

**ARRANGEMENT BETWEEN HER MAJESTY THE QUEEN IN RIGHT OF CANADA,
HEREIN REPRESENTED BY THE MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS (HEREIN
REFERRED TO AS "DEPARTMENT OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS, TRADE AND
DEVELOPMENT" OR "DFATD") AND THE UNITED NATIONS DEVELOPMENT
PROGRAMME (UNDP) REGARDING A GRANT TO THE TRUST FUND FOR SUPPORT
TO THE FULL IMPLEMENTATION OF THE CONVENTION ON CLUSTER
MUNITIONS IN THE LAO PDR WITHIN THE FRAMEWORK OF THE VIENTIANE
DECLARATION ON AID EFFECTIVENESS**

1. Pursuant to the Terms of Reference of the UNDP Trust Fund for Support to the Full Implementation of the Convention on Cluster Munitions in the Lao PDR within the Framework of the Vientiane Declaration on Aid Effectiveness established by the Administrator of UNDP on 5 March 2010, and which Terms of Reference are attached to this Arrangement as Annex B, DFATD is making available a grant (the "Grant") of USD \$655,802 to be administered by UNDP in accordance with UNDP Regulations and Rules in line with the terms and conditions set out in the Terms of Reference of the above mentioned UNDP Trust Fund for Support to the Full Implementation of the Convention on Cluster Munitions in the Lao PDR within the Framework of the Vientiane Declaration on Aid Effectiveness. The grant is intended to support the operations of the UXO Lao Programme (as per Section I, sub-item 2(c) of Annex B below) as described in the "Proposal for the Government of Canada" (Annex C).
2. a) DFATD shall, in accordance with the schedule of payments set out below, contribute to UNDP the amount of USD \$655,802. The grant shall be deposited in the:

Schedule of Payments

Upon signature of the arrangement a request for payment will also be processed for the amount of USD \$496,820. A subsequent and final payment of USD \$158,982 will be paid in June 2015.

- b) DFATD will inform UNDP when the two installments of the grant are paid via an e-mail message with remittance information to contributions@undp.org and nils.christensen@undp.org.
3. In accordance with the decisions and directives of UNDP's Executive Board reflected in its Policy on Cost Recovery from Other Resources, the Grant shall be subject to cost recovery for indirect costs incurred by UNDP headquarters and country office structures in providing General Management Support (GMS) services. To cover these GMS costs, the grant shall be

charged a fee equal to 8% (the rate of 7%, as defined in the attached Terms of Reference (Annex B), has now expired and has been replaced at this new rate). Furthermore, as long as they are unequivocally linked to the specific project(s), all direct costs of implementation, including the costs of executing entity or implementing partner, will be identified in the project budget against a relevant budget line and borne by the project accordingly.

4. The Grant shall be used exclusively for the purposes for which it is intended as stated in Article 1 above.
5. UNDP headquarters and country office shall provide to the Donor all or parts of the following reports, prepared in accordance with UNDP accounting and reporting procedures:
 - 5.1 For Arrangements of one year or less:
 - a) From the country office (or relevant unit at headquarters in the case of regional and global projects) within six months after the date of completion or termination of the Arrangement, a final report summarizing programme/project activities and impact of activities as well as provisional financial data;
 - b) From UNDP Bureau of Management/Office of Finance and Administration, an annual certified financial statement as of 31 December to be submitted no later than 30 June of the following year;
 - 5.2 For Arrangements of more than one year:
 - a) From the country office (or relevant unit at headquarters in the case of regional and global projects) an annual status report of programme/project progress for the duration of the Arrangement, as well as the latest available approved budget.
 - b) From UNDP Bureau of Management/Office of Finance and Administration, an annual certified financial statement as of 31 December every year to be submitted no later than 30 June of the following year.
 - c) From the country office (or relevant unit at headquarters in the case of regional and global projects) within six months after the date of completion or termination of the Arrangement, a final report summarizing programme/project activities and impact of activities as well as provisional financial data.
6. After consultations have taken place between DFATD and UNDP and provided that the payments already received are, together with other co mingled funds available to the programme/project, sufficient to meet all commitments and liabilities incurred in the execution/implementation of the programme/project, this Arrangement may be terminated by UNDP or by DFATD. The Arrangement shall cease to be in force 30 (thirty) days after either of the Parties has given notice in writing to the other Party of its decision to terminate the Arrangement.

