UNDP-GEF Guidance for UNDP Initiation Plan for GEF funded projects

A. Brief Description of Initiation Plan:

During the Initiation Plan period, a number of baseline studies and stakeholder consultations will be undertaken. The purpose of the PPG is to support the development of the "Asuncion Green City of the Americas: Pathways to Sustainability" FSP (Full Size Project) The IP consists of the project preparatory activities including: (1) Conduct baseline studies and surveys to come up with the pertinent data and information that are required to verify and confirm the earlier identified baseline projects; (2) Conduct a logical framework analysis (LFA) mainly to verify and firm up the project planning matrix (PPM) or results framework (log frame); (3) Identification and assessment of demonstration schemes including calculation of Global Environmental Benefits; (4) Detailed design of the project components and activities; (5) Conduct stakeholder and project partner coordination meetings (e.g., demonstration hosts and co-financers), and establishment of the appropriate project implementation and management arrangements; (6) Preparation of the UNDP-GEF Project Document (ProDoc), UNDP Social and Environmental Standards Template, GEF CEO Endorsement Request (CER)Document and GEF Tracking Tools, based on the GEFapproved project concept, i.e., GEF-approved Child Project (Annex 3); and, (7) Finalization of the ProDoc and CER Document. The final output of the initiation plan will be a UNDP-GEF project document and GEF CEO endorsement template with all required supporting documentation, including but not limited to Co-financing Commitment letters, an Environmental and Social Screening and the relevant GEF Tracking Tools for the above mentioned project ready for submission to UNDP and the GEF within the agreed upon timeframe.

The overall approach for the project strategy and main components of the project were identified during the preparation of the GEF Child Project Concept Note. However, to enable the final assessment, definition and costing of the priority actions, the PPG resources will be used to support more detailed analysis and consultation to define the roles and responsibilities of different institutions for project implementation. The final outputs of the UNDP-GEF Project Document and GEF CEO Endorsement Request template will be achieved through the implementation of 5 component activities in this Project Preparation Phase, namely: A) <u>Technical reviews and studies, B) Institutional arrangements, monitoring and evaluation, C) Financial planning and co-financing investments, D) Validation workshop and E) Completion of final documentation.</u>

B. Project Preparation Activities:

Component A: Technical reviews and studies

I. Assessment and technical studies related to baseline, barriers and specific outputs of the project

These include specific studies required to provide detailed and quantified information and/or expand and validate baselines, barriers and risks identified in the Child Project Concept Note for the development of more specific outputs and baseline data for indicators, and to address specific technical issues and questions raised by the GEF Sec; Council member and STAP.

- i. <u>Analysis of existing baseline initiatives and data availability:</u> At the national and local level to confirm gaps and further define the terms of reference of consultancies required to provide the technical basis and ensure integration of the full project with development plans, policies, budgets and complementary initiatives.
 - a. Validate and expand the description of existing baselines and the expected investments over the project life and identify other initiatives not included in the Child Project Concept Note and their expected investments.
 - b. Further review of the most relevant baseline projects and information to determine the full extent of additional data collection needed. Special attention should be paid to the data produced by projects on transport, waste management and water treatment implemented by the Central and local governments and all GEF and national projects with direct or indirect influence on the improvement of sustainable public services in the City of Asunción and Gran Asunción.

