MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

BETWEEN

THE UNITED NATIONS DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME (UNDP) COUNTRY OFFICE IN GUINEA BISSAU

AND

THE UNITED NATIONS DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME (UNDP) OFFICE IN BELGIUM

ON

The Support of the Joint European Commission (EC) and UNDP Task Force on Electoral Assistance/UNDP Brussels
Office to the Project "Support to the Electoral Cycles 2010-2012 in the PALOP and Timor Leste" (Pro
PALOP-TL)

This Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") is entered into by the United Nations Development Programme ("UNDP") Country Office in Guinea Bissau represented by the UNDP Resident Representative in Bissau, and the United Nations Development Programme ("UNDP") Office in Belgium, represented by the UN/UNDP Director in Brussels. Both are hereinafter jointly referred to as the "Parties".

Whereas the EC-UNDP Partnership proved to be helpful to comprehend and better handle the complex set of interactions among EC and UNDP services, Electoral Management Bodies, other electoral assistance providers and stakeholders, and that this corporative approach and partnership between UNDP and EC in electoral assistance is the backstage for a new cooperation framework with the European Commission in support of the ACP Portuguese Speaking Countries electoral cycles;

Whereas on the 21st April 2006, the EC and UNDP signed the EC/UNDP Operational Guidelines for the Implementation of Electoral Assistance Programs and Projects that were revised on December 2008 to outline the Terms of Reference of the Joint EC-UNDP Task Force on Electoral Assistance and identify practical measures for the strengthening and the facilitation of the already established cooperation between the EC and the UNDP in the domain of electoral assistance (in full respect of the provisions laid out in the existing Financial and Administrative Framework Agreement (FAFA) between the EC and the UN);

Whereas the Parties recognize that the Joint EC-UNDP Task Force is supported by the UNDP Brussels Office to operationalize the above referred partnership and provide support to the implementation of UNDP Electoral Assistance Programmes, Projects and Operations with EC contribution, capitalizing up on the lessons learnt and proposes tools and methodologies for capacity development in this area;

Whereas the Pro PALOP-TL is a stand-alone initiative with a dedicated EC funding source and the support of the Joint EC-UNDP Task Force on Electoral Assistance/UNDP Brussels Office to help implement its activities in close collaboration with other initiatives in UNDP's democratic governance portfolio and with other programmes being implemented in these countries;

Whereas it is recognized that the Pro PALOP-TL strategy is based in a structured approach that addresses common needs of six beneficiary countries (Angola, Cape Verde, Guinea Bissau, Mozambique, São Tomé e Príncipe and Timor Leste) but considers specificities of each one of them regarding political context, legal and institutional framework, as well as their specific needs within the different project's entry points;

Whereas is considered that this complex and innovative strategy poses challenges to the project implementation modality (DEX/DIM) and sustainability, more specifically regarding results based

management and a cost efficient activities' implementation and that these challenges are essentially posed to project assurance and support to be provided UNDP Country Offices in Guinea Bissau (Project Unit) and in other PALOP and Timor Leste to monitor project implementation and respond effectively to emerging issues and eventual shortcomings;

Whereas the Parties agreed that coordination among these actors should therefore be at all moments promoted and that carefully designed annual work plans must reflect the project's approach and respond to the above mentioned challenges, among others, through the support of Joint EC-UNDP Task Force/UNDP Brussels Office to project management to ensure liaison among these actors, harmonise annual work plans and activities to be implemented, provide guidance in terms of EC-UNDP procedures and guidelines, reporting and visibility matters;

Now, therefore, the Parties agree to cooperate as follows:

Article I: Purpose

- 1. The purpose of this MoU is to provide a framework of cooperation and facilitate collaboration between the Parties, on a non-exclusive basis, in areas described in the Annex 1 (Description of Activities) to the present MoU.
- 2. The overarching goals of the Parties' support are to assist the Pro PALOP-TL implementation in:
 - a) Delivering Technical Assistance and advice through the Joint EC-UNDP Task Force/UNDP Brussels Office to different phases of the PALOP and Timor Leste 2009-2011 electoral cycles, building on the lessons learnt and experiences shared among the PALOP, Timor Leste, Portugal and Brazil in line with the Pro PALOP strategy, purposes and activities; and
 - b) Supporting the implementation and monitoring of activities aiming at the consolidation of Lusophone EMBs within the ACE Electoral Knowledge Network and the dissemination of tools and methodologies on electoral management, in Portuguese, adapted to the needs and specificities of PALOP and Timor Leste.
- 3. The Parties have decided to establish this assistance and coordination mechanism to support the overarching goals as described above in recognition of the key role the Joint EC-UNDP Task Force/UNDP Brussels Office played in the project formulation phase, but also in the coordination of the different project's stakeholders within the six beneficiary countries and in the implementation of all electoral training and knowledge dissemination activities, as acknowledged in the EC UNDP Operational Guidelines on the implementation of electoral assistance programmes and projects (December 2008);