In addition, DFATD may, by giving notice to UNDP, terminate, suspend, withhold or cancel any payments under this Arrangement in the event that (a) funding levels are changed or otherwise affected by the Parliament of Canada, (b) the Recipient does not use the Grant in accordance with the provisions of this Arrangement or (c) the UNDP is no longer eligible.


7. Notwithstanding termination of all or part of this Arrangement, UNDP shall continue to hold, unutilized payments until all commitments and liabilities incurred in the execution/implementation of all or the part of the project, for which this Arrangement has been terminated, have been satisfied and project activities brought to an orderly conclusion.
8. In cases where the Project is completed or terminated, any funds below 5,000 USD (five thousand US Dollars) that remain unexpended after all commitments and liabilities have been satisfied shall be automatically reallocated by UNDP. Any funds above 5,000 USD (five thousand US Dollars) that remain unexpended after all commitments and liabilities have been satisfied shall be reallocated by UNDP after consultation with the DFATD.
9. This arrangement and Annexes A, B, and C attached hereto constitute the entire arrangement between DFATD and the UNDP with respect to the subject matter and supersedes all previous negotiations, communications and other arrangements relating to it unless they are expressly incorporated by reference. The effective date of this Arrangement is the date on which it is signed by DFATD and UNDP. If the signing occurs on two different dates, this arrangement will take effect on the date of the last signature. Eligible retroactive expenditures from January 1st, 2015 until the effective date of this Grant Arrangement will be considered for reimbursement.

The expiration date of the Grant Arrangement is 30 June 2015.

Annex A

In addition to the Arrangement between Her Majesty the Queen in Right of Canada, herein represented by the Minister of Foreign Affairs (hereinafter referred to as "Department of Foreign Affairs, Trade and Development" or "DFATD") and the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) (herein referred to as "the Recipient") regarding a grant to the Trust Fund for Support to the Full Implementation of the Convention on Cluster Munitions in the Lao PDR within the Framework of the Vientiane Declaration on Aid Effectiveness, the following terms and conditions are included as an integral part of this Arrangement.

1. PAYMENT:

- 1.1 The amount of the grant identified under in paragraph 2 a) of the Grant Arrangement is definitive.
- 1.2 Unless otherwise specifically provided, nothing in this Grant Arrangement will imply the assumption of any responsibility by DFATD or its representatives for any aspect of the organization, management, or financing of the Project. Notwithstanding anything in this Grant Arrangement, DFATD does not by financial or other assistance to the Recipient undertake any responsibility for errors, negligence, mismanagement or debts incurred by the Recipient or any other person, group, or agent associated with it.
- 1.3 This Grant Arrangement is not for the consideration of a supply to Her Majesty, and as such, the Canadian Goods and Services Tax does not apply to any payment made under this Grant Arrangement.
- 1.4 The Recipient will not use the Grant under this Grant Arrangement as a duplicate charge against Canadian Government funds in other activities of the Recipient.

2. CONFIDENTIALITY

- 2.1 DFATD and the Recipient will mutually ensure that any information of a confidential nature will be treated as confidential. Any documents that the Recipient provides to DFATD and which it considers to be confidential in nature will be clearly and appropriately marked.
- 2.2 DFATD and the Recipient will use all reasonable efforts to protect the confidential information from disclosure to any third party. Such efforts will be, in the case of DFATD, governed by relevant Canadian legislation, and for the Recipient, no less than those used by the Recipient to protect its own confidential information.

3. RECORDS

- 3.1 Although not obligated, the Recipient may provide DFATD with a copy of any financial audit and evaluation reports pertaining to the Project conducted by the Recipient or persons retained by the Recipient.

4. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF FUNDING

- 4.1 In consultation with DFATD, the Recipient will publicly acknowledge the Grant provided by DFATD under this Grant Arrangement in publications, speeches, press releases or similar communications.

