Narrative

The above project seeks to achieve **UNDAF Outcome 2.3: Multi-Sectoral HIV and AIDS Response**. **Project outputs include;** 1. capacities of infected and affected communities on their rights as well as to influence laws and policies strengthened 2. Capacities of legal professionals to address HIV through quality services strengthened 3. Provision of legal aid and litigation 4. Capacities of judicial officers to address HIV through quality judgements improved 5. Capacities of law enforcement officers on HIV, human rights and the law strengthened 6. Dialogue forums conducted at regional, national and county levels 7. Advocacy materials produced and disseminated on law reforms 8. Capacities of the media on HIV, Human Rights and the Law strengthened 9. Best practices on HIV, Human Rights and the law produced. **A number of activities** are proposed to contribute to each of the outputs: some of these include; training and capacity building of the identified constituencies, development of advocacy materials, research, media forums, county, national and regional dialogues, legal aid clinics, litigation, and publication of documents, among others.




