Project Overview

United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), in partnership with **Hindustan Coca-Cola Beverages Pvt Ltd (HCCB)**, **Hindustan Unilever Limited (HUL)**, **HDFC Bank and Coca Cola Foundation India (CCIF)** and **Nayara** is strengthening existing systems and processes in India to reduce the impact of plastic waste on human life and environment. This partnership aims to promote sustainable plastic waste management practices in India, thus empowering the Safai Sathis (waste pickers) and moving into a circular economy. It will enhance segregation, collection and recycling of all kinds of plastic along the waste value chain creating resource efficiency and better accessibility to all stakeholders. This is in line with the Government of India's Swachh Bharat (Clean India) Mission, Solid Waste Management Rules, 2016 and Plastic Waste Management (Amendment) Rules, 2018.

Project Implementation Cities –

- (i) **HCCB** – There are currently **25 cities** in which the project is implemented – Bengaluru, Mumbai, Goa (Bicholim), Hyderabad, Chennai, Bhubaneswar, Cuttack, Ahmedabad, Vijayawada, Patna, Surat, Jaipur, Dehradun, Ujjain, Aurangabad, Tirupati, Trivandrum, Jammu, Jodhpur, Pimpri-Chinchwad, Ranchi, Vadodara, Varanasi, Delhi and Howrah
- (ii) **HUL** – The project is implemented in **1 city** – Mumbai (4 wards – H-West, R-North, K-East and Suvidha Centre-Malad (Mumbai)
- (iii) **HDFC** – The project is being implemented in **5 cities** – Panaji, Greater Noida, Rishikesh, Dehradun, Haldwani
- (iv) **CCIF** – The project is operating in **3 cities**: Kolkata, Lucknow, and Amritsar.
- (v) **Nayara Energy** – The project is operating in 2 cities – Khambhaliya Municipality & 15 Villages & Jamnagar




Figure A: HCCB Tonnage




Figure B: HUL Tonnage




Figure C: HDFC Tonnage




Figure D: CCIF Tonnage




Figure E: Safai Sathis Details

1	Waste Mgmt. awareness sessions in RWA, educational institution, commercial spaces	<p>Bhubaneswar –</p> <p>Ministry of Jal Shakti carried out process documentation through videography of our Bhubaneswar TTS MRF as a model center to be featured in their collaterals. It was continued for 2 days. The team captured the all the activities of waste management starting from collection to segregation to processing in their camera. In the two days video shooting, the team of Ministry of Jal Shakti emphasized on machine operation and how different types waste are being processed in the MRF and captured all the relevant activities in the video.</p> <p>A training session on segregation and machine operation was conducted for safai sathis working at the MRF. The training continued for 3 hours. In the training, the safai sathis were oriented how to work effectively on machine. The idea behind the training is to improve the productivity rate of processing.</p> <p>The United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), through its urban social protection programme – Utthaan (Rise with Resilience), launched a facilitation Centre for Swachha Sathis (waste pickers) in Bhubaneswar today. In partnership with the Embassy of Japan and Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation, the center is one of its kind and will support Swachha Sathis - known as Swachha Sathis in the state - with social protection schemes that promote their financial inclusion, health, and social security. The facility center is inaugurated by the Additional Commissioner and Dy. Commissioner of BMC in presence of officials of UNDP, HCCB, CORE and Swachha Sathis.</p> <p>Trivandrum –</p> <p>In the month of July2021, the Team from SMS initiated a step towards bringing-in New Collection Points in The Ward. The Team from Nward surveyed residential buildings and Bulk Waste Generators (BWG)in the ward creating awareness on source segregation and attempting to convince them to handover the waste to SMS, which has partnered with BMC. A new collection point was successfully on boarded -the Pasaydan Charitable Hospital, a BWG in the area was brought on board for dry waste collection.</p> <p>Mumbai –</p>

