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2. Contents

(1) Summary of the project

The general objective of this project is to strengthen the Ministry of Environmental Affairs (MEnA)

regulatory role of the environment sector, and to enhance its capacity to implement part of the

Environment Sector Strategy of 2011-2013, in terms of development of regulations, guidelines,

Monitoring and inspection systems. The project will also identify the other stakeholders' role in

Monitoring and enforcement of those regulations. This project will also identify the

environmental sector priority needs and interventions for the years 2011-2014.

The project will entail needs assessment for MEnA and build their capacity as the regulator of the

Environment Sector and improve compliance, monitoring and enforcement of Environmental

Regulations in the occupied Palestinian territory (opt). A comprehensive capacity building Approach will be implemented. Focus will be made on the institution, the enabling environment in addition to individual coaching and capacity building.

*It is important to highlight that the financial figures in this report are temporary figures, and may be corrected at a later stage due to exchange rate fluctuations, realized gain/loss or any other possible corrections. UNDP/PAPP's financial system operates in such a manner that the financial system closes in early December of each year and that final expenditure reports reflecting the disbursements and GMS of the previous year are only published in March of the following year.

(5) Any special notes or remarks

Despite of the delay in the implementation at the beginning, the implementation of the project is progressing now. It is expected that all the activities will be completed by the end of Dec, 2012. Remarkable achievements have been made so far which include:

- An action plan for the coming three years has been prepared ,printed and distributed
- Mapping out most polluting industries and preparing descriptive manuals for the major ten industries.
- Draft manuals and procedures on monitoring and inspection, environmental auditing, and implementation of EIA policy are being finalized based on feedback from EQA and UNDP before being applied to field testing.
- Two relevant By-laws and Standards are being finalized based on feedback from the line Ministries. The Bylaws are Stone cutting and hazardous waste and hazardous materials.
- Finalizing the list of the needed tools/equipment including detailed specifications and costs. These were categorized into three categories. A priority 1 list was prepared and procurement process is ongoing. It is expected that a contract will be signed with the supplier mid Aug, 2012.
- Conducting a successful Training/Study Tour to Jordan. A follow up mission from Jordanian Ministry of Environment is planned mid Sep, 2012
- Preparing a draft complaints handling system.
- Preparing a list for hazardous materials and wastes.
- Reviewing the biodiversity By-law
- Developing Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the relevant ministries is on-going. These will be used to clarify the roles and responsibilities and the coordination mechanisms pertaining to monitoring & inspection

It is very important that a second phase of the project is funded in order to make sure that the results achieved in the first phase are sustainable. An information management system and mechanism of enforcement are a critical need for MEnA to halt the ongoing deterioration of the environment.
