The challenge is becoming even greater with the booming mining sector that puts heavy pressures on the environment. To address the challenges along with the global community, the Government of Mongolia initiated development of a national strategy on green growth. The strategy will need to be refined and made operational through development and implementation of an action programme with realistically set targets of financially-costed priority measures to be implemented for key economic sectors. Furthermore, the strategy needs to have the policy outcomes of the upcoming UN Conference on Sustainable Development (Rio+20) incorporated. Through the proposed project, UNDP will support finalizing the strategy, development of an action programme and validation by facilitating international and national knowledge and expertise.
Project Summary In one paragraph explain what the project plans to achieve and who the primary audience is. -	The project aims to help determine strategies for greening the country's economy and human development, identify opportunities to improve efficiency in resource utilization and increase effectiveness of mitigation efforts. The existing draft strategy will be reviewed and refined on the basis of detailed sector analyses and modelling to determine mitigation potentials of economic sectors, priority measures, financial implications to achieve set targets and needs for building capacities at various levels. To prevent from the strategy becoming a wish list, UNDP will also support development of an action programme. Both documents will be validated through national level discussions and submitted for Government approval. Partnership will be established with the Global Green Growth Institute (GGGI) based in Korea, in order to leverage best available analytical tools and expertise. Potentials will be explored to mobilize direct supports from the GGGI. Awareness of general public will be increased on potentials for greening their lifestyle and consumption patterns.