		<p>Stree Mukti Sanghatana under Project Prithvi of Hindustan Coca-Cola Beverages Pvt Ltd and UNDP conducted a dedicated campaign to create awareness on segregation of waste. Volunteers reached out requesting the residents to store their plastic waste separately and hand it over to the collecting team during the drive. With the help of residence, Stree Mukti Sanghatana conducted Plastic collection drive in Bhandup. In which Stree Mukti Sanghatana's team collect Mixed dry waste around 72Kg.</p> <p>SKRAP is a waste management firm that offers solutions for offices, events and brands. SMS –Muktai Ghan karachara Cooperative collaborated with SKRAP for waste management. The team of 3 Safai sathis led by a supervisor collected and segregated about 100 kgs. of dry waste from an event management activity</p> <p>Cuttack – A meeting was held at Cuttack under the chairpersonship of Dy. (ii) HDFC

- **Awareness Drive conducted:** Awareness drive conducted for shopkeepers at the KTC bus stand shopkeepers of main market area, Tonca market area, societal managers, etc. for promoting cleanliness among them and segregation of waste and link with the MRF respectively.
- **Awareness Rally conducted:** Awareness rally conducted on Independence Day and on the occasion of World Cleanliness Day covering the commercial & residential area near MRF facility to promote 16- way segregation and segregation at source and KTC bus stand and nearby market area along with KTC depo staff and CCP staff respectively.
- **Harela Festival:** Joint plantation program organized at keshav park awas vikas by NN Rishikesh, feedback foundation and LPSS where the SS were apprised on the various ways to protect the environment and reduce the use of plastic.
- **Distribution of Juice and Cold drinks:** With the help of HCCB, the Red Cross Society distributes the juice packets and cold drinks to safai sathis in Panaji.
- **Celebrated World Cleanup Day:** Participated in the cleanup program organized by feedback foundation on the occasion of world cleanup day at Triveni ghat. The SS were apprised on the importance of protecting the environment and reducing the use of plastic.
- **Participated in Kachra alag kro program:** Participated in the kachra alag karo program organized by feedback foundation on Amrit diwas at Raghunath temple, Pragati vihar, ward no.12, where process of waste segregation was demonstrated, Prominent citizens were honored by the ward councilor and municipal commissioner for segregating their waste at the source and composting the wet waste at home.
- **Door to Door Awareness Program:** Regular D2D awareness carried out with garbage collection vehicle in various areas in the city for promoting Source segregation of waste.

- **Celebrating swachhata ravivar:** Every Sunday is celebrated as swachhata ravivar under which freedom from dirt campaign was initiated for creating awareness on source segregation, reducing the use of plastic, etc. at different areas in Rishikesh. Some of the Mega Events conducted on Sundays are:
 - A Cleanliness Campaign- "Gandagi se Azadi Abhiyan" was organized in Govind Nagar slum area.
 - Gharelu Hanikarak Kachre se Azadi.
 - Single Plastic se Azadi Abhiyan.
 - Littering and Spitting se Azadi abhiyan.
 - Conducted a campaign at Someshwar Mandir to create awareness among citizens for source segregation of waste and demonstration of different category of waste were done.
- **Celebrated Independence Day:** Independence Day celebrated in which the chief guest, the president of the JAN SANGATHAN MANCH and a rally was organized in ward no- 37 with the SS and their children.
- **Distributed PPE Kits:** PPE kits (Gloves, Face Mask, Helmet, Safety Jacket, Safety Shoes, Goggle for person working at bailing machine) have been distributed to all the staff members working at MRF center.
- **Virtual Workshop conducted at Rishikesh:** A Virtual meeting on zoom was conducted in which the President of Paramax Apartment and other key members regarding the source segregation of waste and onsite composting of wet waste in the apartment.
- **SWM workshop and triggering session at RWA:** SWM workshop conducted at Paramax apartment, Ganga Nagar to discuss about the action plan for inhouse composting of wet waste and its mechanism. (Source segregation demonstration has also been shown during the session)
- **World Nature Conservation Day:** On World Nature Conservation Day, plantation drive was organized under the chairmanship of RWA member Mr. Manoj Joshi and Ward Councilor Mr. Chandra Prakash in Ward 41 at Haldwani. The participants were also apprised on the source segregation and on single use plastic.
- **PWM training for RWA members:** Organized plastic waste management training with the members of RWA -ward 41 to explain them the methods of waste management in detail, promoting source segregation, etc.
- **Morning Prayer, Panaji:** Initiated the custom of praying with the safai sathis before beginning their daily work.