5. NOTICE

- 5.1 Where in this Grant Arrangement any notice, request, direction, or other communication is required to be given or made by either **DFATD** or the **Recipient**, it will be in writing and is effective if delivered in person, sent by registered mail, by telegram, by telex, by e-mail or by facsimile addressed to the party for whom it is intended at the address indicated in Sub-paragraph 5.2 of the Grant Arrangement. Any notice, request, direction or other communication will be deemed to have been given if delivered in person, when personally received by the other party; by registered mail, when the postal receipt is acknowledged by the other party; by telegram, when transmitted by the carrier; by telex, e-mail, or facsimile, when transmitted. The name and or address of either **DFATD** or the **Recipient** may be changed by notice in the manner set out in this provision.

8. NO EMPLOYEE OR AGENCY RELATIONSHIP

- 8.1 Neither the **Recipient**, nor anyone else who is engaged with the Project, are employees of Her Majesty or **DFATD**. This Grant Arrangement does not make the **Recipient** a partner or agent of Her Majesty or **DFATD**. The **Recipient** will not represent itself, including in any agreement with a third party, as a partner or agent of Her Majesty or **DFATD**

Annex B

UNDP TRUST FUND FOR SUPPORT TO THE FULL IMPLEMENTATION OF THE CONVENTION ON CLUSTER MUNITIONS IN THE LAO PDR WITHIN THE FRAMEWORK OF THE VIENTIANE DECLARATION ON AID EFFECTIVENESS

Terms of Reference

1. The Administrator hereby establishes a Trust Fund (hereinafter referred to as "the Fund") under the financial regulations and rules of UNDP for the receipt and administration of the funds to mobilize additional resources needed to enhance UNDP programme activities related to the Full Implementation of the Convention on Cluster Munitions in the Lao PDR within the Framework of the Vientiane Declaration on Aid Effectiveness.
2. Financial resources pledged will be managed by the Fund under the authority of the Administrator. Activities financed by the Fund shall be carried out within these terms of reference.
3. UNDP will designate an Implementing Partner (hereinafter referred to as "the Implementing Partner") for the implementation of each activity financed under the Trust Fund.

I. Contributions to the Fund

1. Contributions to the Fund, in cash or in kind, may be accepted by UNDP from Government of Member States of the United Nations and of the Specialized Agencies or from intergovernmental or non-governmental organizations, or from private sources.
 2. Contributions to the Fund may be made in any of the following forms:
 - a) As voluntary contributions without limitation to a specific project or projects;
 - b) As contributions for the purpose of co-financing a specific project or projects in support of the operations of the NRA to be handled in accordance with UNDP's policies and procedures for contribution arrangements;
 - c) As contributions for the purpose of co-financing a specific project or projects in support of the operations of UXO Lao to be handled in accordance with UNDP's policies and procedures for contribution arrangements;
 - d) As contributions for the purpose of co-financing a specific project or projects in support of victim assistance to be handled in accordance with UNDP's policies and procedures for contribution arrangements;
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- e) As contributions for the purpose of a specific project or projects contracted to independent clearance and risk reduction operators through competitive bidding processes to be handled in accordance with UNDP's policies and procedures for contribution arrangements;
 - f) As contributions to a specific project or projects under a subsidiary trust fund agreement entered into between the donor and UNDP in accordance with UNDP's normal policies and procedures for the establishment of trust funds with specific donors.
3. Contributions in cash to the Fund may be accepted by the Administrator in fully convertible currency or in any other currency, which the Administrator determines can be readily utilized. Such contributions shall be deposited into bank accounts designated by UNDP.
4. The value of a contribution-payment, if made in other than United States dollars, shall be determined by applying the United Nations operational rate of exchange in effect on the date of payment. Should there be a change in the United Nations operational rate of exchange prior to the full utilization by the UNDP of the contribution-payment, the value of the balance of funds still held at that time will be adjusted accordingly. If, in such a case, a loss of the value of the balance of funds is recorded, the UNDP shall inform the Donor with a view to determining whether any further financing could be provided by the Donor. Should such further financing not be available, the assistance to be provided pursuant to this Agreement may be reduced, suspended or terminated by the UNDP.
5. All financial accounts and statements shall be expressed in United States dollars.

