

## QPR/QOR (April-June 2013) Description (QOR):

During this quarter, ARECA is analyzing the emission of its third Partial Credit Guarantee for San Alejo Hydropower (2.1 MW) located in Honduras and with a long term loan approved by Banco Lafise of Honduras. If approved by CABEI's credit committee, this partial credit guarantee will amount a total of US\$ 1.0 Million. Proper on field follow-up was given to Quilio (1.3 MW) and Zingüizapa Hydropower (2.98 MW) in Honduras as they have been benefited by ARECA's PRG.

Other projects that are expected to be benefited with ARECA's PRG during this year are:

- El Molo hydropower (3.9 MW) in Honduras
- Isla /Monteverde II hydropower (3.6 MW) in Costa Rica
- Peña Flor hydropower (0.5 MW) in Guatemala
- ASA hydropower (1.1 MW) in Nicaragua

Training sessions to renewable energy stakeholders remain a constant for ARECA's PCU. During this reporting period four (4) training workshops were implemented:

In order to provide excellent assistance to ARECA's costumers, the technical specialist in ARECA received a training course in Biogas. This course was taught by Renewables Academy (RENAC) from Germany and took place at the Zamorano Agricultural University in Honduras during 5 days. More training activities will continue in the following months to all personnel in ARECA's project coordination unit in order to serve better to all our customers and renewable energy stakeholders in general.



Regarding the Technical Assistance Fund, one (1) project was presented during the reporting period. This request came from Castillo Torres (CASTOR), project sponsor of El Molo Hydropower (3.9 MW) in Honduras and the amount requested was US\$ 80,000. During the analysis of their request, the Technical Assistance Committee identified flaws in terms of social documentations to back-up all social and environmental commitments agreed with the Municipality and local stake holders. To date, the project sponsor hasn't provided all documentation requested by the Committee and there's no final answer regarding the granting of this technical assistance. ARECA's PCU is expecting to present to the Technical Assistance Committee, no less than 5 projects during the second semester 2013, such as PH La Puerta I and PH Santiago in Honduras, PH La Isla/Monteverde and PH Llano bonito in Costa Rica and PH ASA in Nicaragua. It's important to mention that PH Llano bonito (0.5 MW) was granted a technical assistance by CABEI's Mipymes Verdes so there's a good opportunity to joint efforts with this program within CABEI to help the project sponsor reaching technical and financial closure.

ARECA's pipeline is strong and as the sector continues to improve in the region (due to more market openness, long term contracts from distributors, cost of oil and its by-products, and environmental concerns due to climate change) more projects are being added in order to evaluate them as possible candidates for the PRG as well as the Technical Assistance Fund. ARECA's pipeline (renewable energy projects < 10 MW) reach 30 projects within the region with a total power of more than 50 MW and a total investment of US\$ 132 Million.

With the good performance shown by ARECA and CABEI well known banking principles, it's significant to highlight the interest shown by the Swedish International Development Agency (SIDA) to support either the PRG program or the Financial Assistance Fund (currently under design and approved by the Project Steering Committee in its latest meeting in November 2012 in Tegucigalpa). For that reason, ARECA has been giving feedback to the External Funding Department at CABEI since they're leading the negotiations with this organization.

In terms of visibility, ARECA continues to improve and during this quarter there were 5,737 visits to our project website which represent a 35% increase with respect of the same period of 2012. Likewise, there were 36,103 hits within the website that represented a 51% increment.
