Brief Description

The COVID-19 Rapid Response Engagement Facility will enable UNDP to rapidly procure goods and services and facilitate contributions towards the COVID-19 Rapid Response across UNDP's three Offers.

Working at the heart of the United Nations family and in close coordination with the World Health Organization (WHO), the UN Development Programme (UNDP) is responding to a growing volume of requests from countries to help them prepare for, respond to and recover from the COVID-19 pandemic, focusing particularly on the most vulnerable.

Our response is framed around three objectives: Helping countries to prepare for and protect people from the pandemic and its impacts, to respond during the outbreak, and to recover from the economic and social impacts in the months to come. For most countries, these phases will happen simultaneously and are interlinked. How a country prepares for and responds to the pandemic, for example, will directly impact the type of recovery that will be necessary.

The Engagement Facility is a living document intended to create flexibility and agility in response to the evolving situation and designed to be adjusted on an on-going basis. The Advisory Committee meets daily to make decisions on funding allocations.

Engagement Facility Outputs are aligned with the structure of the <u>UNDP Programme Framework and Structure to respond to COVID-19</u>.


