Process through which activities were determined and reviewed before their submission for funding:

As can be seen from the summary below the five proposals were developed in a consultative manner and steps were taken to ensure technical viability and coherence with national programme and priorities.

- The UNAIDS Technical Working group consisting of HIV focal points from UNESCO, UNFPA, WHO, UNICEF, UNDP, WORLDBANK, FHI, IOM, CARE, SHISUK, ICDDRB, USAID, Engender health, Population Council, HASAB and DFID, discussed the activities that should go into Bangladesh's PAF proposal in its meetings held in October, November 2002 and January 2003. This draft proposal is a synthesis of the different proposals agencies have developed and agreed by the Technical Working Group.
- The five sub-projects under the proposal were developed by the staff from the various UN agencies with technical inputs in the various areas of expertise. The preliminary draft of the proposal was shared with UNAIDS Geneva for technical review and comments, and this version has incorporated the Technical advisory inputs that were provided by UNFPA's regional technical team [CST Adviser]. This version incorporates the comments from the reviewers vis-à-vis fulfilment of PAF criteria, monitoring and evaluation component, identifying critical strategic activities informing policy and strategic planning, and coherence with the national priorities. Regarding linkage with the national AIDS program the proposal was shared and discussed in a meeting with the AIDS program official and the technical working group members in February 2003 where the five sub projects were discussed and finalised.



PROGRAMME ACCELERATION FUNDS (PAF)

OPERATIONAL GUIDELINES

Background

- 1. As indicated in the 'Guidance Notes for Obtaining Programme Acceleration Funds (PAF) Revision 1' issued by UNAIDS, PAF is intended to support activities that contribute to an expanded national response and fulfill a number of defined criteria. The procedures for requesting PAF are outlined in the above-mentioned Notes. These include the new option for channeling PAF through the UN Resident Coordinator mechanism. The objective of the present document is to outline the procedures related to this new option and, generally, for the management of PAF within UNDP.
- 2. Funds will be transferred by UNAIDS to UNDP for those activities that fall under item 9 or the first bullet of item 11 of the above-mentioned Guidance Notes, i.e. for activities that will be managed through the established UNDP SRC mechanism. A Framework Memorandum of Understanding was signed between UNDP/HQ and UNAIDS Secretariat governing the transfer of such funds.
- 3. However, as stated in the second bullet of paragraph 9 of the Guidance Notes, even though the funds are received by UNDP under the SRC mechanism, UNDP may not always be the implementing UN agency. The UN Theme Group may designate any UNAIDS Cosponsor or other UN System Agency which is resident in the same country as the implementing agency/partner for any of the PAF-funded activities. In such cases, an agreement should be concluded between the UNDP country office and the implementing agency/partner before funds are transferred to such agency/partner. Such transfer of funds will be recorded directly as disbursement, and paid according to the payment schedule contained in the signed Agreement. A sample copy of a country level agreement is enclosed as Annex to these guidelines.

Receipt of Funds by UNDP

- 4. When funds that are to be channeled through the UN SRC mechanism are deposited into the UNDP bank account by UNAIDS, a detailed schedule of the distribution of the funds across the UNDP Country Offices will be provided directly by UNAIDS to the Contributions Unit, Office of Finance and Administration (CU/OFA). Contact persons are listed in paragraph 15. below.
- 5. CU/OFA will be responsible for applying the funds against each Country Office as per the schedule provided by UNAIDS and using the following Budget Account Code (BAC) elements:

8. Upon receiving an advice from the CU/OFA of the receipt of funds, **and only upon receiving such advice**, the Resident Coordinators are authorized to establish the Approved Allotments as Initial Allotments in the Budget module of WinFOAS for this account, using the following BAC:

- 9. The allotment limits **must not** exceed the amount actually received and communicated by CU/OFA for each activity, converted into the currency of the regular allotment, if applicable, using the UN exchange rate in effect at the time of recording the allotment. Any revision must be based only upon the receipt and application of future receipts from UNAIDS in line with items 15 and 23 of the Guidance Notes.
- 10. All disbursements against the above accounts should be made either as authorized by the Resident Coordinator, or in accordance with the payment schedule included in the Agreement signed locally between the UNDP country office and an implementing agency as described in paragraph 3 above. All payments should be recorded through WinFOAS by directly charging the allotment and ensuring sufficient balances are available before entering into commitments.
- 11. The signed Status of Allotment Report (SAR) for this account should be submitted to OBR along with the other SARs on a quarterly basis. An expenditure report should also be provided to the Theme Group Chair in line with the second bullet of paragraph 23 of the Guidance Notes.
- 12. At the end of an accounting year, all remaining balances in each Country Office PAF account will be rolled-forward into the next year and should be used as the basis for creating Initial Allotments in the new year under the same accounts.