II. Utilization of the Fund

1. UNDP shall utilize the Fund for the purpose of meeting the project objectives and financing the activities of the projects as approved by UNDP under these terms of reference. Details of such projects, including the respective project budgets, shall be as set out in the relevant project documents.
2. In accordance with the decisions and directives of UNDP's Executive Board reflected in its Policy on Cost Recovery from Other Resources, the Contribution shall be subject to cost recovery for indirect costs incurred by UNDP headquarters and country office structures in providing General Management Support (GMS) services. To cover these GMS costs, the contribution shall be charged a fee equal to 7%. Furthermore, as long as they are unequivocally linked to the specific project(s), all direct costs of implementation, including the costs of executing entity or implementing partner, will be identified in the project budget against a relevant budget line and borne by the project accordingly.

3. Any interest income derived from contributions to the Fund shall be credited to the Fund in accordance with the applicable UNDP regulations, rules and directives.

III. Administration of the Fund

1. The Fund shall be administered by the UNDP in accordance with UNDP Financial Regulations and Rules.
2. Project management and expenditures shall be governed by the regulations, rules and directives of the UNDP and, where applicable, the regulations, rules and directives of the executing entities or implementing partners.
3. A Steering Committee chaired by the Government of Lao PDR and co-chaired by UNDP will be established to provide advice and recommendations on the operations of the Fund (see Terms of Reference of the Steering Committee at Annex 1).

IV. Implementation and Budgeting of Funds

1. The aggregate of the amounts budgeted for the projects together with any estimated payments in respect of support services (ISS) shall not exceed the total resources available to the Fund.
2. If unforeseen increases in commitments or expenditures are expected or realized (whether due to inflationary factors, fluctuation in exchange rates or unforeseen contingencies) the assistance to be provided under the Fund may be reduced, suspended or terminated by UNDP.

V. Ownership of Equipment, Supplies and Other Property

Ownership of equipment, supplies and other property financed from the Fund shall vest in UNDP. Matters relating to the transfer of ownership by UNDP shall be determined in accordance with applicable policies and procedures of UNDP.

VI. Audit

The contribution shall be subject exclusively to the internal and external auditing procedures provided for in the financial regulations, rules and directives of UNDP. Should the biennial Audit Report of the Board of Auditors of UNDP to its governing body contain observations relevant to the contributions, such information shall be made available to the donor.

VII. Reporting

1. The Administrator shall report to the UNDP Executive Board on the activities of the Fund.
2. The Administrator shall also provide to the UNDP Executive Board an annual report prepared in accordance with UNDP accounting and reporting procedures, which report shall provide information on income and expenditure incurred during the previous year.
3. The Administrator shall also provide a Donor reports on the income and expenditure, including an annual certified financial statement by the UNDP Bureau of Management/Office of Finance and Administration as of 31 December to be submitted not later than 30 June of the following year.

VIII. Other matters

1. Notwithstanding the completion of the projects financed from the Fund, any unutilized balances shall continue to be held in the Fund account until all commitments and liabilities incurred in execution/implementation of the projects have been satisfied and project activities have been brought to an orderly conclusion.
2. The Fund shall terminate upon completion of all projects identified pursuant to this Terms of Reference and after satisfaction of all commitments and liabilities arising there from. Any balance then remaining shall be disposed of by the UNDP in consultation with the Donor(s).

ANNEX 1

Steering Committee Terms of Reference

1. Introduction

A Steering Committee (the "Steering Committee") will be established to provide advice and recommendations on the operations of the Lao PDR Cluster Munitions Trust Fund.

2. Structure and Composition

Membership:

The Steering Committee will be chaired at Vice-Minister level by a representative from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. It will be co-chaired by UNDP.

It will include:

- Representatives from bilateral donors whose paid-in contributions or binding commitments to the Funds amount to a minimum of US\$500,000. In addition, an additional seat would be given to a representative of other contributing donors who do not meet this threshold according to a procedure to be decided upon by the Committee.
- A representative from the Ministry of Planning and Investment
- A representative from the Ministry of Finance
- A representative from the Ministry of Labor and Social Welfare

Frequency of Meetings:

The Steering Committee will meet at least on a bi-annual basis, or as often as will be determined by the Chair.

