LEGISLATION

- 1. During the reporting period, were there any legislative changes to the way in which the Government of Jamaica establishes the identity of local populations, (e.g. birth registration, issuance of documentation to establish citizenship, nationality and right of residence in Jamaica)?
- 2. Beyond the amendments to the Trafficking in Persons (Prevention, Suppression and Punishment) Act, were any new laws passed, or existing laws amended, during the reporting period governing the prosecution or sentencing of human trafficking offenders? If so, please describe.

LAW ENFORCEMENT STATISTICS

For each case of arrest, prosecution and conviction please include number of (alleged) offenders, number of those who were public officials, and law(s) under which the traffickers were arrested, prosecuted and/or convicted. If you wish to elaborate, we would welcome narrative descriptions of prosecutions and convictions.

- 8. How does the government encourage TIP victims to assist in the investigation and prosecution?
- 9. How does the government encourage TIP victims to assist in the investigation and prosecution?

- 2. What has been done to research and assess the scope of human trafficking in Jamaica?
