I have just a note on the sentences “UNDP Thailand’s Tiger Project<sup>[1]</sup> has commissioned a comprehensive study, design, training programme, and a draft master plan for on the community-based wildlife tourism in the Huay Kha Khaeng Wildlife Sanctuary (and World Heritage Site).” that the Wildlife Tourism Master Plan covers all crucial elements of the standard wildlife tourism i.e. Wildlife habitat management to assure wildlife appearance, zoning and architectural design of tourism activities (canopy trails, wildlife knowledge museum, watch tower, etc), wildlife soft release programme, and including community-based wildlife tourism.

So, the master plan is not particularly on Community-based wildlife tourism, but inclusively.
