Sharing of Information:

During the meeting with SDE at DWIDP/PEP office, Mahottari showed concern of his ignorance of the activities carried out by the project. Also mentioned that the DPO/Mahottari need to keep inform about the program institutionalize and on regular basis. As shared, their staff have been facing difficulties to set office table and working space due to lot of programs and activities to be implemented by PEP office. Lack of working space in the DWIDP/PEP office, very difficult to organize, coordinate for working environment. It feel that lack of sharing information with the concerned agencies about project implementation modality, project's activities executed by DHM will some-how play a role to ignorance.

Involvement of concerned district line agency:

DWIDP Divisional Office has provided office working space to the project in their building and District Program Officer is working with the collaboration and cooperation with the divisional office. But, SDE showed the concern that activities is implementing by the project is un-aware to him.

Financial Implication:

Quality assurance of the implemented activities. Project invested huge financial resources for the benefits of the communities, if community is not taking responsibility to sustain the embankments, rain gauge reading etc. then after project phase out implemented activities also will be in an unproductive.
