PART I. Situation analysis

As an open-type economy, Belarus needs to integrate in the world economic system in order to secure dynamic economic development. The rules within the world economy are shaped to a large extent by the World Trade Organisation, with 151 member governments as of today. At present, 35 - 38% of Belarus' foreign trade is with WTO members. This proportion is expected to reach 98% when Ukraine and Russia join the WTO.

Accession to WTO is a priority of Belarus' foreign trade policy, and a means to secure stable and transparent conditions of foreign trade with international community as well as commonly shared principles of operation for investors and national producers.

Belarus applied for accession to GATT, the precursor to WTO, in 1993. In 1995, WTO established the Working Party on Belarus' accession to the WTO. Belarus has been in the process of bilateral negotiations on market access on goods and services since 2000. In negotiating the terms of WTO accession, Belarus seeks to fully integrate in the multilateral trading system. Its main challenges in this regard are (a) to ensure equal terms of trade with its main partners that are already members of WTO; (b) to gain recognition from its trade partners of the progress made in trade liberalisation by negotiating adequate rights and acceptable terms of WTO membership for Belarus; (c) to secure improved, non-discriminatory access to foreign markets for national exporters on the basis of unconditional provision of the most-favoured nation treatment.

Recently, Belarus has made great progress towards becoming a member of WTO. Presidential Edict No. 439 of 27 July 1999 established an Interministerial Commission on WTO accession, headed by Mr. Andrey Kobyakov, Deputy Prime Minister. Members of the Commission include civil servants from eighteen government agencies, experts from the Belarus Chamber of Commerce and Industry, National Academy of Sciences and Belarus State Economic University. The Legislative Action Plan on Bringing Legislation in Line with WTO Requirements has been mostly fulfilled. Bilateral negotiations were finalized with eight WTO member countries out of 22, as of June 2007. However, the most difficult bilateral negotiations - with the European Union and the United States, have yet to come to a successful conclusion. The Institute of Economics under the National Academy of Sciences produced a comprehensive analysis of the effects of WTO accession covering industry, agriculture, services, social sectors and employment. This mid-term forecast, covering the period 2005 - 2010, is based on the cumulating of possible specific effects arising from WTO accession and of the assessed independent trends of exports, imports and production based on present developments in national economy. It assesses prospects for exports, imports and output on the basis of the present trends in the national economy. The prospects and problems of Belarus' accession to WTO were the focus of an international conference held in November 2004.

As suggested by research findings, WTO accession is unlikely to produce significant risks at the macro level, as the possible negative impacts on some sectors will be compensated by gains in others. However, research identified specific sectors that are particularly vulnerable to import liberalisation, such as light industry, or manufacture of building materials. Further research will be necessary to assess the impacts of the obligations to be assumed by Belarus in connection with WTO accession taking also into consideration possible changes in development of different industries and regions with the view to suggest specific measures aimed at ensuring sustainable socio-economic development.

There is insufficient research on the probable implications for regional economic and trade alliances resulting from WTO accession by their members. In addition, the rapid progress towards WTO accession of neighbouring countries and major trade partners makes it

necessary to investigate the likely impacts of the terms of WTO membership of Russia and Ukraine on Belarus' export interests.

Despite having a strong negotiating team of professional diplomats, Belarus has a shortage of experts, analysts and government advisors with adequate expertise to contribute to formulating balanced policies on foreign trade and economic reform in light of WTO rules and requirements. It is deemed necessary to draw on the capacity of UNCTAD, a specialised agency of the UN, to organise training activities aimed at developing the necessary expertise and building national capacity in trade and development issues.

There is also a shortage of relevant literature in Russian for general audiences highlighting the advantages, potential gains and risks to Belarus from WTO membership.

Rationale for UNDP involvement

This project is fully consistent with the goals and objectives presented in the UNDP Belarus Country Programme Document for 2006-2010. It supports Priority Area 1 of the Programme, "Promoting economic growth and improvements in the standards of living", by contributing to "improvements in the business and investment climate and promoting Belarus' accession to WTO".

The new project builds on the past experience of UNDP in implementing the project "Support for Belarus in the conduct of negotiations on WTO accession", carried out in 1994 - 2000 in collaboration with UNCTAD.

The proposed project will also be implemented in partnership with UNCTAD, a specialized United Nations agency with the necessary expertise and a sound track record of assisting countries that seek WTO membership and are striving to adjust their foreign trade policies in response to global trends. This partnership is envisaged by the "Memorandum of Understanding on the Priority Areas of Cooperation in the Field of International Trade, Investment and Development" signed 16 July 2007 by the Prime Minister of the Republic of Belarus, the Secretary General of UNCTAD and the UNDP Resident Representative in the Republic of Belarus,.