Article II: Areas of Cooperation

- 1. More specifically, the Parties agree to cooperate in the following areas of activity (described more in detail in Annex 1):
 - a) In close collaboration with the Pro PALOP-TL Chief Technical Advisor, provide technical assistance and advice to UNDP Country Offices in Guinea Bissau, the other PALOP and Timor Leste for the Pro PALOP-TL start-up, implementation and monitoring;
 - b) Translate Tools and methodologies on electoral assistance and management in Portuguese adapted to the needs and specificities of PALOP and Timor Leste, namely:
 - i. Translation and delivery of the BRIDGE training module in electoral administration in Portuguese Language; and
 - ii. Production of face-to-face and e-learning Training Modules on Electoral Administration in Portuguese Language, and translation to Portuguese of existing literature on electoral assistance and electoral administration;
 - c) Provide technical assistance, advice and follow-up the consolidation of the Lusophone electoral management bodies in association with the ACE Electoral Knowledge Network, namely:
 - i. Translation of the ACE Encyclopaedia in Portuguese (www.aceproject.org).

Article III: Implementing Arrangements

- 1. All activities under this MoU will be carried out on the basis of the Pro PALOP-TL in accordance with UNDP regulations, rules and directives. The respective project document was signed between UNDP Country Office in Bissau and the Government of Guinea Bissau.
- 2. For contributing to project, the European Commission concluded a closed trust fund agreement¹ with UNDP Country Office in Bissau in accordance with UNDP regulations and rules.
- 3. The parties agree that the support of the Joint EC-UNDP Task Force to the Pro PALOP-TL, as stated in the Project Document, will be coordinated and supervised by the Senior Electoral Advisor of UNDP Brussels Office, also coordinator of the Joint EC-UNDP Task Force, together with the an Electoral Assistance Specialist to be recruited.
- 4. The Parties agree that before the completion of the recruitment process of the dedicated Programme Management Unit (PMU) and other staff foreseen in the project document, in addition to the Electoral Assistance Specialist to be recruited by the Joint EC-UNDP Task Force/UNDP Brussels Office on the basis of a Fixed Term Appointment (FTA), UNDP Guinea Bissau will recruit an Electoral Assistance Expert on a temporary basis for a period of six months to carry out the activities in line with the Terms of Reference outlined in Annex 2 ("Terms of Reference Electoral Assistance Expert") to this MoU.
- 5. In line with the Article 3.1.3. of the revised EC-UNDP Operational Guidelines on the Implementation of Electoral Assistance Programmes and Projects, this expert will be recruited on the basis of CV provided by the Joint EC-UNDP Task Force from its pool of part-time external experts, familiar with the procedures and strategy of EC and UNDP regarding electoral assistance.
- 6. Considering the high expectations from the European Commission at HQ and concerned country level, and in particular from PALOP and Timor-Leste States via their respective Electoral Management Bodies, the Electoral Assistance Expert will be immediately recruited by UNDP Guinea Bissau to support the Country Office, together with Senior Electoral Assistance Advisor/Joint EC-UNDP Task Force Coordinator. It is expected that the Electoral Assistance Expert (to be hired by UNDP Bissau) in collaboration with the Senior Electoral Assistance Advisor/Joint EC-UNDP Task Force Coordinator will carry out the following activities:
 - a. Initiate project in Atlas in line with the project document results and resources framework and management structure;
 - b. Prepare all country specific annual work plans carrying out specific missions in each one of the beneficiary countries within September 2010;
 - c. Prepare the first project steering committee;
 - d. Support the UNDP Bissau, the dedicated Project Management Unit and UNDP Brussels to prepare and implement the activities that will be covered by the specific the annual work plan under the present MoU described in the Annex 1.

