The main points discussed/suggested

- ✓ The Board meeting was chaired by Ms. Manal Fouani, UNDP Deputy Resident Representative. In her opening remarks, Ms. Fouani welcomed participants and emphasized the important role civil society plays in crisis situations like COVID-19 pandemic through supporting and giving voice to the most vulnerable and holding governments accountable. Ms. Fouani mentioned that despite current challenges the Secretariat of the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine has initiated the development of the National Strategy for Facilitation of Civil Society Development 2021-2025. Ms. Fouani thanked the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Denmark for flexibility with planning which allowed UNDP to reallocate funding and support civil society response to the human rights challenges posed by COVID-19 and quarantine restrictions. DRR has also acknowledged the important role of the Ministry of Youth and Sports in advancing the youth policy, particularly the development of the Concept of State Target Social Programme "Youth of Ukraine 2025" and active participation in the development of the Draft Law "On the basic principles of youth policy in Ukraine". Finally, Ms. Fouani introduced Ms. Oksana Kosenko, the newly appointed Civil Society Project Coordinator.
- ✓ Ms. Maryna Popatenko expressed her appreciation for the ongoing fruitful cooperation within CSDR project. She stressed that the Ministry together with UNDP drafted a Concept of State Target Social Programme "Youth of Ukraine 2025" and added that one of the key criteria of the programme efficiency will be increased youth civic participation and that the Youth Participation Index will be presented soon to enable effective measurement of progress towards this goal. Ms. Popatenko complemented the good progress of the Youth Worker Programme and mentioned that the Ministry is cooperating with the Government to ensure that a youth worker will be officially recognized as a profession. Mr. Popatenko underlined the necessity to develop the institutional support mechanism for youth CSOs. Mr. Popatenko thanked for the development of the Concept of National Unity/Youth Mobility Programme and added that the pandemic may affect its implementation in the nearest future. However, the work on drafting components and establishing appropriate mechanisms for Youth Mobility Programme is included in the Concept of State Target Social Programme "Youth of

Ukraine 2021-2025" and that Ministry has already requested additional budgeting for its implementation in 2021.

- ✓ Mr. Mogens Blom, Chief Technical Advisor, Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Denmark, thanked UNDP for organizing a Board meeting and cooperation throughout the year. Mr. Blom also thanked the Deputy Minister of Youth and Sports for her participation in the meeting with newly appointed Ambassador of Denmark to Ukraine, Mr. Ole Egberg Mikkelsen regarding the perspectives for youth policy development in Ukraine. Mr. Blom also thanked the CSDR project team for adaptive planning approach and stressed that in times of COVID-19 the new approaches and tools should be applied. Mr. Blom emphasized the importance of youth to youth cooperation between two countries and announced the establishment of the Ukrainian Youth House in Kyiv in 2021. Mr. Blom underlined that civil society programme plays a very important role in the developing of an accountable and active society and appreciated that the CSDR project remained operational during COVID-19.
- Ms. Caroline Bilde Lichtenberg, Head of Section, Department for European Neighbourhood Programme, Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Denmark, thanked UNDP team for timely budget adjustments and delivery of the results. Ms. Bilde Lichtenberg highlighted the role of CSO Hubs and acknowledged their progress in achieving financial sustainability. Ms. Caroline has expressed her appreciation for UNDP's actions to transfer the Youth Worker Programme into digital format.
- ✓ Following the opening session of the meeting, Ms. Oksana Kosenko, Civil Society Project Coordinator, presented the key achievements of the Civil Society for Enhanced Democracy and Human Rights Project (CSDR) in 2020. She presented Project's key 2020 outcome results, challenges and lessons learnt. Ms. Kosenko has mentioned that some of the activities within the work plan were modified to respond to the challenges posed by COVID-19 pandemic and quarantine restrictions such as transferring events and citizen engagement into online mode, allocating funding for ad hoc grant competitions to protect human rights of the vulnerable groups. She also stressed, that these changes should not affect the achievement of the project indicators and there is no need to revise the Logical Framework for now. Ms. Kosenko has also suggested that the composition of CSDR team should be revised to include a Local Governance Expert instead of the vacant position of a Civil Society Officer.
- Ms. Popatenko thanked for the comprehensive overview and appreciated the project results and achievements. Ms. Popatenko underlined the importance of continuing support and development of the Youth Worker Progarmme. Ms. Popatenko added that Ministry is focused on developing infrastructure for youth policy implementation such as supporting the development the youth centres in all oblasts of Ukraine and enhancing their capacities to engage and work with youth through developing and implementing educational programmes. Ms. Popatenko mentioned that the Ministry jointly with UNDP and All-Ukrainian Youth Centre has launched a pilot project Social Cohesion through Youth Participation. Ms. Popatenko welcomed the establishment of Youth House which will promote the intercultural and social dialogue between Ukrainian and Danish youth.

- Ms. Caroline has asked about the opportunities for the CSDR project once the Draft Law on Youth is adopted and whether or not UNDP is in contact with VRU Committee Youth and Sports on this issue.
- ✓ Ms. Oksana Kosenko provided comments that such opportunities could be: 1) supporting the Ministry and stakeholders in developing a comprehensive capacity development programme for youth CSOs since the Draft Law includes a provision to support not only project activities but also core funding for youth civil society organizations; 2) developing and conducting a communication campaign about the Law and its provisions in order to raise awareness on how it can benefit young people, youth civil society organizations and youth centres and how they can advocate for its implementation.
- ✓ Olena Ursu added that outreach to the VRU Committee on Youth and Sports could be ensured through EU/UNDP Parliamentary Reform Project and that UNDP is in dialogue with them to advocate for the adoption of the Draft Law.
- ✓ Ms. Popatenko shared her expectations that the 2nd reading of the Draft Law will most likely be voted in the beginning of 2021. Ms. Popatenko added that in a couple of weeks a technical meeting will be conducted to discuss the latest proposals to the Draft.
- Ms. Manal Fouani asked if the Board Members agree with the suggested changes to the CSDR team composition to include the position of Local Governance Expert instead of Civil Society Officer.

Decisions made and actions to be taken

- 1) Board members expressed the overall positive assessment of the work undertaken by the Project.
- 2) The proposed changes to the Project Budget were endorsed (Annex 1).
- 3) The updated organizational structure of the project was approved (Annex 2).
