Subject: Request for no-cost extension of the UK-funded "Pacific Anti-Corruption Project"

Reference is made to the Contribution Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom (UK) and the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) of 23 July 2021 for the implementation of the "Strengthening Anti-corruption, Transparency and Accountability in the Pacific Islands Countries - Pacific Regional Anti-Corruption Project", FCDO reference PAP CSSF 000082.

Firstly, we would like to extend our sincere appreciation and gratitude to the UK Government for having partnered with UNDP to contribute to advancement of the anti-corruption and governance agenda in the Pacific. Your partnership with UNDP has been instrumental for stepping up the anticorruption work and achievement of measurable results in a very short period of time.

With end of March 2022 being the planned end date for this phase of the project, we are pleased to inform you that most of the planned project activities and targets as stipulated in the project proposal will not only have been completed but will have even been exceeded. In terms of the status of financial resources, the estimated savings at the end of March will amount to 150,000 US\$ mostly due to the prevailing COVID-19 travel restrictions, the inability of the activities to be organized inperson and UNDP initially covering for the staff costs in the transition period while the Project Assistant was being recruited and came on board in early 2022.
