	healthcare waste manageme healthcare waste in public assessments, the training for On April 01, 2021, the contr medical workers of Cholpon	he Project conducted the Rapid Assessment Survey to collect data on the current state of ealthcare waste management (HCWM) and the monitoring and impact assessment of ealthcare waste in public-health facilities and solid waste landfills. Based on these assessments, the training for 600 medics is currently taking place in all the country's regions. In April 01, 2021, the contractor, Health Promotion Association, conducted a training for 1 edical workers of Cholpon Ata District Hospital on HCWM within Output 1 "Health System rengthening to Respond to COVID-19".		

Trainers:

The training covered the following agenda topics:

- Identification, classification, labeling and packaging of healthcare waste
- HCWM cycle: identification, sorting, labeling, packaging, internal transportation, decontamination, disposal and/or utilization.
- Emergency response activities when handling medical waste
- Organization of a decontamination/autoclaving facility for healthcare waste of class B (B) and class V (B)
- Class B (b) and class V (B) healthcare waste decontamination in microwave wastedisinfection equipment

Upon completion of the training all 15 participants took a quiz to test their attained knowledge. The contractor used visibility logos in all training materials.

UNDP team who conducted the monitoring visit together with the IC Expert on health waste management and infections control, Dr. Aleksei Kravtsov, visited the Cholpon Ata municipal landfill. Technically this is not a landfill, rather it is merely a regular dumping ground. This demonstrated an unacceptable way and conditions of utilization of medical waste, which is commonplace in the country. The city authorities forced medics to burn medical waste, the remnants of which the team had detected.

The Comms Assistant took and archived photographs of both training and visit to the landfill.
