Brief Description

The CMP was established in April 1981 by agreement between the Greek Cypriot and Turkish Cypriot communities under the auspices of the United Nations. It is the only institutionalized, bi-communal committee in Cyprus. The Terms of Reference of the CMP call upon the Committee to look into the cases of persons reported missing in the intercommunal fighting as well as the events of July 1974 and their aftermath. The mandate of the CMP is purely humanitarian: establish the fate of missing persons. The Committee does not attempt to establish the cause of death or attribute responsibility for the death of missing persons (Article 11, CMP Terms of Reference).

Overall objective of the project is to close, without delay, a painful chapter in the history of the island and contribute to the process of rapprochement and reconciliation between the Greek Cypriot and Turkish Cypriot communities. This important objective will be further encouraged and promoted through the participation of bi-communal scientific teams in all stages of the process.

Specific objectives of the project are a) investigations and collection of information to identify new burial sites b) exhumation of remains of missing persons c) analysis and identification of remains d) proper burial of the remains of identified missing persons e) local capacity-building and quality control and f) awareness and confidence building measures.
