As part of the implementation of projects in the communities, the following activities are in progress:

Sarazin: 100% completed.

Initially, the project identified by the community of Sarazin dealt with the extension of the existent potable water network by 4,000 linear meters. Therefore, the project built a new water supply system connected to the existent one. In addition, in order to ensure the project's sustainability, UNDP accepted to respond the beneficiaries' request to assess and repair the main existent water system as well.

# Grand Boucan (part 2): 100% completed.

The construction of the water collection system in Grand Boucan has been successfully completed. The planning hand-over of construction work by the firm and validation by UNDP is in progress. DINEPA should install a water treatment system but due to the restrictions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic the activities are blocked.

## • Mirebalais (Downtown): in progress, around 95% has been completed. Additional work required.

The construction of Rue Merline in Mirebalais is still in progress. Additional work, as mentioned below, was requested by the Mirebalais Town Hall to ensure the sustainability of the project.

The following activities were scheduled for the first quarter of 2020 and the project was committed to finalized them by April 30<sup>th</sup>: Nevertheless, the ongoing global emergency will certainly delay the activities.

Initial activities: 95% completed.

- $\circ$  Repairing of 250 linear meters of gutters;
- Repairing of 250 linear meters of canals;
- Repairing of 250 meters of concrete paving

Additional work required: ongoing.

- Cleaning of 300 ml of the canal at the entrance of Rue Merline;
- $\circ$   $\,$  Drainage of a small ravine of 15 ml near Rue Merline.

Delays or Deviations (*if any, briefly describe the delays or changes in focus, approach or targets, and provide a short justification for the change in <u>1-2 narrative paragraphs</u>).* 

- The socio-political instability in 2019 caused delays in the construction processes. The delay in achieving results will cause communities to wait longer to access the expected services.
- Progress has been made during Q1 2020 and the activity schedule has been adjusted to meet the expected end date of the project.
- Changes in project human resources between November and January, including the departure of the Project Manager, project supervision has been restructured in order to ensure continuity, using existing human resources in the UNDP Country Office.
- The expected end date of the activities was April 30<sup>th</sup>, 2020. Nevertheless, the restrictions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic will have a considerable impact on the completion of the work. The project estimates a delay of at least two additional months.
