

Before Cyclone Idai swept through Mozambique in March 2019, Cecilia lived in a mud house in a flood area with her four children and three orphan nephews. She worked in agriculture and sold her produce to generate income. But after one of the worst natural disasters ever to hit the southern hemisphere, which affected 1.8 million people and claimed hundreds of lives, she had to start over.

“I lost my house and documents due to the cyclone. I had no money, and nowhere to live. I had to figure out how to go on with my life,” she says.

Cecilia and the children first moved to the Mandruzi resettlement site. “At that time, the important thing for me was that the place was safe, and we would have our own space, where we could stay,” Cecilia said, after she and her family were shuttled between schools and temporary shelters.

Two years later, Cecilia and her children will live in cement house for the first time. The UNDP Recovery Facility, through the Mozambique Recovery Facility (MRF), in coordination with Government’s Reconstruction Cabinet, and with funds from the European Union, Canada, China, Finland, India, the Netherlands and Norway, is supporting her and her family by building a new house and offering ways for community members to make money.

Avant que le cyclone Idai ne balaie le Mozambique en mars 2019, Cecilia vivait dans une maison en terre dans une zone inondable avec ses quatre enfants et trois de ses neveux. Elle travaillait dans l'agriculture et gagnait sa vie de la vente de ses produits. Mais après l'une des pires catastrophes naturelles jamais survenues dans l'hémisphère sud, qui a touché 1,8 million de personnes et fait des centaines de morts, elle a dû repartir de zéro.

« J'ai perdu ma maison et mes documents à cause du cyclone. Je n'avais pas d'argent et nulle part où vivre. Je devais trouver un moyen de rebondir », raconte-t-elle.

Cecilia et ses enfants ont d'abord trouvé refuge sur le site de réinstallation de Mandruzi. « À l'époque, l'important pour moi était de trouver un endroit sûr, soit notre propre espace où rester », raconte Cecilia. Jusque-là, elle et sa famille avaient déambulé d'écoles en abris temporaires.

Deux ans plus tard, Cecilia et ses enfants vont vivre pour la première fois dans une maison en ciment. Le Programme des Nations Unies pour le développement (PNUD) lui vient en aide par le biais du Mécanisme de redressement du Mozambique (MRF), en coordination avec le Cabinet de reconstruction du gouvernement, et avec des fonds de l'Union européenne, du Canada, **de la Chine**, de la Finlande, de l'Inde, des Pays-Bas et de la Norvège, en construisant une nouvelle maison et en offrant aux membres de la communauté des moyens de générer des revenus.

Strengthening Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises after Cyclones Idai and Kenneth

The Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) recovery and development is one of the main components of the Pillar 1 – Livelihood Recovery and Women Economic Empowerment of the Mozambique Recovery Facility program.



The objective behind this component is to support the design of enterprise recovery schemes in the crisis affected areas to boost wider local economy and help improve livelihoods of the affected population.



To ensure quick employment recovery, UDP will provide cash grants to local micro enterprises, small businesses and local entrepreneurs to replenish their assets that have been lost or damaged due to the Cyclones Idai and Kenneth.



It will target the empowerment of women and women's groups both as partners and beneficiaries.

Core Activities

By targeting enterprise recovery on a larger scale through the injection of financing UNDP will help to put small enterprises back on their feet, facilitate transition from emergency employment into longer term growth prospects through various strategies. Under the MRF Program, UNDP proposes interventions to:

- Assess the recovery needs, capacities, available sources of funding and market conditions for the re-activation and recovery of MSMEs in the cyclone affected provinces
- Analyze the state of financial institutions and micro finance institutions (MFIs);
- Develop an implementation strategy with enterprise recovery schemes for quick revival and stable local economy. Workshops on MSMEs Recovery Strategy to local and national stakeholders and beneficiaries in order to ensure participation, accountability and ownership from;
- Incorporate a needs assessment for women and girls and to offer a package of new skills, access to capital and market information;
- Design and use transparent enterprise selection and targeting approaches.
- Design transparent transfer of non-reimbursable funding kits and enterprise recovery grants for MSMEs businesses in the crisis affected areas
- Establish the key performance indicators with local government and CBOs for M&E
- Develop the capacity of local authorities, NGOs and communities



519 small businesses

have been designed and provided through skills trainings and start-up kits, benefitting around 2,595 people.



3 local markets

are under final stage of construction in Dondo and Chibabava districts. Each of them will enable 28 small market businesses in average.



Thirty (30) small and medium companies affected by Cyclone Idai in the Sofala Province received trainings and mentoring on business management through the Mozambique Recovery Facility.

The project participants developed their business continuity plans and have received micro grants in the final stage of the project in March 2020. Thanks to UNDP and partners they were able to resume their activities and recover some of their losses from the disaster.

“My catering company has suffered a lot from Cyclone Idai. 90% of equipments were damaged and the roof flew away. I thought of giving up but I saw families around me in much worse situation. ‘I can rebuild my business because I did not lose my life’, I realized. This was how I gained more courage.



I restarted working as a volunteer cook in Beira during the first days of emergency after Idai. To resume my own business at that time I had to sell my house.

Now, with this project promoted by UNDP, I have my business plan ready and with the amount received of MNZ\$ 500,000 I will be able to purchase some of the materials I lost. I will overcome the difficulties that I am still going through”, tells Adelaide Sabão, who has successfully completed her participation in the project.