Agenda:

The agenda and supporting documentation will be prepared and disseminated by the NRA Secretariat, in accordance with the directions of the Chair.

Quorum:

A quorum of the Steering Committee will consist of fifty percent plus one with a minimum of five members in attendance.

3. Responsibilities

The primary responsibilities of the Steering Committee will be:

- To guide the operations of the Fund and ensure that resources are utilized for their intended purposes, in accordance with the Fund's Terms of Reference and the contribution agreements signed with donors.
- To review the funding policies and criteria used for the allocation of available Fund resources. Recommendations in this regard will be made by the Fund Secretariat.
- To review programme/project proposals and funding requests submitted by implementing entities through the Secretariat.
- To ensure conformity with national plans and priorities.
- To ensure coherence between the activities financed from the Fund and those financed through other sources.
- To review all Fund's progress reports, as well as evaluation reports.

4. Decisions

The Steering Committee will normally attempt to make decisions by consensus. However, when a consensus cannot be found, decisions will be made on a majority basis.

All decisions will need to be validated by UNDP to ensure compliance with the Fund's Terms of Reference and applicable rules and regulations.

Decisions of the Steering Committee will be duly recorded in minutes prepared by the Secretariat.

ANNEX C: GOVERNMENT OF CANADA GRANT TO UXO LAO THROUGH THE UNDP TRUST FUND (1 January 2015 – 30 June 2015)

PURPOSE, ACTIVITIES AND EXPECTED RESULTS:

Background and Purpose: During the Second Indochina war (1964-1975), more bombs were dropped on Lao PDR than on Japan and Germany combined during World War II. Over two million tonnes of bombs were dropped, making the Lao PDR the most heavily bombed country in the world. It is estimated that up to 30 per cent of these munitions failed to explode. Even today, they continue to threaten the lives and well-being of the Lao people. Cluster sub-munitions or 'bombies' are the most common form of unexploded ordnance (UXO) remaining. According to a 2008 survey there have been over 20,000 UXO related casualties since the hostilities ceased.

Given the existing scale of the contamination, UXO is a threat to human security and a hindrance to the country's socio-economic development. The worst impacted areas are poor, rural and remote. UXO needs to be cleared in order for socio-economic development to take place.

Recognising the impact that UXO has on socio-economic development, the Government of Lao PDR (GoL) established the Lao National Unexploded Ordnance Programme (UXO Lao) with the support of UNDP, UNICEF, and other donors in 1996. The Lao National Unexploded Ordnance Programme (UXO Lao) is the national UXO clearance operator in Lao PDR.

Activity 1 – clearance and release of at least 800 hectares of land in the nine most heavily affected provinces.

Activity 2 – Quality Management (QM) oversight of UXO Lao field operations to ensure efficiency, effectiveness and safety of UXO Lao operations in the field.

Activity 3 – Risk Education activities in nine provinces.

Activity 4 – Support UXO Lao general oversight of the programme and UNDP programme advisory and implementation support.

The above activities aim to achieve the following results:

- 800 hectares of unexploded ordnance (UXO) contaminated land made safe for development action;
- Increased safety of people living in UXO impacted areas;
- A reduction in the number of people killed or injured by UXO accidents/incidents;
- Improved access to agricultural land;
- Improved capacity of the Lao Government to meet its obligations under the Convention on Cluster Munitions;
- Greater density of UXO, especially sub-munitions or 'bombies', per hectare located and destroyed due to revised survey procedures. In previous years UXO Lao has found an average of 4-5 'bombies' per hectare using the traditional clearance approach. It is expected that with the introduction of the new evidence-based survey approach, the average number is likely to increase significantly. This will however only be confirmed at a later stage when the approach has been properly rolled implemented in UXO Lao field operations.
- QM Inspections will ensure that UXO Lao is operating in a safe and effective manner in accordance with International Mine Action Standards (IMAS).
