Brief Description

The purpose of the project revision is to expand support to ANAMA in upgrading its Mine Action Resource and Training Centre located in the Goygol region of Azerbaijan. The additional capacities are required as ANAMA becomes international service provider in the region and its client base is growing. The Project will enable ANAMA to construct additional facilities in Training Centre and create possibilities to expand international training services offered by ANAMA.

I. Situation Analysis

ANAMA's regional structures are well-placed and equipped to provide all required field-based administrative, technical and training support to mine action operators, local authorities and affected communities on any relevant mine action issues. The field based mine action teams of ANAMA are responsible for all emergency responses, UXO clearances, and quality control and assurance.

ANAMA's Mine Action Resource and Training Centre located in the Goygol region of Azerbaijan, 360 km west of the capital city Baku. ANAMA Training, Survey and Quality Assurance Division (TSQAD) is the main ANAMA training resource team that is dealing with trainings of both national and international staff in Goygol Training Center. TSQAD is delivering there different types of training highly evaluated by experts and recognized as eligible training courses for local and international staff.

Up to date TSQAD delivered 113 training courses in the Training Centre in Goygol, out of which 9 was delivered to international staff from Georgia, Afghanistan, Tajikistan and Turkey.

Recently, as a part of NATO / Partnership for Peace Trust Fund Project, ANAMA conducted Battle Area Clearance and Explosive Ordnance Disposal Trainings for Georgian Military officers in the Goygol Training Center. In accordance with the request received from the Turkey Mechanical and Chemical Industries Corporation (MKE) which expressed the interest in participation of their personnel in ANAMA humanitarian mine action training courses, ANAMA provided Basic Humanitarian Demining Training Course for Mechanical and Chemical Industries personnel to enable their future involvement in humanitarian mine action activities in Turkey. The MKE personnel is expected to visit ANAMA in the future as well for additional trainings.

Today the Goygol Training Center can accommodate up to 46 persons. Facilities at the Centre consist of training rooms equipped with LCD projectors, conference/meeting room (maximum capacity 24 persons each); separate accommodation quarters, offering either triple rooms or dormitory style sleeping (each quarter has its own attached, yet shared bathroom facilities); a large meals/communal area and internet library.

The growing demand for the mine action trainings tends to overwhelm the existing capacities of the Goygol's regional centre, and ANAMA is planning to expand the territory of the Training Center by construction of additional facilities to accommodate more trainees in the Training Center and enable conducting of the whole range of mine action trainings for increased quantity of national and international staff.

II. Strategy

The purpose of the project revision is to support construction of the new facilities to enable expansion of ANAMA capacity to deliver training services to national and international staff. During recent years ANAMA is successfully positioning itself as the training center providing training support to different countries. Strategy of UNDP in middle –income countries is to facilitate sharing the experiences of host countries and help them to become an 'emerging donor'.

The project will follow the same strategy as outlined in the original project document. The proposed increase of budget will fall under Activity 4. International Centre for Mine Action, in the original project document.
