With reference to paragraph 4 of the agreement signed on December 8<sup>th</sup>, 2017 between the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) and the Korean International Cooperation Agency (KOICA), UNDP is pleased to submit to you the progress annual report of the project: "Sustainable Solutions for Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) in the locality of Lahaie, Commune of Dame Marie, Grand'Anse Department".

As described in the annual report, since the beginning of the project UNDP has carried out the following activities:

- UNDP provided legal technical support to the Council City of Dame Marie in the process of purchasing the land and for enhancing accountability and transparency (Activity 1.1);
- A solid baseline with socio economic data has been developed based on a survey conducted by an expert (Activity 1.2);
- Based on the socio-economic criteria, a draft list of 109 households has been selected. About 25% of households selected are female single-parent and 11% of other households have at least one pregnant or lactating woman and most live below the threshold of 2 USD per day (Activity 1.2);
- The project has elaborated the layout plan of Lahaie community (Activity 1.3). A study on socio-economic recovery was carried out in parallel with the orientation plan (Activity 3.1);
- The project team has developed a housing model based on the conceptual framework of housing defined by the UNDP and the Haitian government. (Activity 2.1).

On behalf of UNDP, I would like to take this opportunity to thank KOICA again for its full partnership and its support for the relocation of Lahaie's population.

However, this activity takes place in a traditional way that weakens it by the following characteristics: (1) the institutional and legal weakness, (2) the stagnation of socio-economic development, (3) the inadequate marketing of the product and (4) the inefficient management of the fishery.  Based on a participatory approach of the population of Lahaie, the socio-economic diagnosis proposes to:  1) Increase wealth creation by strengthening the fisheries sector in Lahaie;  2) Develop secondary economic activities by creating spaces to facilitate trade's exchanges and ensure complementarity between them.  Although the fishing industry is the main source of income for the population of Lahaie, the fact remains that agriculture, which is placed as the second growth sector, retains a special place in the local economy because it is practiced in complements of fishing

# 2.4 Achievement(s) in Cross-Cutting Issues

The promotion of gender equality and the empowerment of women is intrinsic to UNDP's development approach. In focus groups and the project's community workshops, the women are included and actively involved in activities and they are informed at the same level than the men because a special attention has been paid to ensure that each of the activities of this project contributes to UNDP's development approach<sup>2</sup>. The gender mainstreaming is guaranty through all the stages of the project, by ensuring an equal representation of male and female beneficiaries, taking into account women needs in the development of the project, increasing women's participation, decision-making and leadership in project activities; improving women's access to and control over resources and project benefits; and improving the mechanisms through which women and girls can make their voices heard.

Into the list of beneficiaries, on average 25% of the households selected are single-parent women and an average of 11% of the other households contain at least one pregnant or lactating woman and most of these households live below the threshold of 2 USD / day

### 2.5 Communication and Partnership with KOICA

An agent of connection is part of the project and ensures the sharing of information between UNDP and KOICA. The liaison officer also provides support for communication between the two offices.

On a regular basis, meetings between the office of UNDP and KOICA are organized to share information and discuss on the progress of the project.

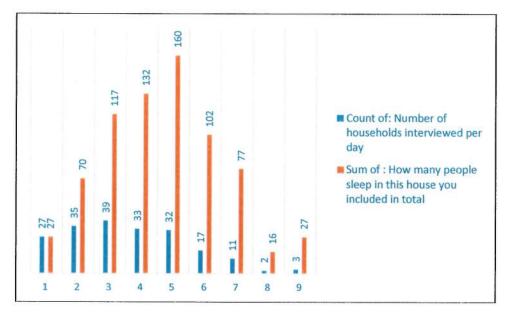
