<p>Objectives of the Mission:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Participate in the VCCCT training from 30<sup>th</sup> to 3<sup>th</sup> June 2016.</li> <li>• Knowledge development on the GF requirement</li> <li>• Facilitate payments of expenses incur and other activities for the training workshop.</li> <li>• Observation and assessment of the training and make recommendation on improvement</li> </ul> <p>Planned Activities/Interventions during the mission:</p> <p>The National VCCCT Training was opened by the Penama acting secretary Ms. Sarah Pakoa. Present on the opening were representative of the area chief of East Ambae, church leaders and the staff of the Penama Provincial Health (see attached photo).</p> <p>A total of 12 participants attended this training of which about half of them are new to the training while the other half, have at least undertook similar training in the past.</p> <p>The training was conducted by three trained officers including the national HIV coordinator.</p>

The PR presentation covers areas of improvement based on previous experience with the Malaria and the general expectations of UNDP from the programs and the rational of why new procedures and processes need to be introduced.

The field visit to the new VCCT site at Lolovange Village was an experience for the participants to assess the health center based on what they have learn.

**Specific Project Performance/Implementation Issues (including key challenges):**

- Generally, the delivery of the training was very good. The facilitators have used different delivery methods which aid in the process of learning and very interactive.
- The material used were well designed and part of the regional training package
- The duration of training was appropriate to cover the modules
- However, there is evidence of poor preparation of activities for the training. It should have been better if the training was collaboratively discussed and planned with the trainers.
- There is evident of lack of proper communication from the national and provincial level before selecting the new VCCT site of Lolovange Dispensary.
- It is evident that there are no criteria in determining where to establish new VCCT site in the country.
- Few participants came late for the training even when tickets were available well in advance and, one participant left two days earlier without the knowledge of the PR.

HIV/TB officers admitted that writing TOR and BTOR is very new for them and request for assist on how to write develop them.

**Recommendations/Follow-up Points and by whom:**

- The followings need to be discussed with the OIC PH (Russel & OIC PH)
  1. The receipts of same activities from two different transport drivers
  2. The concerns raised by the acting provincial health manager on the selection of the VCCT site at Lolovange
  3. The overall preparation of the training and areas of improvement
- It is recommended that future training be collectively decided and planned by a committee, which the current trainers should be included (OIC PH, Caleb)
- The HIV unit must develop a clear criterion on how to decide on new VCCT sites in the country (Caleb, OIC PH)
- Training should be conducted for GF officers on how to write TOR and BTOR when PR visited the province in the near future (Russel)
- **Others:**
- PR to follow up with the Department of Local Authority (DLA) and explore further opportunity to use the Areas Secretaries to plan for the LLIN Distribution (Russel)
