Brief Description

Governments raise and spend public funds to meet public needs. To do this, they must make good policy choices, execute these effectively and be accountable for their decisions and actions. This is more likely to happen in budget systems that are transparent, i.e. those in which the government provides the public with comprehensive, timely, accurate and useful information.

Non-state actors – such as media and civil society – form a vital part of the accountability chain. Media reporting in general, and especially investigative journalism by affiliated or independent journalists, or non-governmental organisations (NGOs), are among the most important sources of public awareness-raising on corruption.

This project will aim to enable journalists to be corruption watchdogs, together with civil society. To objectively and qualitatively perform this role, in 2021 their capacities shall be strengthened in the areas of investigative journalism, the use of open data and digital media. In addition, it is expected that NGOs selected via open call shall publish around 70 investigative stories.
