PROJECT DESCRIPTION (NOT MORE THAN 1/2 PAGE)

The January 2010 CARICOM Commission on Youth Development (CYD) Report "Eye on the Future: Investing in YOUTH NOW for Tomorrow's Community" found that crime and violence is the number one concern of young people and is a major threat to national and regional development. Building on regional evidence based programme outputs such as the UNDP *Caribbean Human Development Report 2012*, *Human Development and the Shift to Better Citizen Security* and the recommendations of the CARICOM Commission on Youth Development (CCYD), the expected objective of the project is to enhance Caribbean youth in civic engagement. In a region where 60% of the population is between 10 and 29 years old with programmes to strengthen youth voice and aspirations, there is a greater call for enhanced high-level participation of vulnerable groups in public policy and decision-making. Strategic partnership with the public and private sectors will be sought to: Communicate the CHDR data analysis to youth with youth participation; Engage Caribbean youth to support the implementation of the CHDR recommendations through enhanced youth dialogue and youth proposals to address high-risk youth interventions to build youth resilience in communities; Empower youth as agents of change to promote human development in their communities.

This project responds to the need for youth-friendly communications products and an enabling environment for inclusive governance and citizen security policy and programme implementation at national and subregional levels.

- Strengthened capacities of youth and women as rights holders, to engage in national and subregional dialogue on the need for a social response to crime prevention

- Sensitization on the citizen security as a human right, involving the inclusion of gender dimensions in security related policies, plans and programmes.
