I. QUARTERLY SUMMARY OF ACTIVITIES

Work on the V&A and mitigation chapters continues. These chapters were expected last quarter, and their delay has stalled completion of the other information and constraints & gaps chapters. It is expected the work on these chapters will conclude during the next quarter.

The Public Education and Outreach (PEO) Subcommittee concluded working on the PEO strategy. In addition, the comic strip booklet, targeting middle school children, was finalised. Printing the booklet is expected to occur in the next quarter.

The external auditor finished the audit of the project from inception to the end of 2010, and provided the audit report in early June 2011. The audit was conducted along the lines outlined in the guidance document provided by the UNDP Jamaica Office.

The terms of reference for The Bahamas SNC editor were drafted.

The V&A Consultant is late in finishing the revisions to the V&A chapter. Without this chapter, the project cannot finish successfully.	High	Discussions are held with the V&A Consultant. Some hurdles have been cleared, and work continues. Chapter delivery is expected July 2011. BEST is closely monitoring the progress.
As the project end date has changed to December 2011, funds for a project manager are depleted. The BEST Commission (Designated Institution) has assumed this role for the remainder of the project.	Medium	
Risks		Response/Action
As with many Small Island Developing State (SIDS) countries, The Bahamas has issues related to capacity and resources - both of which are limited with many priorities competing for attention and commitment. Climate change will have to compete as well. The economy is dependent on touristic development with large-scale projects existing or planned in coastal areas.	Medium - High	The outputs of the project will enable the National Climate Change Committee (NCCC) to increase awareness of this important issue amongst all sectors of society, particularly decision-makers. There has been engagement with Government agencies on this issue through various workshops and meetings.
Awareness and understanding of climate change is limited across all sectors of society.	Medium	A part of the project will be to increase awareness and understanding of climate change through outputs such as V&A assessment, GHG inventory and mitigation options report. Members of the NCCC have participated in events to increase public awareness of this issue. The PEO Subcommittee finalised a PEO Strategy and continue to work on the comic booklet as an inaugural initiative to raise the level of consciousness on climate change.
As a low-lying SIDS, The Bahamas is faced with the reality that it can do its best to adapt, but climate change as a threat cannot be addressed without commitment of countries with high GHG emissions. LESSONS LEARNT:

Positive:

Negative: The V&A consultant is behind schedule, which adds pressure to conclude by December 2011. Part of the delay is due to not getting the outputs from the climate model runs in a timely manner. An investigation revealed the data storage equipment available is insufficient for the outputs generated from the model runs. A technical needs assessment, conducted prior to the start of the project, may have identified the need to procure additional or more sophisticated equipment.