Article IV. Financial arrangements

1. The estimated total activity budget to be implemented by UNDP Brussels Office amounts to

Euros 1,469,371 for three years, as detailed in Annex 1 of the present Memorandum. For each activity, UNDP Bissau will provide sufficiently in advance the Chart of Accounts (COA) required by UNDP Brussels to make the payments, following regular inter-office procedures. The responsibility of certifying the proper delivery of goods and services prior to payment will remain with the UNDP Brussels Office. All bank charges and other transaction costs will be covered by project funds.

- 2. If, for unforeseen reasons, the cost of certain activities was expected to significantly exceed the estimated original activity budget, UNDP Brussels Office will inform in advance UNDP Bissau in order to reach a common agreement on the adjustments to be made.
- 3. Regarding management fees, UNDP Bissau will pay to UNDP Brussels a GMS fee amounting to 0,67 % of total expenditure incurred by UNDP Brussels. GMS will be paid at the beginning of every year, based on expenditure incurred during the previous year, in accordance with the financial report submitted to UNDP Bissau.

Article V: Reporting and Evaluation

- 1. The administrative, monitoring and reporting requirements of the project are articulated in the UNDP project document and the closed trust fund agreement.
- 2. Notwithstanding these requirements, the Joint EC-UNDP Task Force/UNDP Brussels Office will provide substantive/technical and narrative reports, financial reports of the activities described in Annex 1; as well as provide assistance to the monitoring and reporting of results against outcome indicators as may be articulated in the project document.
- 3. The contributions to the project shall be subject exclusively to the internal and external auditing procedures provided for in the financial regulations, rules and directives of UNDP.

Article VI: Amendment of the MOU

Consultations with a view to amending this MOU may be held at the request of at least one the
Parties. The proposed amendment will be discussed between the Parties and a decision taken by
consensus. Decisions on amendments will come into effect upon signing by all Parties. Amendments
will be binding upon all Parties to this MOU. The amendments will form an integral part of the MOU
as addenda to it.

Article VII: Termination

1. This MOU expires with the end of the project or by request of one the parties.

Article VIII: Entry into Force

1. This MOU enters into force upon signature of all Parties.

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ANNEX 1

DESCRIPTION OF THE ACTIVITIES TO BE CARRIED OUT BY THE JOINT EC-UNDP TASK FORCE ON ELECTORAL ASSISTANCE/UNDP BRUSSELS OFFICE

BACKGROUND

The PALOP countries and Timor Leste share an historical background, linguistic and cultural familiarities. Nevertheless, we can hardly say that the PALOP-TL constitute a geographical homogenous block. Besides the geographical discontinuity, while some of these countries are among the least developing countries, others are within middle income countries; some are among the biggest countries in the African continent while others are among the smallest in the world. In fact, they are quite dissimilar in population size, geographical dimension and location, GDP and HDI.

Regardless of this fact, as a "regional" space, the PALOP and Timor Leste have huge potential and represent a total area of 2,104,451sq km, with a total population of 37,776,300 growing at an average rate of 1.93%. More than 62% of PALOP and Timor Leste inhabitants having more than 15 years old are

capable of read and write and average real GDP growth is 6.52%, while average GDP per capita is US\$ 2,967. HDI average of the PALOP and Timor Leste is 0.505.

The ACP Portuguese Speaking Countries (PALOP and Timor Leste) although dissimilar among themselves on geographical and demographical terms, share a strong identity based on history, culture and also on a common institutional heritage. As a consequence and notwithstanding the fact that independence of all the PALOP dates now of more than 30 years, similar characteristics and patterns of performance can be found among them. The common factors regard at least the following relevant aspects of political and societal nature: structure and organizational culture of central public Administration, legal system and Justice Administration, careers and qualifications of Civil Servants, management practices of public finances.

Portuguese-speaking African countries (PALOP) and Timor-Leste signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the EC on the continuation of their long-standing cooperation. Timor-Leste will be part of this cooperation for the first time. The focus of future activities will be on democratic governance as a key determinant for poverty reduction, including, in particular, political governance, government effectiveness, economic governance and social governance. These activities are being integrated into a multi-country approach, the "Governance Initiative", which will make it possible to identify common solutions to common problems, to exchange know-how and experience and to disseminate best practices. The "Governance Initiative" funds a set of projects throughout contributions of each PALOP and Timor Leste National Indicative Programmes within the 10th EDF (33.1 million Euros, around 4% of each PALOP and Timor Leste PIN).

