Brief Description

The project is designed to support existing structures of the Public Affairs Committee (PAC), in providing platforms for collaborative dialogue, peace building and conflict prevention. At continental level, these interventions contribute to SDG 16 and AU Agenda 2063 being popularized by ECOSOCC to which PAC is an accredited member representing CSOs in Malawi. While at domestic level, this is in line with the constitutional provision, section 13(1), which calls for the “adoption of mechanisms for peaceful settlement of conflicts through, among other strategies; conciliation, and mediation to ensure that the country is secure and democratically mature”. Following the implementation of the AWP’s since 2014 which resulted amongst others in the training of youth early warning monitors, capacity building in insider mediators, areas of advocacy and continued collaborative dialogues, UNDP continues to support PAC in the roles of advocacy, dialogue and facilitating collaborative leadership. Particular focus for 2018 will be on strengthening both national and domestic level mediation and dialogue facilitation capacities, and also influencing public policies as we approach the 2019 Tripartite Elections. The project will continue, where necessary, to facilitate national debate on contested issues on governance and socio-economic aspects . It will also continue to support the pilot conflict early warning and early reporting structures at the district level, in order to make them more effective in their role in conflict prevention and support to national advocacy.


