

Brief Description

The Social Cohesion project is designed to support the Government of Malawi in its endeavour to establish a National Peace Architecture (NPA) that will provide a platform for collaborative dialogue, peace building and conflict prevention. This is in line with the constitutional provision, section 13(l), which calls for the “adoption of mechanisms for peaceful settlement of conflicts through, among other strategies; conciliation, and mediation to ensure that the country is secure and democratically mature”. Building on all the support rendered to the Government of Malawi in this area since 2012, which has among others resulted in key stakeholder acceptance and buy-in. The project has had significant achievements that include a report for the establishment of a NPA in Malawi; a draft NPA strategy; a draft Communication Strategy and a draft Peace Policy. UNDP will in 2017 continue to support the processes toward the establishment of this national peace architecture, while strategizing on transitioning the various aspects of UNDP’s support to peacebuilding in the country into a unified peace building structure and system. The AWP will focus on supporting the creation of a conducive policy environment and legal framework for the establishment of the NPA, and this will be through; finalization and approval of the Strategic Plan and draft Peace Policy; Drafting the NPA Bill; establishing of 11 additional Districts Peace Committees; and formulating a 3-year Project that will roll out the national peace architecture and support the electoral process towards the 2019 elections. Approval of the Peace Policy is pivotal to realize results of interventions planned for 2017. This AWP will also continue to support initiatives aimed at increasing the participation of youth and women through youth and women peace forums at both national and regional levels.