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- c. *Stakeholder Mapping:* Identification and description of roles, functions and responsibilities of key stakeholders; assessment of stakeholders interest and participation and identification of key areas for more detail in capacity assessment.
- d. In the context of gaps and barriers, further analyse how the project will build on the baseline initiatives and the potential contribution of these initiatives to the FSP. This should include the review of past and on-going programs and projects for lessons to build on.
- ii. Cross Cutting /Outcome 1 Technical Studies: This studies will assess the country and institutional capacities to deliver multiple health; social; and local, national and global environmental benefits for the development of integrated planning, finance, capacity development, public awareness, disaster risk management and monitoring strategies/systems through:
 - a. An institutional capacity assessment addressing integrated planning, sustainable city finance strategies and disaster risk management planning: Based on the capacity assessment findings, the study will develop realistic and time bound actions to build institutional capacities, reinforce inclusive inter-stakeholder participation and multi-level governance, and strengthen the project institutional architecture that will be implemented over the life of the project.
 - b. **Mapping of policies and programmes supported/revised by the project:** This study will aim to analyse the current status of relevant laws, policies and programmes in order to seek for synergies and co-financing with the Sustainable City project, as well as maximize national coordination efforts.
 - c. Social Study on the impact of project's waste management measures on current formal and informal employments and livelihoods: This study will assess the impact of the formalization of the waste management urban recyclers and other related economic activities that are currently are carried out in landfills (legal and illegal), and will propose measures to mitigate unemployment and explore gender dimensions in the context of the creation of new sanitary landfill employments.

Based on the above mentioned studies, and on the consultation with stakeholders to validate them, planning and institutional actions will be defined to be included on the project component 1 (enabling framework for a green sustainable city) of the full project. The PPG team in charge of developing the studies must take into consideration the gender dimensions of these structural problems and propose actions to address women's risks and opportunities in the re-organization of the employment structure proposed for all sectors involved in the project (Capacity Building, Transport, Waste Management and Protected Areas Management).

- iii. Targeted technical assessments to develop Outcome 2 (Sustainable Mobility and Transport in Asuncion): This studies will assess the current situation of urban transport in Asuncion, and will propose measures to be implemented to reduce GHG emissions from urban transport resulting identified measures. The actions proposed for the PPG phase of the project would be:
 - a. A study on the feasibility of transport interventions aiming at integrating sustainable mobility systems to the multi modal transport system in Asuncion: This study will present Asuncion present transport infrastructure conditions and will assess the feasibility of implementing various sustainable transport initiatives, including:
 - i. improvement of bus services and maintenance
 - ii. the implementation of a high quality bus rapid transit system (BRT),
 - iii. a network for non-motorised transport (walking, cycling), identifying and assessing relevant green protected areas carrying capacities for hosting these networks.
 - iv. parking policies and traffic management plans.

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The study will be developed in close consultation with various government stakeholders, researchers and community representatives to build consensus on the need for planned urban sustainable transport systems.

- iv. Targeted Studies to develop Outcome 3 (Improved Chemicals and Waste Management Systems): This studies will assess emissions of UPOPs, GHGs and toxic chemicals in the current waste disposal system and will propose improved waste management measures through:
 - a. UPOPs/GHG emissions calculation study: This study will aim at estimating rates for the current landfills GHG and UPOPs emissions that will be use in emission inventories through the life of the project and will serve as evidence on the development of sustainable waste management policies at the local and country level.
 - b. **Recycling Centre Feasibility Study**: This study will address the feasibility of designing recycling systems to incorporate them into the whole waste management strategy proposed by the project.
- v. Targeted Studies to develop Outcome 4 (Protected Area Management Systems Emplaced/Improved): This studies will assess the management effectiveness of at least 2 SINASIP PAs, to help increasing protection to at least 1% of the global populations of 5 endangered bird species during migration periods. In order to develop the management standards and plans for the project, the following studies should be carried out:
 - a. Feasibility study for offsets and payments for environmental services.
 - Feasibility/costing study for the strengthening of Valle Asuncion, Parque Guasu and other selected protected areas.

II. Studies to address any opportunities/risks identified during an environmental and social standards screening to be further developed during PPG phase

An Environmental and Social Safeguards Pre-Screening (ESSP) has been conducted for the child project. It is expected that these preliminary risk categorization and its mitigation measures will be further developed by the PPG team during the project preparation phase. The PPG team must complete the UNDP Social and Environmental Standards Template to inform project design and to be presented with the Prodoc, CEO Endorsement Request and Tracking Tools at the submission to GEFSec. (See Annex 3 for Child Project Concept Note Risk Analysis and Annex 4 for the ESS Pre-screening carried out at the Child Project Concept preparation).

