

Annual Work Plan 2014 Inclusion of Roma

Country: Republic of Croatia

Expected CP Outcome:

Social inclusion of Roma in Croatian Counties with the highest proportion of Roma in their total population is enhanced through creation of sustainable partnerships and practices promoting equal access and participation of Roma and other disadvantaged groups in local social and economic development.

Expected CP Outputs:

Output 1

Coordination and partnerships between key national stakeholders working on Roma inclusion issue enhanced.

Output 2

The capacity of local institutions improved to respond timely and adequately to diverse needs of Roma in terms of policy making, service delivery and monitoring.

Output 3

The capacity of Roma civil sector improved to develop grassroots initiatives to medium sized projects with funding committed from national sources or EU funds.

- Output 4

Roma communities have better access to public basic services and are empowered to initiate social activities in their communities.

Narrative

Even though Croatia joined the European Union and has committed itself to the highest standards of human rights protection and social inclusion of vulnerable groups, Roma in Croatia (30 000 people - estimates of Council of Europe) still face many of the same problems as Roma in the rest of South-Eastern Europe in terms of securing basic rights, including access to education, employment, social services, health and housing. In Croatia in 2013 (UNDP survey): 92.31 % of Roma still live in relative poverty compared to 42 % of their neighbors and 30% of Croatian average; 26 % of Roma are completing elementary school and only 10% of them complete secondary school; 65% of Roma labor force is unemployed, compared to 24% of non-Roma.

Aiming to support both, national and county level policy making, as well as its implementation, monitoring and evaluation, UNDP Croatia established during Project's first phase partnerships with the Croatian Government Office for Human Rights and Rights of National Minorities (GOHRRNM) as well as with Roma representatives, representatives of public administration on county/local level and civil society organizations.

Based on the results and momentum created in the Međimurje and in Sisak-Moslavina Counties, as well as given the interest from stakeholders to continue support (including from other Counties), UNDP will continue in 2014 with the project "Platform for Roma inclusion in Međimurje and Sisak-Moslavina Counties - phase II" to address processes of longstanding exclusion of Roma in Croatia through a comprehensive and all-inclusive strategy (donor: Open Society Foundations).

Project specific objectives are the following ones:

- 1) To enhance coordination and partnerships between key national stakeholders working on Roma inclusion issue;
- 2) To improve the capacity of local institutions to respond timely and adequately to diverse needs of Roma in terms of policy making, service delivery and monitoring;
- 3) To improve the capacity of Roma civil sector to develop grassroots initiatives to medium sized projects with funding allocated from national sources or EU funds.
- 4) To enable Roma communities access to sustainable and good quality public services and empower them to initiate social activities in their communities.
