Project Overview

United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), in partnership with Hindustan Coca-Cola Beverages Pvt Ltd (HCCB), Hindustan Unilever Limited (HUL), HDFC Bank and Coca Cola Foundation India (CCIF) is strengthening existing systems and processes in India to reduce the impact of plastic waste on human life and environment. This partnership aims to promote sustainable plastic waste management practices in India, thus empowering the Safaii Sathis (waste pickers) and moving into a circular economy. It will enhance segregation, collection and recycling of all kinds of plastic along the waste value chain creating resource efficiency and better accessibility to all stakeholders. This is in line with the Government of India's Swachh Bharat (Clean India) Mission, Solid Waste Management Rules, 2016 and Plastic Waste Management (Amendment) Rules, 2018.

Project Implementation Cities –

- (i) **HCCB** There are currently **27 cities** in which the project is implemented Bengaluru, Mumbai, Goa (Bicholim & Cacora), Hyderabad, Chennai, Bhubaneswar, Cuttack, Ghaziabad, Ahmedabad, Vijayawada, Patna, Jaipur, Dehradun, Ujjain, Aurangabad, Tirupati, Trivandrum, Jammu, Jodhpur, Pimpri-Chinchwad, Surat, Ranchi, Vadodara, Varanasi, Delhi and Howrah
- (ii) HUL The project is implemented in 1 city Mumbai (4 wards H-West, R-North,K-East and Suvidha Centre-Malad (Mumbai)
- (iii) **HDFC** The project is being implemented in **6 cities** Panaji, Delhi-NCR, Rishikesh, Dehradun, Haldwani & Uttarkashi (will be initiating the implementation of project in Uttarkashi after onboarding the Service Provider and exploring opportunities with GNIDA for initiating the project in Greater Noida)
- (iv) **CCIF** The project will be operating in **3 cities**: Kolkata, Lucknow and Amritsar.




Figure C: HDFC Tonnage




Figure D: CCIF Tonnage




Figure D: Total Tonnage




Figure E: Safai Sathis Details

Bhunabeshwar -

- As part of agreement between BMC and CORE and to strengthen the Prithvi project, BMC has provided 3 BOVs to CORE to do door to door collection in the assigned wards of BMC. This initiative will scale up the collection and quantum of plastic waste coming to TTS MRF.
- Mr. Lokanath Das and Mr. Anjan Jena has participated in the community level workshop for waste management organized by CFAR as resource person. Representatives from BMC and State Govt. have also participated in the workshop.

2 Trainings

Bhunabeshwar –

- MCC Training Non-biodegradable waste including plastic waste segregation training been given to Safai sathis at micro composting center (MCC). The purpose is to provide to hand holding support to these safai sathi and starting the plastic waste collection from them.
- A training programme was conducted for the BOVs and LCVs driver engaged in door to door collection at TTS MRF. The main aim of the programme was to coordinate and make the drivers understand how to do transportation of dry and wet waste to the TTS MRF & MCC.
- CORE has conducted one training programme for safai sathis at ward no. 46 on segregation of plastic and other dry waste.
- As part of the partnership of CORE with BMC for dry waste collection from wards, source segregation training is being demonstrated to households at ward level. They are encouraged and motivated to segregate wet and dry waste separate at household level.



 To strengthen the door to door collection in Bhubaneswar, CORE has received 15 LCVs from BMC. This will scale up the plastic waste collection from household source. Moreover, female safai sathis will be deployed as driveres for these LCVs

Cuttack -

- CYSD in collaboration with CORE initiated the skill training programme for family members of Safai Sathis. Under the training programme the selected candidates will be trained on hospitality and tele-retailing and in addition spoken Hindi/English, data entry in excel sheets. CORE with the help of UNV of Utthaan Programme identified the eligible candidates for enrolment and had an initial discussion with the trainers.

- 20 Safai Sathis were formed on to two SHGs and engaged in operation of vehicles for collection of segregated waste in different wards of Cuttack city. Under Utthaan project these Safai Sathis were linked and have been formed into SHGs, the UNV is working to link these SHG to bank and open accounts.

COVID Relief Activities & Vaccination

Bubhaneshwar -

- Keeping the sudden spike in number of Covid-19, CORE has distributed 1000 nos. of N-95 masks to safai sathis, MCC workers and citizens in Bhubaneswar.
- 16 nos. of safai sathis were vaccinated for Covid-19 with support from Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation. Moreover, Covid-19 on duty ID cards are issued to safai sathis by BMC for their free movement during the lockdown.
- Mask, gloves and sanitizers were distributed to safai sathis and LCV drivers by CORE in Bhubaneswar through co-financing
- SATO hand washing equipment has been distributed among safai sathis. It requires less water for hand washing and very much user friendly. This is through co-financing.

Cuttack -

- CORE distributed Soap, Mask and SATO hand washing station to 50 Safai Sathis working with us for collection of plastic waste.
- 18 Safai Sathis have been vaccinated who are directly engaged with the PWM cuttack project

Aurangabad -

- Relief activities and awareness activities for community
- CARPE Considering the government regulations 10 safai saathis over 45 years of age were vaccinated under UNDP and CARPE. A vaccination awareness was conducted with the he Safai Saathis prior to their vaccination.

Ranchi -