It was against this background, and rich with the experience of the specific missions carried out in the last two years in Mozambique, Angola, Guinea Bissau and Cape Verde, that the EC-UNDP Task Force was requested to support both UNDP and the EC to formulate the project to support the 2010-2012 electoral cycles in the PALOP and Timor Leste to be financed under the 10th EDF² in the field of electoral assistance and in the broader area of democratic governance.

Between December 2008 and June 2009, five formulation missions were carried out in Guinea Bissau, Cape Verde, Mozambique and Timor Leste by the Joint EC-UNDP Task Force on Electoral Assistance/UNDP Brussels Office. Angolan representatives (National Director for Elections and two MPs – presidents of parliamentarian commissions for HR and Ethics) encounter the EC-UNDP JTF in Brussels to discuss the project activities.

The key stakeholders of the project include a wide variety of governance institutions (e.g. EMBs, Parliaments, Judiciary) and civil society organizations (e.g. domestic observation groups, women's groups, media) directly concerned and involved in the project. The final beneficiaries of the project include all citizens of the PALOP/TL who benefit from enhanced democratic governance and accountability, and from opportunities of civic engagement in the electoral process.

Institutional capacities of the stakeholders are dissimilar among the different PALOP and Timor Leste, but also and more important, they may vary considerably within each one of these countries: cleavages can be found between rural and urban contexts. Gender unbalance trends can also be registered at different degrees in all of these countries, namely in terms of institutional capacity: human resources are almost exclusively centred in the capitals and main urban centres with low representation of women at all levels.

The ability to manage funds and procure goods and services (almost every procurement activities are carried out at a central level), accounting systems (week accounting systems specially at local level), accountability and corporate governance (board and other institutional governing structures of public institutions in general don't reflect gender balance and are not in line with international standards in terms of accountability towards stakeholders) are some of the sectors where more weaknesses can be found.

Rather than being an obstacle or risk to the project implementation, this background presents an opportunity to the project's strategy based essentially in exchange of experiences among PALOP and Timor Leste as the main asset to achieve the expected results.

STRATEGY

PALOP/TL, the EC and the UNDP share the view that free elections, held according to internationally agreed standards, are a necessary but not sufficient condition for democracy to operate. More than the act of periodically casting a vote, democracy relates to the entire process of participation and representation of citizens in the decision-making process. The participation of non-state actors and civil society (including the representation of women and minorities), the capacity of parliaments to exercise effectively their powers, the access to and freedom of the media, are all vital elements for the functioning of democracy and that must be seen in connection to the electoral process.

The project will be a stand-alone initiative with a dedicated funding source and the support of the Joint EC UNDP Task Force on Electoral Assistance/UNDP Brussels Office to help implement its activities. However, the project will work in close collaboration, both substantively and practically, with other initiatives in UNDP's democratic governance portfolio and with other programmes being implemented in these countries. The project implementation will benefit in great extent with ongoing complementary democratization and electoral assistance projects mainly financed by the EC and managed UNDP C0s in the PALOP-TL. Whenever and wherever necessary, it will be aligned with the electoral support provided by the wider UN family, including the UN Departments of Political Affairs (DPA) and Peacekeeping (DPKO) which have election-related mandates.

The project in support of the 2010-2012 electoral cycles in the PALOP and Timor Leste takes as departure baseline the assumption that these countries' electoral institutions and frameworks share problems and constraints among them that are essentially related with similarities among their institutional and legal electoral frameworks. These shortcomings could be better addressed through a common approach that would be able to maximize and promote synergies between the beneficiaries.

This approach implies that the project should address common needs of the beneficiary countries through the electoral cycle approach, considering the specificities of each one of them regarding political context, legal and institutional framework, as well as their specific needs within the different project's entry points.

To enhance and develop the electoral cycle approach in the fields of electoral assistance and management, the Joint EC-UNDP Task Force and IDEA have been organizing and facilitating training workshops on effective electoral assistance for EMB staff, International Organizations' officials and desk officers, EC and UNDP staff and desk officers both at Headquarters and country levels. Six face-to-face training workshops were already organized since 2005 in Europe and Africa allowing exchange and comparative experiences between UNDP, EC field staff, Electoral Management Bodies (EMBs) and practitioners on policy and strategy framework that governs both EU and UN involvement in elections and get them familiar with the electoral cycle approach in order to build capacity for formulation and implementation of future electoral assistance projects. The 7th workshop was organized in Accra, Ghana, in June 2009 and future workshops will articulate closely with the project activities and direct beneficiaries.