Management and Monitoring of PAF Allotments at Headquarters

- 13. OBR will also be responsible for the overall monitoring of the PAF allocations, and will assess on a regular basis whether the delegated authority for establishing allotments at the country level should continue.
- 14. OBR will also be responsible for providing financial reports to UNAIDS on a six-monthly basis in line with Article VII of the Framework Memorandum of Understanding between UNDP and UNAIDS.

Standard letter of agreement for the implementation of activities financed by the UNAIDS Secretariat through the UN Resident Coordinator Mechanism [to be concluded between UNDP and the Co-sponsors of UNAIDS or other UN system agencies]

This agreement is entered into between the United Nations Development Programme ("UNDP"), as represented by its Resident Representative in [name of country] ("the Country"); [name of Agency], as represented by [designation of representative], acting as Chair of the United Nations Theme Group on _____ in the Country ("the TG Chair"); and between [name of Agency] ("the Implementing Partner"), jointly referred to as "the Parties".

This agreement is the agreement referred to in Article VII, paragraph 2 of the Framework Memorandum of Understanding ("the Framework MOU") for the Channeling of Programme Acceleration Funds ("PAF funds") through the United Nations Resident Coordinator mechanism, concluded between the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) and the Joint United Nations Programme on HIV/AIDS (UNAIDS) in July 2002.

The Implementing Partner for the purposes of this agreement is the one referred to in Part II, paragraph 9 (second bullet) of the Guidance Notes for Obtaining and Applying Programme Acceleration Funds (PAF), Revision I, issued by UNAIDS in July 2002 ("Guidance Notes").

The parties agree as follows:

- 1. The Implementing Partner will implement and be responsible for the management of the activities specified in the summary Proposal of Activities Submitted for Funding agreed between the Parties (attached as Annex 1 to this agreement), submitted to the UNAIDS Secretariat in accordance with Annex 1A of the Guidance Notes, and approved by UNAIDS. The Implementing Partner will ensure that the funds are utilized in accordance with the HIV/AIDS Theme Group Work Plan.
- 2. UNDP will transfer to the Implementing Partner, through [Account No.?] an amount of \$ ____ on [date/signature of this Agreement] in accordance with the [following payment schedule/the budget of the approved proposal referred to in Paragraph 1 above].
- 3. In accepting the PAF funds channeled through UNDP, the Implementing Partner shall submit to the TG chair, with copies to the United Nations Resident Coordinator in the Country, on a six-monthly basis, detailed technical and financial reports on the use of funds and the implementation of each activity.

- 4. The Implementing Partner agrees to follow the guidelines for reporting specified in Part IV of the Guidance Notes and to use the prescribed reporting formats.
- 5. UNDP shall make available to the Implementing Partner all information necessary to allow the latter to fulfill its reporting requirements in accordance with the preceding paragraph.
- 6. Ownership of equipment, supplies and other property financed from PAF funds under this Agreement shall be vested in UNDP. Matters related to the transfer of ownership by UNDP shall be determined in accordance with the relevant policies and procedures of UNDP.
- 7. The Implementing Partner shall notify the other Parties upon completion of activities carried out under this Agreement.
- 8. This agreement may be terminated by either party, following thirty (30) days written notice to the other parties. However, in the event of any such termination, paragraph 11 below shall continue in full force and effect until satisfaction of all obligations."
- 9. Notwithstanding completion or termination of this Agreement, the Implementing Partner may continue to hold unutilized payments until all obligations incurred in implementation of the activities under this Agreement have been fully liquidated and the activities brought to an orderly conclusion.
- Any balance of the payments received by the Implementing Partner under this Agreement shall be returned to UNDP upon full liquidation of all outstanding obligations.
- 11. This Agreement may be amended through an exchange of letters between the Parties. The letters exchanged to this effect shall become an integral part of the Agreement.
- 12. Any difference, dispute, or controversy arising out of this agreement shall be resolved amicably through negotiations among the parties.
- 13. This Agreement shall enter into force on the date of the last signature by the Parties.