The project will positively affect the development of public-private dialogue, contribute to reducing administrative barriers to business, facilitate improvements in the investment climate and, consequently, investments, and advance socio-economic development in the regions.

PART 2. IMPLEMENTING STRATEGY

The project's main goal is to assist the Government of Belarus in WTO accession by strengthening national expertise and building institutional capacity to adjust national foreign trade policy as well as by raising public awareness of process and impact of WTO accession.

The main objectives of the project are as follows:

- 1. To perform analytical studies, leading to action-oriented recommendations on issues related to Belarus' WTO accession;
- 2. To implement training activities for national organisations, institutions and government agencies on various aspects of WTO accession;
- 3. To conduct an information and education campaign to improve public awareness regarding WTO rules and country's accession process. The target audiences will include the business community, academia and the media.

Expected outputs:

1. Analytical reports for support of the negotiating team are accessible to all potential actors in the negotiation process and to the officials responsible for making policy on issues covered

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- 2. The Belarusian negotiating team and civil servants in the government and legislature agencies will acquire essential knowledge and skills on matters related to WTO accession and will be able to contribute to the negotiating process, equipped with a better understanding of the opportunities and challenges of membership in WTO. This will enable Belarus to join WTO on terms consistent with its socio-economic achievements and national development priorities.
- 3. The business community, academia and the general public will become more aware of the potential impact of WTO rules and requirements on foreign trade regime, the implications for different sectors of the economy and options for increasing competitiveness.

In the long run, the project will:

- strengthen national capacity in foreign trade;
- contribute to a more balanced process of restructuring of the national economy and adjustments in sector output proportions in response to changes in domestic and foreign demand;
- promote timely response to threats of an economic downturn in sectors vulnerable to competition from import as well as expansion of competitive sectors with the view of ensuring sustainable socio-economic development.

The project has three major components

Component 1 will support analytical studies on Belarus' accession to WTO. Analyst teams will be formed to conduct the following studies:

- 1) Analysis of WTO accession terms of Russia and Ukraine and their implications on Belarusian interests in trade with these countries.
- 2) Options to minimize potential risks of Belarus' WTO accession for specific sectors of the economy. Recommendations on adapting government support (subsidization) mechanisms to the terms of WTO membership.
- 3) Possible and balanced scenarios of development of regional alliances in the field of trade and economic cooperation in light of WTO accession by their members .

Each study will contain specific, action-oriented recommendations. Preliminary and final results of the studies will be submitted to the government agencies and organizations represented in the Interministerial Commission on WTO accession.

Component 2 will support institutional capacity building by sharing of state-of-art knowledge and skills needed at the accession and post-accession stages. Officers and consultants from UNCTAD will conduct a series of workshops on key aspects of the negotiation process for the negotiating team, decision makers from key ministries, members of parliament, the business community and academia. Specific themes of the workshops will be identified after an information needs survey among the target groups. Participant feedback will be sought upon completion of the workshops. A team of national trainers will be formed and trained to conduct workshops in the regions.

In addition, UNCTAD will provide expertise in the drafting of documentation related to WTO accession and contribute to the review of draft report of the Working Party on Belarus' accession to WTO. UNCTAD will also provide advice and support to evaluating and categorising requests and requirements of country members of the WTO Working Party and formulating a possible response from Belarus.

Component 3 will include public information and awareness raising activities concerning the goals, benefits and risks of WTO accession. Information and educational campaigns will be organised in all administrative regions and regional capitals MARMETAL FOUND TO BE AND THE PROPERTY OF T

Project beneficiaries and partners

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Interministerial Commission on accession to WTO will be the main beneficiaries from the project.

The parties likely to benefit from the project indirectly will include:

- Government ministries and agencies, and parliamentary commissions involved in making policies and decisions related to socio-economic reform and restructuring of industry and agriculture;
- Belarus Chamber of Commerce and Industry, academic institutions specialising in foreign trade research, export-oriented enterprises, enterprise associations, local enterprises and entrepreneurs.

Potential risks for the project and risk reduction strategies

- 1) Lack of national expertise to cover all relevant aspects of WTO accession. To eliminate this risk an appropriate cooperation should put in place between the UNCTAD international experts and national specialists from organizations involved in the policy-making process of WTO-related issues.
- 2) Identification of sectors of economy sensitive to terms of WTO accession can result in adverse perception from the part of negative lobby. A set of concrete, WTO-compliant policies should be developed to increase competitiveness of such industries and a programme of reallocation of resources to more competitive sectors should be drafted.

