The following provisions of the

THIRD-PARTY COST-SHARING AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE DEUTSCHE GESELLSCHAFT FÜR INTERNATIONALE ZUSAMMENARBEIT (GIZ) GMBH AND THE UNITED NATIONS DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME (UNDP)

are to be amended and shall be worded as follows:

Article I. The Contribution

1. (a) The GIZ shall, in accordance with the schedule of payments set out below, contribute to UNDP the amount of € 600.000,00 (six-hundred thousand EUROS). The contribution shall be deposited in the

This is equivalent to an increase not exceeding EUR 400.000,00 by comparison with the original Agreement.

7. The grant is made available for the period of 1st May 2017 to 30th June 2019. Only expenditures effected during this period and relating to activities carried out during this period may be financed from this grant. Otherwise written approval of the GIZ is required.

Article II. Utilization of the Contribution

1. The outputs of the Project include enhanced support to effective development co-operation at country level; unlocking the potential of effectiveness and updated monitoring for 2030; sharing knowledge to scale-up innovative development solutions; and Strengthened high-level political engagement, advocacy, public communication and strategic use of data and evidence. Major changes of these outputs as well as of the project document shall be decided in consultation with GIZ. In case of disagreement on the side of GIZ, the latter shall be free to exercise its rights under Art. IX.

Article III. Administration and reporting

- 3.2. For Agreements of more than one year:
 - (a) From the country office (or relevant unit at headquarters in the case of regional and global projects) an annual status report of project/ programme progress for the duration of the Agreement, as well as the latest available approved budget.
 - (b) From UNDP Bureau of Management/Office of Finance and Administration, an annual certified financial statement as of 31 December every year to be submitted no later than 30 June of the following year.
 - (c) From the country office (or relevant unit at headquarters in the case of regional and global projects) within six months after the date of completion or termination of the

Agreement, a final report summarizing project/ programme activities and impact of activities as well as provisional financial data.

- (d) From UNDP Bureau of Management/Office of Finance and Administration, on completion of the project, a certified financial statement to be submitted no later than 30 June of the year following the financial closing of the project.

The Proposal for Additional Funding, covering the project period from 1st November 2017 until 30th June 2019, which is attached hereto (Annex 1), complements the Project Documents of the original Agreement.

All other provisions of the above mentioned Agreement shall remain valid without modification.

We would be grateful if you would confirm that you agree to the proposed Agreement by signing the attached duplicate of this letter in a legally binding form and returning the duplicate to the GIZ.







Proposal for Additional Funding: UNDP Support to the Global Partnership for Effective Development Co-operation

Duration: 1 November 2017 – 30 June 2019

Amount: 400,000 EUR



This proposal is to seek additional contribution in an amount of EUR 400,000 for UNDP to undertake activities envisaged to implement the Global Partnership's work programme.

Proposed Areas of Work:

The following main areas of work are proposed to be funded by GIZ during the November 2017 to June 2019 timeframe:

Strategic Output 1: Enhanced support to effective development co-operation at country level;

Strategic Output 2: Unlocking the potential of effectiveness and updated monitoring for 2030

Strategic Output 3: Sharing knowledge to scale-up innovative development solutions; and

Strategic Output 6: Strengthened high-level political engagement, advocacy, public communication and strategic use of data and evidence.

Enhanced Support to Effectiveness of Development Co-operation at Country Level

Under Strategic Output 1, the Global Partnership has committed to providing support to countries that are establishing and piloting mechanisms to make the best use of various forms of development co-operation, including establishing and strengthening country-level multi-stakeholder partnership platforms to enhance learning and mutual accountability. Following, the Global Partnership will also establish a compendium of good practices related to the policies and institutional arrangements surrounding use of development co-operation. Finally, the Global Partnership will help to mobilise Global Partnership Initiatives (GPIs) to strengthen their focus on greater country level focus. Specific Work Programme activities to be supported by UNDP with the GIZ contribution will include:

- Support establishment of pilot-approach spearheaded by the working group on country implementation and facilitation of country-level pilot implementation.
 - Compilation and synthesis of evidence, lessons learned and good practice drawing on pilot countries. This can be used to inform Global Partnership's related events and dialogue at global, regional and country level.
- Preparation of the compendium of national multi-stakeholder platforms.