The longstanding collaboration between Portuguese, Brazilian, PALOP and Timor Leste EMBs; their sustainable and systematic presence in the EC-UNDP-IDEA effective electoral trainings to exchange experiences and facilitate training sessions/present case studies represent a window of opportunities for the PALOP and Timor Leste and, of course, a clear example of complementarity. Partially, as result of these relationships and exchanges of experiences between the Portuguese, the Brazilian and ACP Portuguese Speaking Countries, the project's beneficiaries will benefit from a very solid body of electoral knowledge and experiences throughout the access of relevant PALOP and Timor Leste practitioners and EMB officials to the Brazilian National Electoral Administration School as well as the continuing traditional capacity development activities provided by Portuguese EMBs.

The project implementation will benefit in great extent with ongoing complementary democratization and electoral assistance projects mainly financed by the EC and managed UNDP COs in the PALOP-TL. The focus of future activities will be on democratic governance as a key determinant for poverty reduction, including, in particular, political governance, government effectiveness, economic governance and social governance. These activities are being integrated into a multi-country approach, which will make it possible to identify common solutions to common problems, to exchange know-how and experience and to disseminate best practices.

This complex and innovative strategy poses challenges to the project implementation and sustainability, more specifically regarding results based management and a cost efficient activities' implementation. Considering the project's implementation modality, these challenges are essentially posed to project assurance and support (UNDP Country Offices in Guinea Bissau and in other PALOP and Timor Leste) and project's country oversight structures (country coordination committees) that should be able to monitor project implementation and respond effectively to emerging issues and eventual shortcomings.

Project assurance³ should ensure all essential activities to project's implementation in the six beneficiary countries (compliance with UNDP rules and procedures, project set-up and general implementation) and Project support⁴ should contribute to the implementation of activities and facilitate as much as possible the country coordination committees in the six countries.

Coordination among these actors should therefore be at all moments promoted and carefully designed annual work plans (to be developed within the start-up project's phase) should reflect the project's approach and respond to the above mentioned challenges. The role of the Joint EC-UNDP Task Force/UNDP Brussels Office is expected to be crucial in supporting project management to ensure liaison among these actors, harmonise annual work plans and activities to be implemented, provide guidance in terms of EC-UNDP procedures and guidelines, reporting and visibility matters.

The activities described here are limited to the support to be provided by the Joint EC-UNDP Task Force/UNDP Brussels Office under component two of the Project Document.

DESCRIPTION OF THE ACTIVITIES

The project aims to address the electoral processes as ongoing and cyclical activities rather than being event driven at designated points in time, and will seek entry points for activities in the different phases of the electoral cycle and within the wider democratic governance perspective. The production of tools, materials and operating procedures will also remain even when individuals change. The sustainability and ownership of the proposed actions is addressed by making the participatory approach ranging from identification to the evaluation phase and ensuring that Project activities are coherent with the existing strategic frameworks and that all activities have a long-term institutional capacity focus.

For structural and analytical purposes, the activities could be grouped in two essential categories: one group of activities transversal to all beneficiary countries, addressing common needs; another group of activities coming in response to the specificities of each PALOP and Timor Leste. The first set of activities is built on the synergies to be developed through the exchange of experiences, the translation and delivery of existing electoral knowledge in Portuguese and adapted to the PALOP and Timor Leste contexts. The implementation of these activities will be directly supported by the Joint EC-UNDP Task Force through UNDP Brussels Office, in close coordination with UNDP Country Office in Guinea Bissau and the PMU, which shall recruit temporary short term consultants in line with the Project Document.

The second set of activities comes in response to the specific needs identified and to be identified in the PALOP and Timor Leste in an effort to provide demand driven support to these countries, aligned with their own electoral events through the electoral cycle soft support approach. These activities will be implemented with the support in expertise and advice of the Joint EC-UNDP Task Force/UNDP Brussels Office, in close coordination with UNDP CO in Guinea Bissau and PMU.