The small and medium-sized businesses in the Sofala Province were the most affected companies during cyclones and subsequent floods of 2019.

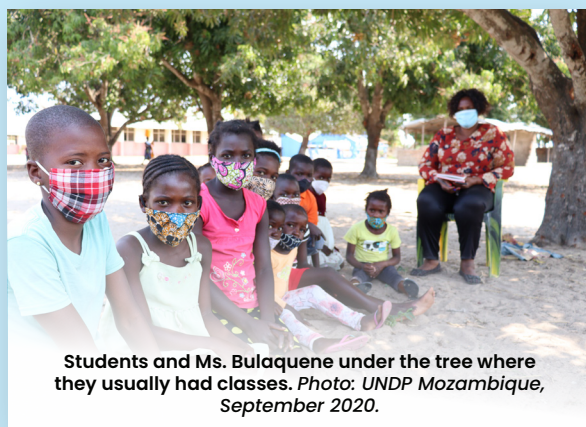
Resilient Reconstruction through UNDP Mozambique Recovery Facility thanks to China funding

“We have many students here at the school and many classes are held under the trees. The new classrooms are going to be a very good thing, because some children had given up studying. When the Cyclone hit, the existing structure of our school managed to host 1,000 families in the school for 45 days. But the children were disappointed for a long time. We had to raise awareness of the community so that they could return school at that time”, reports the director of Chipinde Primary School, Ms. Gracinda Bulaquene, in Dondo District.



“We will be satisfied by having better and more beautiful stands. I believe that we will be able to save more money too, because today when it rains food items get wet and we end up disposing them”, tells Joana Machaire Canetane, 55 years old, head of the Tica Market, in Nhamatanda District. “We need this new place to better conserve our products and sell better”, she concludes highlighting the need of a safe and resilient infrastructure.

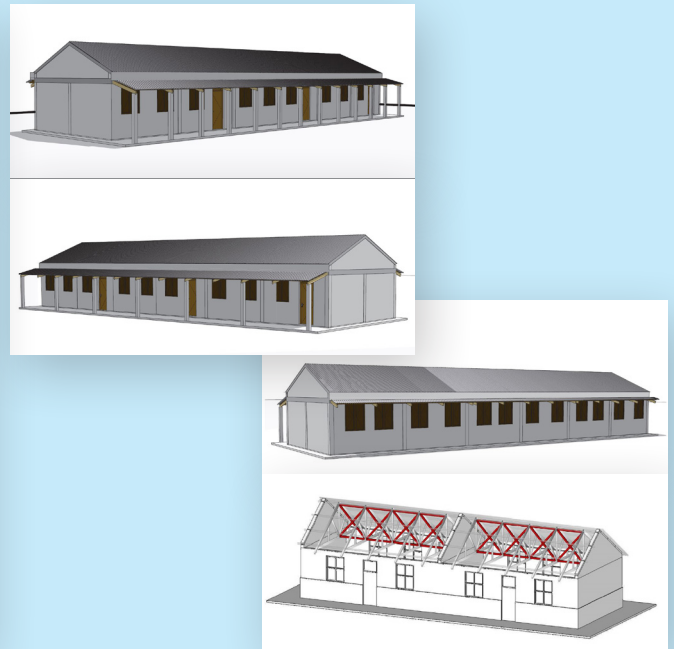
PROJECT DETAILS

8 Schools

In total, 40 classrooms, eight (8) administration offices and 64 latrines will be built.

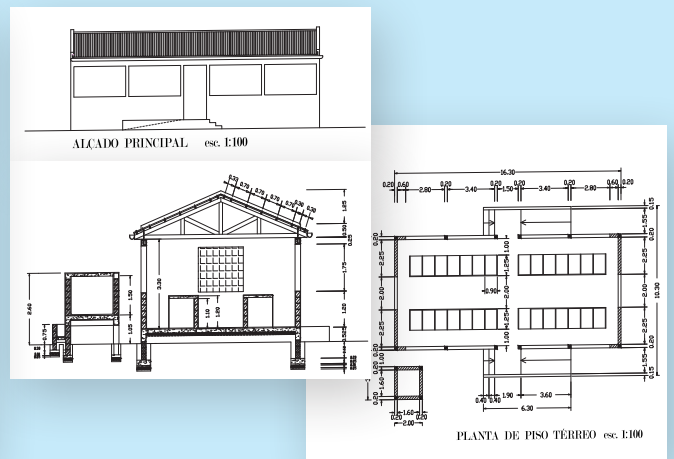
Each school construction comprises: five (5) classrooms, where each one will fit 25 double desks for 50 students per time period; one (1) administrative office of 55.2 m² with four (4) rooms; eight (8) latrines.

Buildings will have access ramps for the disabled and electricity system via solar panel. Rooms will be equipped with student desks, office tables, chairs, boards.



3 Markets

Each market construction comprises: one (1) building with 28 stalls of 112.5 m², with access ramp for the disabled and electricity system via solar panel; restroom with four (4) latrines and two (2) showers; handwashing lavatory with 6 m³ rainwater storage capacity.



17 Houses

Each house measures 34 m² and comprises two (2) rooms, one (1) balcony. Construction work also includes one (1) latrine outside the house.
