LOA AMENDMENT No. 1

This is amendment No.1 to the Letter of Agreement (LOA) signed between the United Nations Development Programme (hereinafter referred to as 'UNDP') in Somalia and Aid Coordination Unit of the Office of the Prime Minister of the Federal Government of Somalia (hereinafter referred to as "ACU") with respect to the realization of activities by the ACU in the implementation of the project numbers 00116132 (output numbers 00113390 and 00122909) and 00117249 (output numbers 00114120 and 00122910) "Support to Aid Management and Coordination in Somalia", as specified in Attachment 1: Project Document, Attachment 2: Description of Activities and Attachment 3: Schedule of Activities, Facilities and Payments of the LOA.

Whereas the Parties have entered into the above Letter of Agreement on 23 March 2020 for the period covering January 2020 to December 2020, the parties hereby agree to amend the LOA and incorporate the following changes:

- √ To introduce new activities to respond to COVID-19 for a total budget of USD203,200.00 under a new output IDs no. 00122909 (for MPTF funds of USD127,050.00) and 00122910 (for USAID funds of USD76,150.00);
- ✓ Reallocation to cover payment of salaries of 6 ACU core staff from January to December 2020 for an amount of \$198,000;
- √ To reflect additional funds of USD161,439.23 received from MPTF, contribution from the Government of Italy to cover payment of salary arrears of ACU Federal Member States Focal Points in 2019:
- ✓ To increase budget of national consultancies by USD15,000.00 from USD45,000.00 to USD60,000.00 and allocate USD106,150.00 for contractual services;
- √ To reduce travel budget by USD236,640.00 from 285,000.00 to USD48,360.00;
- ✓ To reduce budget of training, workshops and conferences by USD169,981.59 from USD328,298.00 to USD158,316.41;
- ✓ To increase budget of miscellaneous—operating expenses by USD3,000 from USD34,800 to USD37,800;
- ✓ The net change to the budget of LOA has been increased by USD280,167.65 from USD693,098.00 to USD973,265.65.
- ✓ To change total amount of CTM to:
 - o Cash advance amount from USD648,098.00 to USD244,476.41
 - Direct payment amount from USD45,000.00 to USD728,789.24 (USD525,589.24 for regular activities and additional budget of USD203,200.00 for COVID-19 activities)

The Description of Activities, Schedule of Activities, Facilities and Payments and the Cash Transfer Modalities (CTM) are described in further details in the revised Attachments 2 and 3 and Annex 2 respectively, attached to this amendment.

This amendment shall enter effect immediately upon its signature by both parties.

All other terms and conditions of the original LOA shall remain unchanged. In case of any ambiguity or conflict between the terms of this amendment and the original LOA, the terms of this amendment will prevail.