III. Identification of specific sites for intervention

The project will be implemented in the metropolitan area of Asuncion (known as Gran Asuncion) in specific locations, by building on important baseline projects that will be executed in the next years to address the main urban problems:

- Transport
- Solid Waste Disposal
- Management of Green Areas

A full description of the Green Areas, as well as dump sites and non-motorised transport paths should be presented as far as possible containing maps and pictures of the specific sites to be intervened by the project.

IV. Integration with development plans, policies, budgets and complementary projects:

The project is consistent with the National Environmental Policy (2005) and will contribute to the implementation of the Central Government's National Development Plan which promotes, as a general strategy, an urban development that results in a better quality of life and optimizes resources and services based on adequate zoning and territorial articulation between public and private sectors. The project is also aligned with the National Policy on Climate Change, the National Policy on Disaster Risk Reduction, and the National Biodiversity Strategy currently being designed. The project is also consistent with several sectorial plans that includes the Transport Master Plan, the "Franja Costera's Development Plan" and the Zeta Plan. It will build upon the Asunción and Metropolitan Area Waste Management Plan, the Master Plan for Rain Water and Flood Control Plan, and the Asuncion and Metropolitan Area Strategic Master Plan currently being designed.

Through project implementation, contributions will be made to the Third National Communication on Climate Change and to the National Biodiversity Strategy and Action Plan currently being prepared under SEAM's leadership. It will also enable and/or contribute to the enforcement at urban level of several environmental laws such as the Environmental Service Law, the Protected Areas Law, the Wildlife Law and the law on Environmental Crimes, among others.

The project will also contribute to the achievement of several Aichi targets amongst others 3, 11 and 12. For target 3, that relates to incentives for the conservation and sustainable use of biodiversity, Asuncion's city authorities have key mandates and this project will contribute to increasing their role in strategies such as promoting and attracting green investors, and mainstreaming of "payment for ecosystems services" mechanisms. For target 11 that relate to the per cent area of terrestrial and inland water under conservation, the proposed parks, corridors, and municipal parks (public and private) will contribute to reaching national targets. For target 12: related to the prevention of extinction of threatened species, awareness raising campaigns managed by city regional authorities along with NGOs and museums will raise critical attention and funds and provide technical assistance for the conservation of threatened species.

The project development team must ensure that the project tis aligned with the GEFs global Integrated Approach Pilot on Sustainable Cities (USD 100 million), including common activities and standard indicators across Child projects. The project must also be aligned with the achievement of the UNDP Strategic Plan Outcome 1: "Growth and development are inclusive and sustainable, incorporating productive capacities that create employment and livelihoods for the poor and excluded".

V. Completion of GEF focal area tracking tool and UNDP Social Environmental Standards:

Complete GEF-6 tracking tools for each of the project components: Climate Change, Chemicals and Waste and Biodiversity with its corresponding METT (BD1) tracking tools will be delivered as part of the technical review component, in conjunction with the technical studies undertaken in item II.

VI. Stakeholder consultations during technical review

<u>Consultations as part of the technical assessments</u>: As a complement to the technical studies to be undertaken in item I and II stakeholder consultations will be held to obtain data, to engage stakeholders during project design, negotiate partnerships with on-going projects to align their activities and the project to build synergies and to complete the social and environmental screening required by UNDP rules and regulations. These consultations will be documented and reference made to them in the full Prodoc.

Under the leadership of UNDP Paraguay and UNDP Regional Hub, the PPG coordinator will engage other key stakeholders during project design, particularly the Secretariat of the Environment (SEAM), Ministry of Public Works

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(MOPC), the National Secretariat of Emergencies, the Ministry of Public Health and Social Welfare and the Municipality of Asuncion. It will also include engage at the technical level with teams working on the most relevant baseline project including amongst others Asuncion's ISWM assessment. In addition, consultations will be held with technical staff in other implementing partner agencies, such as Inter-American Development Bank (IADB) and national NGOs that will be consulted and participate in project design (see Child Project Concept Note).