The expertise and advice provided by the Joint EC-UNDP Task Force/UNDP Brussels Office to UNDP Country Offices in the PALOP and Timor Leste, as well as to the beneficiary EMBs and project's stakeholders is done through the Senior Electoral Assistance Advisor (SEAA) in UNDP Brussels Office with the support of the Electoral Assistance Specialist (EAS) of the Joint EC-UNDP Task Force/UNDP Brussels Office. Temporary short term consultants may be recruited to carry out specific tasks in line with the project results and resources framework, budget and Annual Work Plan.

Project Component 2: Consolidate *lusophone* EMBs within the ACE Electoral Knowledge Network and disseminate tools and methodologies on electoral management and parliamentary development, in Portuguese

Aiming at the consolidation of lusophone EMBs within the ACE Electoral Knowledge Network and to disseminate tools and methodologies on electoral management, in Portuguese, adapted to the needs and specificities of PALOP and Timor Leste (Project specific objective 2), it is expected that:

- > "Tools and methodologies on electoral management are translated in Portuguese and adapted to the needs and specificities of PALOP and Timor Leste" (Project expected Result 3); and that
- > 'Technical and financial support contributes to the consolidation of the lusophone electoral management bodies in association with the ACE Electoral Knowledge Network" (Project expected Result 4).

To consolidate the enhancement of experiences and knowledge sharing among PALOP and Timor Leste (electoral management tools and methodologies) within the PALOP and Timor Leste (Result 3), the proposed activities are:

- Translation and delivery of the BRIDGE training module in electoral administration in Portuguese Language; and
- Production of face-to-face and e-learning Training Modules on Electoral Administration in Portuguese Language, and translation to Portuguese of existing literature on electoral assistance and electoral administration.

Aiming the consolidation of the lusophone electoral management bodies in association with the ACE Electoral Knowledge Network (Result 4), in an effort to ensure sustainability for the project expected results, the activities proposed are:

Translation of the ACE Encyclopaedia in Portuguese (www.aceproject.org).

Through these activities and expected results, the project aims to consolidate mainly PALOP and Timor Leste EMBs within the global network for electoral knowledge, provide and contribute to increase access to electoral knowledge and tools to PALOP and Timor Leste officials, experts and practitioners in general (Component 2). Also, through these set of activities, the project tries to reinforce its own sustainability by supporting the establishment of a roster of experts and an electoral unit within the framework of the Forum of the Portuguese Speaking EMBs.

MANAGEMENT ARANGEMENTS

The overall frame for the management arrangements is set in the PRODOC. The PALOP countries and Timor Leste share an historical background, linguistic and cultural familiarities. Nevertheless, we can hardly say that the PALOP-TL constitute a geographical homogenous block. Besides the geographical discontinuity, while some of these countries are among the least developing countries, others are within middle income countries; some are among the biggest countries in the African continent while others are among the smallest in the world. In fact, they are quite dissimilar in population size, geographical dimension and location, GDP and HDI.

Regardless of this fact, as a "regional" space, the PALOP and Timor Leste have huge potential and represent a total area of 2,104,451sq km, with a total population of 37,776,300 growing at an average rate of 1.93%. More than 62% of PALOP and Timor Leste inhabitants having more than 15 years old are capable of read and write and average real GDP growth is 6.52%, while average GDP per capita is US\$ 2,967. HDI average of the PALOP and Timor Leste is 0.505.

The ACP Portuguese Speaking Countries (PALOP and Timor Leste) although dissimilar among themselves on geographical and demographical terms, share a strong identity based on history, culture and also on a common institutional heritage. As a consequence and notwithstanding the fact that independence of all the PALOP dates now of more than 30 years, similar characteristics and patterns of performance can be found among them. The common factors regard at least the following relevant aspects of political and societal nature: structure and organizational culture of central public Administration, legal system and Justice Administration, careers and qualifications of Civil Servants, management practices of public finances.

Portuguese-speaking African countries (PALOP) and Timor-Leste signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the EC on the continuation of their long-standing cooperation. Timor-Leste will be part of this cooperation for the first time. The focus of future activities will be on democratic governance as a key determinant for poverty reduction, including, in particular, political governance, government effectiveness, economic governance and social governance. These activities are being integrated into a multi-country approach, the "Governance Initiative", which will make it possible to identify common solutions to common problems, to exchange know-how and experience and to disseminate best practices. The "Governance Initiative" funds a set of projects throughout contributions of each PALOP and Timor Leste National Indicative Programmes within the 10th EDF (33.1 million Euros, around 4% of each PALOP and Timor Leste PIN).

