In close partnership and coordination with the National Coordination Committee on AIDS, TB and Malaria, UNDP execute three GFATM grants; these grants play an instrumental role in achieving the national AIDS, Malaria and TB objectives, as well as the UN's Millennium Development Goals. UNDP closely involve the Government of Tajikistan (particularly the Ministry of Health), other UN agencies, international NGOs, and local community-based organizations (CBOs) in efforts to enhance prevention measures and improve access to health services.

The main goal of the project is to support the implementation of HIV, TB and Malaria Control Program of UNDP and strengthen the national capacities in health care sector for planning, management and monitoring of health programs. The programme is also contributing to national health care reform through building and improving technical and managerial capacities of health professionals, promoting participation of civil society in the response to the epidemics, and enhancing the cooperation of NGOs with the public health sector.

Within the framework of this programme first steps towards introducing MIAD (Multi Input Area Development) through cooperation with the Communities Programme and integration of the livelihood initiatives with health will be taken through providing socio-economic support to the families of TB patients in Khatlon area.
