationally and internationally available resources.
 - Outputs 2.1: Framework established and institutional arrangements strengthened to enhance absorption capacity of the sector.
 - Output 2.2: Financing mechanisms, including for results based financial² support established: developed a robust resource mobilization strategy aligned with the national CRGE facility to secure resources for the implementation of programmes and taping climate financing mechanisms, including results based ones such as Energy +, in order to double access, efficiency and increase renewable energy.
 - Output 2.3: Enabling environments for active private sector involvement in the energy sector created: capacity enhancement for MoWIE particularly with in the SME/small and medium enterprise development directorate provided
 - Output 2.4: Energy sector R&D and quality control enhanced: Strengthened federal as well as regional laboratories and testing centers; guidelines and technical codes in place; necessary equipment and machineries in place/installed.

Project overall indicator: Integrated CRGE coordination mechanism in place linking federal, regional and woreda levels vertically and horizontally across sectors.
