The Arab States region continues to experience conflict, protracted crises and heightened polarization; bringing about development rollbacks, suffering, massive internal displacement and migration and destruction of infrastructure. The social infrastructure has also been hit hard. Currently, the region is home to 13.9 million refugees -including the Palestinian refugees- representing 55% of world refugees, most of whom are hosted in the region, and to 15.1 million internally displaced persons (IDPs) making up 38.5% of the world IDPs. The thinning of the region's once-diverse social fabric and strong social capital has affected the resilience of the people and of societies and their capacity to reverse the negative trends at the individual, collective and institutional levels.

The Arab region is a complex and diverse world, within which exists a cultural diversity that manifests in multiple dimensions: ethnic, tribal, religious, and linguistic, resulting from history, tradition, and immigration. The Diversity Advancement in the Arab Region (DAAR) regional project will shed light on the diversity spread across the Arab countries in general, and on the management of this diversity. It aims to restore diversity at the social, political and economic levels by investing in (1) supporting policy-oriented research, (2) designing tools and methodologies, (3) opening up knowledge exchange space and networking and (4) advising on legislation and policies that are conducive to advancing the governance of diversity.
