





KEY RESULTS SEPTEMBER 2015 – NOVEMBER 2017



11010 people (5283 women, 4987 men and 740 children) benefited from the REACH mobile awareness raising and service delivery.

589 communities in 88 districts in 14 provinces across Central, Eastern, Northern and Western Divisions and Rotuma received the REACH mobile awareness raising and service delivery.



13756 services (7557 women and 6199 men) immediately provided in the communities by the Ministry of Women, Children and Poverty Alleviation, the Legal Aid Commission, the Human Rights and Anti-Discrimination Commission, and other institutions.

165 people (93 women and 72 men) from the Ministry of Women, Children and Poverty Alleviation, the Legal Aid Commission, the Human Rights and Anti-Discrimination Commission and other key stakeholders further strengthened their capacity to undertake awareness raising and service delivery.