It was against this background, and rich with the experience of the specific missions carried out in the last two years in Mozambique, Angola, Guinea Bissau and Cape Verde, that the EC-UNDP Task Force was requested to support both UNDP and the EC to formulate the project to support the 2010-2012 electoral cycles in the PALOP and Timor Leste to be financed under the 10th EDF⁷ in the field of electoral assistance and in the broader area of democratic governance.

The key stakeholders of the project include a wide variety of governance institutions (e.g. Electoral Management Bodies -EMBs, Parliaments, Judiciary) and civil society organizations (e.g. domestic observation groups, women's groups, media) directly concerned and involved in the project. This complex and innovative strategy poses challenges to the project implementation and sustainability, more specifically regarding results based management and a cost efficient activities' implementation. II. Organizational Context

UNDP's democratic governance practice focuses on fostering inclusive participation, strengthening responsive governing institutions, and promoting democratic principles. Inclusive participation expands equal opportunities for engagement by the poor, women, youth, indigenous people, and other marginalized groups who are excluded from power. Efforts in this area aim to strengthen opportunities for civic engagement in the core channels linking people and the state, at the national, regional and local levels. Work on governing institutions has traditionally emphasized the design and functions of the core pillars of the state, including the legislative, executive and judicial branches, at national, regional and local levels.

Strengthening responsive governing institutions entails promoting the core channels of representation and accountability in the state at the national, regional and local levels. Responsive institutions mean that the state reflects and serves the needs, priorities, and interests of all people, including women, the poor, youth, and minorities. Supporting national partners to strengthen democratic practices grounded in human rights, anti-corruption and gender equality require UNDP leadership in promoting integration, coordination and information-sharing of policies, practices, and strategies strengthening democratic governance within and outside of the UN family.

This proposal was accepted by the PALOP and Timor Leste and EC services during the 6th Meeting between the National Authorizing Officers (NAOs) of the PALOP and Timor Leste and the EC services of 6 May 2008 in Luanda and decision was made to finance the project throughout the "Governance Initiative" to be financed by the National Indicative Programme of PALOP/TL within the 10th EDF. It was agreed that the EC-UNDP Task Force would have carried out the necessary identification and formulation activities leading to the signature of a Contribution Agreement between the EC Delegation and UNDP Country Office in Bissau to be cleared as usual by UNDP Brussels. These activities were properly completed by the JTF allowing decision to finance and launch the project in the last quarter of 2009 to be made by PALOP and Timor Leste' NAOs and EC services.

Funded up to 6.1 million Euros for a three years' budget, the Project in Support of the 2009-2011 Electoral Cycles in the PALOP and Timor Leste has a regional scoop and is financed by the EC as sole donor. The project implementation will be ensured by UNDP Guinea Bissau through direct execution modality (DEX). Building on past and ongoing support in the electoral domain to the PALOP and Timor Leste, the strategy follows a project based approach, compatible with the nature of a multi country initiative. The project is a good example of coordination and harmonisation and is in line with the principles of the Paris and Accra Declarations on Aid Effectiveness in the sense that a) it is clearly demand-driven and is being designed as a result of extensive consultation among the relevant actors, b) it involves a strong coordination among its stakeholders and resources for the implementation of the project will be applied to finance regional harmonized activities, in line with the project's multi country strategy, c) aims to support the capacity building of national institutions and to provide support based on partner countries' national strategies, institutions and procedures; d) should complement and strengthen existing efforts in the different sectors and avoid duplication of efforts and rationalise activities.

The project will target the promotion of a deeper consolidation of the democratic culture and institutions by providing an electoral assistance as an ongoing and cyclical activity rather than being event driven at designated points in time. The activities to be implemented would focus the support on:

- The Strategic and operational plans
- The Cost assessment and budgeting exercises
- The Civil registry/voter registration issues
- The Procurement Plans
- The Long Term Civic and Voter Education
- The Support to Elected Parliamentarians and Parliaments
- The Support to Media
- The Support for the improvement of transmission and verification of results
- The Support for electoral dispute resolutions;
- The Support to the recently established Forum of the Lusophone EMBs

The project's outputs and outcomes should be pursuit through a coordinated and coherent approach, putting in place activities that will respond as much as possible to shared needs and shortcomings but, simultaneously, resulting from the six beneficiary countries' specificities regarding legal context and institutional framework, human and technical resources. This complex and innovative strategy poses challenges to the project implementation and sustainability, more specifically regarding results based management and a cost efficient activities' implementation. Considering the project's implementation modality, these challenges are essentially posed to project assurance and support (UNDP Country Offices in Guinea Bissau and in other PALOP and Timor Leste) and project's country oversight structures (country coordination committees) that should be able to monitor project implementation and respond effectively to emerging issues and eventual shortcomings.