These consultations will be reinforced through regular inter-institutional technical meetings that will accompany the design phase. This includes MOPC, SEAM, and Secretariat for Emergencies, Asunción Municipality, Secretariat of Culture, NGOs, IADB, government baseline projects coordinators and UNDP.

Component B: Institutional arrangements, monitoring and evaluation

The outputs of Component A will be used as technical input to Component B for the formulation of the UNDP-GEF project document.

- a. Finalization of project results framework: Further define the results framework with appropriate objective-level and outcome-level quantitative and qualitative SMART indicators, and end-ofproject targets. Special attention will be made to include socio-economic and sex disaggregated indicators.
- b. Definition of monitoring and evaluation (M&E): A detailed M&E work plan will be developed, including clear identification of responsibilities and accountabilities, as well as an appropriate M&E budget. The plan will be based on the standard template provided in the UNDP-GEF project document template that reflects the mandatory requirements of the GEF M&E Policy.
- c. Define sustainability plan: The sustainability plan will outline the principles and guidelines for ensuring the long-term sustainability of project achievements. It will also outline an exit strategy, seeking the continuation of key activities/achievements without the need of long-term international financing.
- d. Definition of management arrangements: As this is a large, complex project, the definition of management and implementation arrangements will be undertaken in detail to ensure that these are appropriate to deliver this project within the planned resources and timeframes. For this latter, a full assessment will be undertaken to identify the support needed to ensure expedited procurement. An overall procurement plan will be developed for the project and a detailed one for at least the first year. Terms of reference for the main studies and contracts will be developed by the PPG team.

A Pre-PAC will be held several months before submission, to review these implementation arrangements, allowing finalization within the timeframe for PPG phase.

As regards to management arrangements, the organizational structure governing the project will be decided. This will include identification of the project board.

e. Stakeholder consultations during Component B: Involve key agencies in the development of the project strategy to ensure a strong national ownership. In close collaboration with key government representatives and other stakeholders ensure full participation in the development of the project results framework and ensure agreement on the project objectives and outcomes. Undertake consultations to secure agreement(s) on project implementation arrangements, including roles, responsibilities, and accountabilities of lead and partner agencies. Document these consultations.

Component C: Financial planning and co-financing investments:

- a. Prepare a detailed multi-year budget following the standard template provided in the UNDP-GEF project document template that reflects the mandatory requirements of the GEF M&E Policy.
- b. Explore national, local, multilateral and bilateral co-financing opportunities: Undertake series of consultations with partners to ensure a coherent and sustainable financing package for the project including post- GEF grant phase.
- c. Ensure completion of required official endorsement letters: An official endorsement letter will be prepared by the GEF Operational Focal Point of the Government. A co-financing guarantee will be collected from participating government institutions, bilateral development partners, multilateral development partners and NGOs who wish to provide cash or in kind contributions to the project.
- d. Stakeholder consultations during Component C: Stakeholder consultations will be held in order to ensure consistency and commitment with the financial investments needed to implement the project activities.

Component D: Validation workshop

A validation workshop will gather representatives from all relevant stakeholders to present, discuss and validate the final draft Project Document, CEO endorsement, GEF Tracking Tool and UNDP Social and Environmental Standards.

Component E: Completion of final documentation

- Consolidation of all technical and consultation inputs into a clearly written UNDP Prodoc document with all relevant sections and annexes.
- Development of a project document in the national format in Spanish in parallel to the regular GEF/UNDP format.
- c. Completion of a CEO endorsement request form.
- d. Translation of UNDP Prodoc document into host country language and any further documentation required for preparing implementation.
