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CTA's Report on the SSE Project for the Period July to November 2018

During the period under review, the project emphasis was focused on

- 1. Capacity building for stakeholders around Mourne Trois Pitons National Park
- 2. Development and use of data management tools for sustainability development of management plans, surveillance plans, financial sustainability plan and the use of GIS.

The Outputs receiving most attention were

Output 1.3 Officially establish a PA coordinating unit to implement PA system across functional management agencies

Output 2.1 Buffer zone for MTPNP legally established and demarcated. PA landscape established and functioning with legal framework

Output 2.2 Codification of higher minimum standards in EIA for new development in buffer zone

Output 2.3 Identify Physical Threats and reduce Vulnerability in MTPNP using community based land management activities to improve livelihoods viability

These outputs will spill over into 2019 since much of the activities have been delayed or only just beginning.

Selection process for GIS specialist, a Financial Management Specialist and a Land Use Specialist was initiated; TOR were developed, advertisement posted, interviews conducted (all according the government standards and procedures), however, the contractual process requires cabinet approval which takes an inordinate amount of time leading to further project delays.

This project faced significant challenges in recruitment, contract finalization and reporting, consequently, it has failed to capitalize on the expected collaboration with other ongoing projects.

The recipients and beneficiaries of financial and technical support from the SSE project are expected to be part of the evolving co-management structure and are therefore being prepared for that via the training initiatives undertaken by the project.

As CTA I visited Dominica August 22nd to 24th 2018. On the 22nd I met with the project coordinator and two consultants to review the consultants progress and provide guidance for the way forward. On the 23rd was the Steering Committee Meeting. The meeting heard report on

- 1.1.1 The BD assessment; this component faced challenges resulting from Hurricane Maria. Landslides, habitat destruction and loss of Agriculture lands and produce demanded modification to the assessment approach.
- 1.1.2 The draft management plan was then being reviewed internally.

- 1.3.1 The Project Coordinating Unit now has a compliment of four staff which is considered satisfactory.
- 2.1.2 Work on the demarcation of the buffer zone had begun but there are significant challenges since the old markers were destroyed and there are no maps or GIS coordinates for those markings. Private land owners in the buffer zone also have title concerns and rights that need to be considered.

The activities under **output 2.3** have had some degree of success; One community that was earmarked for a Community Resource Management Plan has been closed due to hurricane damage. A new community will have to be selected.

The steering committee meeting held on November 14th looked at the 2019 work plan but this plan will have to be fine-tuned early in 2019 based on the contracts awarded and the deliverables at the end of 2018.