Project assurance¹⁰ should ensure all essential activities to project's implementation in the six beneficiary countries (compliance with UNDP rules and procedures, project set-up and general implementation) and Project support¹¹ should contribute to the implementation of activities and facilitate as much as possible the country coordination committees in the six countries. Coordination among these actors should therefore be at all moments promoted and carefully designed annual work plans (to be developed within the start-up project's phase) should reflect the project's approach and respond to the above mentioned challenges. The role of the Joint EC UNDP Task Force is expected to be crucial in supporting project management to ensure liaison among these actors, harmonise annual work plans and activities to be implemented, provide guidance in terms of EC-UNDP procedures and guidelines, reporting and visibility matters.

Under the overall guidance of the Deputy Director of the UN UNDP Brussels Office and the Resident Representative of UNDP in Guinea Bissau, and the supervision of the Senior Electoral Assistance Advisor, SEAA, also and Coordinator of the JTF, the Electoral Assistance Specialist will support the UNDP CO in Guinea Bissau and the Task Force, to further strengthen and facilitate cooperation between the project's stakeholders. The incumbent will provide to UNDP CO in Guinea Bissau and the Joint Task Force project supporting activities focusing on the long term support to the capacity development of Electoral Management Bodies (EMB) and to the needs of the Civil Society. S/He will be based in Brussels for purposes of coordination and support to the PALOP and Timor Leste (a community of six countries geographically discontinue and with its members scattered through different African regions and the Pacific) and provide 60% of working time to UNDP Guinea Bissau CO – while 40% will be dedicated to support the JTF global electoral activities. This arrangement will facilitate and enhance the project support to all stakeholders and, simultaneously, respond to eventual coordination and technical support challenges faced by the Guinea Bissau CO.

The incumbent will also support UNDP and the EC in the field of training and dissemation of knowledge activities focusing in the African Region and especially in the Portuguese and French Speaking countries. These activities will mainly consist in providing assistance to the JTF coordinator to promote knowledge sharing and expert advice to UNDP country offices, EC delegations and electoral management bodies (EMBs) in post-conflict countries and transitional democracies with particular reference to the African region, where most projects/programmes have hitherto been implemented by the JTF. S/He will support the SEEA to advise senior management on managerial, political and operational issues relating to electoral assistance projects which have always high political impact. As the success or failure of operations in any electoral assistance project and EC – UNDP the partnership could affect the relationship between the EC, the EU member states and UNDP, it is crucial to ensure that mutual expectations are met and a good understanding for the future of this partnership well set out.

III. Functions / Key Results Expected

- Ensure support UNDP Guinea Bissau to provide timely an adequate report to the EC and to prepare all documents needed to ensure disbursement (Riders, Prodoc revisions, etc)

IV. Impact of Results

The overarching purpose of this post is to provide a specific support to UNDP Guinea Bissau and to the Joint EC UNDP Task Force to further strengthen and facilitate the already established cooperation between the EC and UNDP in the electoral assistance field and to implement with success the project in support of the 2009-2011 electoral cycles in the PALOP and Timor Leste - a project totally funded by EC and implemented directly by

The post will contribute the UNDP Guinea Bissau and UN/UNDP Brussels offices to promote knowledge sharing and expert advice to UNDP Country Offices, EC Delegations and Electoral Management Bodies in post conflict countries and transitional democracies, in particular to the ACP Portuguese Speaking Countries. The Electoral Assistance Specialist's tasks will entail support to UNDP Guinea Bissau and to the JTF to formulation, implementation issues, evaluations and lessons learned exercises, elements which are urgently needed within operations of unprecedented magnitude and complexities.

The lessons learned here will then feed into implementation of electoral assistance projects in other countries or regions and also to the planned joint EC-UNDP training exercise on Effective Electoral Assistance and to the ACE Electoral Practitioners' Network.
