The domestic violence component of the UN Joint Programme on Gender Equality and Domestic

Violence (2008-2011) with its many achievements, built on UN expertise and history in tackling gender-based and domestic violence issue in Albania in the past years. In many aspects, this work plan represents an up-scaling and deepening of interventions initiated under that Joint Programme by the four participating agencies but also expands into new directions.

Official statistics demonstrate that one in two women in Albania has experienced some form of gender-based violence and the perpetrator is usually a family member or her partner. The effects of this violence go beyond individual women and families and affect the whole Albanian society.

The activities under this work plan approach the phenomenon through several angles. The UN assistance under this output focuses in improvement of legislative framework, but also in better implementation of pertinent laws and policies. The work plan contains focused interventions in supporting the community coordinated response system in several municipalities, as required by the respective Council of Ministers Decision adopted in 2011. It envisages capacity building interventions for a multitude of professionals to enable them to detect, record, refer and respond to gender-based violence, public awareness campaigns, particularly through involvement of men and boys and improvement of services available to survivors. Finally, it plans assistance to the collection of accurate statistics on gender-based violence and their processing, with a view to feed into the policy development at the national level to address the phenomenon.

Tackling and reducing gender-based violence in Albania will ultimately make possible equal enjoyment of human rights by women and men.