The above deliverables will provide inputs to generation of Global Partnership's knowledge products, inform the work relating to strengthening the country-focused approach of Global Partnership's monitoring framework, and will be undertaken in close conjunction with the work relating to private sector engagement in development cooperation.

The principal beneficiaries of this work are the national policy makers and practitioners, as well as Global Partnership stakeholders at large. Given the complex development finance landscape at country level, characterised by an increase in the variety of resources, knowledge, and assets available from a larger variety of development partners, this work is essential in ensuring that national governments are able to effectively mobilise and allocate resources for achievement of development goals and strengthen national accountability mechanisms for development co-operation and finance.

Unlocking the potential of effectiveness and updated monitoring for 2030

Under Strategic Output 2, the Global Partnership is aiming to increase the relevance of its monitoring evidence by facilitating dialogue on how to take forward the results of past monitoring exercises. Additionally, the Global Partnership will refine the existing monitoring framework, provide support for a third monitoring round, produce a progress report, including country profiles, and ensure the results of this work inform the follow up and review of the Sustainable Development Goals and Financing for Development commitments. Specific Work Programme activities to be undertaken supported by UNDP during the GIZ grant timeframe are:

- Develop a proposal for a refined monitoring framework, in particular strengthening measurement approaches on Indicators relating to mutual accountability, transparency at country level, strengths and use of country results framework.
- Support launching of the Global Partnership monitoring in 2018, including supporting regional workshops and providing guidance to ground the GP monitoring exercise into existing national SDGs accountability and monitoring mechanisms.
- Support country-level implementation of the Global Partnership monitoring, including through provide on-demand support at country and regional level and coordination of the monitoring helpdesk.
- Preparation of country monitoring profiles and jointly prepare with OECD the third Monitoring Report.

The principal beneficiaries of this work are the country-level stakeholders who will have increased access to data and evidence related to implementation of effective development co-operation commitments at country level and guidance on how to take forward these results to accelerate progress towards national, regional and global development goals.

Sharing Knowledge to Scale up Innovative Development Solutions

Under Strategic Output 3, the Global Partnership is aiming to become a go-to platform for knowledge exchange and learning by drawing together lessons from its stakeholders, as well as lessons generated from across other strategic deliverables (i.e. country-level support, monitoring process, specialised

dialogues among North-South and South-South co-operation and on public-private partnerships) and establishing a virtual knowledge-sharing platform. Specific Work Programme activities to be undertaken supported by UNDP during the GIZ grant timeframe are:

- Facilitate knowledge management across Global Partnership's stakeholders including Global Partnership Initiatives (GPIs).
- Establish knowledge platform based on Global Partnership stakeholders' technical needs and requirements, including conceptualisation of the knowledge and information architecture. On-going needs assessment will inform the scale and scope of the knowledge platform.

The principal beneficiaries of this work are the broad range of development stakeholders who will have increased access to the data and evidence generated at country level, as well as information on lessons learned and examples of development solutions that can be used to enhance their own development work.

Strengthening High-Level Political Engagement, Advocacy, Public Communication and Strategic use of Data and Evidence

Under Output 6, the Global Partnership is aiming to encourage behaviour change that will make development co-operation more effective by engaging and gaining buy-in at the political level. A significant portion of the JST's envisaged work under this output relates to strategically intensifying the Global Partnership's public communications work, sharing policy products in a targeted way and generating increased visibility for work across all other strategic outputs. Specific Work Programme activities to be undertaken supported by UNDP during the GIZ grant timeframe are:

- Support travel facilitation of participants from developing countries to one Steering Committee in 2018.
- Maintain online presence of the Global Partnership and support social media and knowledge campaign around key Global Partnership related events and products.

Communications activities will benefit the work of the Global Partnership happening across strategic outputs by showcasing its positive impact, engaging new stakeholders, and increasing high-level buy in.

Funding Requirements:

The 2017-2018 Global Partnership Programme of Work includes specific JST resource requirements for the biennial. All six strategic outputs are interrelated and reinforcing. It is expected that each strategic output will be funded from multiple sources and in this vein, the contribution from GIZ will complement support envisaged from other partners.