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PART 3. MANAGEMENT ARRANGEMENTS

The project will be implemented in the national execution modality. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs will act as an executing agency and will appoint a national coordinator with necessary authority for implementing the project.

The UNDP Office in Belarus will provide administrative support for the project and other services listed in Appendix 1 on a full cost recovery basis within the amounts indicated in Part 2. In coordination with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, UNDP will recruit a project manager to provide current support to project implementation. The Project manager's job description is attached (Annex 2). A Project Coordination Committee (advisory project board) will be established to debate and make decisions on strategic issues concerning the project and to monitor project implementation. The terms of reference for the Project Coordination Committee are provided in Annex 3. The UNDP backstopping Programme Officer will hold the Project Assurance role by carrying out objective and independent project oversight and monitoring functions.

UNCTAD will act as a co-implementing/cooperating agency and supports achievement of the project goals within the limits of its competence. UNCTAD will make inputs and sign the annual detailed work plans, submit annual and semi-annual progress reports and financial statements for inclusion in the project summary reports submitted to the Ministry of Economy in accordance with the national legislation on international technical assistance.

The project will rely on close collaboration with the Interministerial Commission on WTO accession, and partnership with the Ministry of Economy, Ministry of Industry, State Committee for Standardisation, Ministry of Food and Agriculture, standing commissions of Parliament, Chamber of Commerce and Industry, business associations and academic institutions. Close coordination and collaboration will be established, when appropriate, with other international organisations and projects.

PART 4. MONITORING AND EVALUATION OF PROJECT IMPLEMENTATION

Progress of the project implementation will be constantly monitored and will be subject to periodical evaluation and reporting in accordance with the UNDP procedures and rules. The detailed annual work plan will be the object of monitoring. The annual work plan will be elaborated by the project manager in cooperation with key partner organizations. It is subject to review by the Project Coordination Committee and has to be approved by the National Project Coordinator and the UNDP Resident Representative. Efficiency evaluation of training activities and study tours will be based on the results of questionnaires completed by participants.

The project manager will assist the National Project Coordinator to prepare annual reports for the Ministry of Economy according to the evaluation procedure of international technical assistance projects approved by the Resolution of the Council of Ministers of the Republic of Belarus No. 1513 dated November 26, 2004.

The Project Manager is responsible to UNDP for appropriate expenditure of the project budget and reflects the structure of such expenditure in the budget revision, prepared in accordance with the rules contained in the "Financial management and reporting" section of the UNDP manual for nationally executed projects.

PART 5. LEGAL CONTEXT

This project document is a basis for the implementation of a series of activities provided for in the project. This is in accordance with Article 1 of the Standard Basic Agreement concerning assistance between the Government of the Republic of Belarus and the United Nations Development Program which was signed by both parties on September 24, 1992.

Objective:

The Project Manager is responsible for successful completion of all project activities and the delivery of agreed outputs. The incumbent is overseen by the UNDP Program Officer and the National Project Coordinator. The incumbent performs his/her duties in coordination with UNDP, UNCTAD, National Executing agency and the Project Coordination Committee. The incumbent organises the work of the project personnel and consultants recruited for performance of specific jobs and services.

Duties:

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Project Coordination Committee Terms of Reference

Definitions

The Project Coordination Committee (PCC) is a collective body in charge of the strategic management of the project.

The committee's primary goal is to define the strategy for achieving the target outputs.

This goal is achieved through deliberations and joint decision making on key issues relevant to the project and by hearing and approving reports on project implementation. The PCC decisions are not legally binding for the implementing agency.

Members in the PCC are proposed by the National Coordinator, subject to approval by the UNDP Resident Representative in Belarus. In addition to representatives from UNDP and the implementing agency, members in the PCC also include representatives from the relevant government ministries, parliament commissions, donor and international organisations, business associations. Invitations to attend the PCC's meetings can be extended to members of other organisations.

The Committee is chaired by the National Project Coordinator, and the Project Manager acts as the Committee's secretary.

Procedures

The time and venue of the Committee's meetings are defined by the Chairman.

Meetings of the Project Coordination Committee are convened as needed, but at least twice a year.

Each member of the PCC should be informed about the date, time, venue and agenda in advance of the meeting. Preparation for the meeting is the responsibility of the Committee's secretary.

The agenda and procedures are approved by members of PCC. At least one-half of all members are required for the quorum.

Decisions are made through an open vote.

The records of the meeting must be signed by the Chairman of the PCC.
