

Project Summary

Since January 2008, the heavy rainy season linked with other climate-related hazards have flooded the low lands of the Ecuadorian coast. Soil degradation as a result of sustained deforestation processes due to inadequate hillside and mountain slope agricultural practices has significantly contributed to the current situation given that vegetation acts as natural boarders to this region.

The complete destruction of 64.000 has, in six provinces of the coast and the extensive damage of up to 100.000 additional hectares has resulted in a severe loss of agricultural production, including crops that supply food and the main source of the income to the population in rural areas. Latest estimates suggest that at least 340.000 people have been directly affected by the floods, with a total population of 12.000 still living in shelters.

At this point in time, response to the disaster can still be characterized as in the humanitarian phase since the rain has not stopped, and it is expected to continue for at least two more months. Distribution of basic supplies,



food and medicines is taking place not only amongst those living in shelters but also with those who have decided to not move out from their dwellings and are still surrounded by un-safe water.

The Coordinating Ministry for the Coastal Region (Ministerio Coordinador para el Litoral) is in charge of the overall coordination of both the humanitarian and post-disaster recovery phases. They have identified a twofold strategy that will assist the affected population through the fast generation of income (temporary jobs), while assuring a rapid restitution of seeds to supply for the initiation of the next crop cycle. The floods caused the partial or total loss of most of the season crops, and a gap of at least 8 months will exist, should authorities simply wait for the next sowing season.

Therefore, the crop cycle will be foreshortened moving ahead in the organization of groups in the affected communities and the procurement of goods required for the project in the 2 months while the rains stop, 2 months for the flooded areas to recover, land preparation and basic infrastructure ready, and a total of 4 months to have the new seed bank ready to be planted.

As such, anticipating the process through the proposed nurseries the seed bank will be ready in four months and the gap in people's income generation and the food security situation will be minimized in the areas of intervention.

Under this framework, UNDP has been requested to contribute to this initiative by supporting the implementation of a pilot project that will be progressively replicated in at least five of the most affected provinces. This project will:

- 1. Create income generating opportunities, which will assure temporary employment for 500 heads of families (men and women) throughout the next 5 months. Mechanisms will be put in place to assure that 50% of the heads of families benefit women.
- 2. Implement 10 nurseries (Units for Agro-Forestry Training) to grow 250.000 plants including agricultural and non-agricultural varieties that will be transplanted once the rain has stopped. These plants will be used to protect hydrographic/water basins and also to commence the production of agricultural trees for food provision. It is expected that out of the 500 temporary employments that will be created by this project, at least 50 permanent positions will be established per nursery. Affirmative action policies will be put in place to ensure equal opportunities for women.
- 3. Ensure that a gender focus is mainstreamed throughout the different phases of this project, a thorough localized gender analysis and strategy will be developed with funds from the regular program.

This proposal is part of a wider and comprehensive approach to Recovery, taking fast and high impact actions in short term projects, contained in the National Recovery Plan. The Recovery needs evolve fast in a highly dynamic environment; therefore, this project constitutes the first step into a wider range of recovery efforts in which UNDP will be supporting the Government of Ecuador. In the long run, the results of this intervention will have effects in reducing vulnerabilities in rural communities with reforesting of water basins, a big challenge to be addressed by the government in order to reduce future disasters, floods and landslides that cause displaced communities and increasing economic losses that have huge setbacks in the countries development efforts.



As pilot and part of a larger initiative that the government is putting together this includes 100 nurseries in the coast and aims at benefiting 5000 families. The 110,000 USD requested will contribute to 660,000 USD that will be provided by the government. The objective is to support temporary income generation and employment activities in 10 Units of Agro-Forestry Training. These 10 Units will be selected from most affected areas and will look into development needs of specific territories will support the employment of 500 people. Of which 50% will be women.

This proposal is a pilot project that the Government is committing to replicate; expectation is reaching at least 100 Units, which would be equivalent to generating 5000 jobs. The National Government would fund (aproximatly 8 million USD) this under the national reforestation program that will be initiated country wide during this first semester.

The project is thus characteristically an early recovery one, as it addresses recovery needs during a humanitarian phase — preparing for larger recovery projects—while at the same time providing humanitarian assistance to affected populations to maintain and recover their livelihoods.

Project Summary

Since January 2008, the heavy rainy season linked with other climate-related hazards have flooded the low lands of the Ecuadorian coast. Soil degradation as a result of sustained deforestation processes due to inadequate hillside and mountain slope agricultural practices has significantly contributed to the current situation given that vegetation acts as natural boarders to this region.

The complete destruction of 64.000 has. in six provinces of the coast and the extensive damage of up to 100.000 additional hectares has resulted in a severe loss of agricultural production, including crops that supply food and the main source of the income to the population in rural areas. Latest estimates suggest that at least 340.000 people have been directly affected by the floods, with a total population of 12.000 still living in shelters.

At this point in time, response to the disaster can still be characterized as in the humanitarian phase since the rain has not stopped, and it is expected to continue for at least two more months. Distribution of basic supplies,



food and medicines is taking place not only amongst those living in shelters but also with those who have decided to not move out from their dwellings and are still surrounded by un-safe water.

The Coordinating Ministry for the Coastal Region (Ministerio Coordinador para el Litoral) is in charge of the overall coordination of both the humanitarian and post-disaster recovery phases. They have identified a twofold strategy that will assist the affected population through the fast generation of income (temporary jobs), while assuring a rapid restitution of seeds to supply for the initiation of the next crop cycle. The floods caused the partial or total loss of most of the season crops, and a gap of at least 8 months will exist, should authorities simply wait for the next sowing season.

Therefore, the crop cycle will be foreshortened moving ahead in the organization of groups in the affected communities and the procurement of goods required for the project in the 2 months while the rains stop, 2 months for the flooded areas to recover, land preparation and basic infrastructure ready, and a total of 4 months to have the new seed bank ready to be planted.

As such, anticipating the process through the proposed nurseries the seed bank will be ready in four months and the gap in people's income generation and the food security situation will be minimized in the areas of intervention.

Under this framework, UNDP has been requested to contribute to this initiative by supporting the implementation of a pilot project that will be progressively replicated in at least five of the most affected provinces. This project will:

- 1. Create income generating opportunities, which will assure temporary employment for 500 heads of families (men and women) throughout the next 5 months. Mechanisms will be put in place to assure that 50% of the heads of families benefit women.
- 2. Implement 10 nurseries (Units for Agro-Forestry Training) to grow 250.000 plants including agricultural and non-agricultural varieties that will be transplanted once the rain has stopped. These plants will be used to protect hydrographic/water basins and also to commence the production of agricultural trees for food provision. It is expected that out of the 500 temporary employments that will be created by this project, at least 50 permanent positions will be established per nursery. Affirmative action policies will be put in place to ensure equal opportunities for women.
- 3. Ensure that a gender focus is mainstreamed throughout the different phases of this project, a thorough localized gender analysis and strategy will be developed with funds from the regular program.

This proposal is part of a wider and comprehensive approach to Recovery, taking fast and high impact actions in short term projects, contained in the National Recovery Plan. The Recovery needs evolve fast in a highly dynamic environment; therefore, this project constitutes the first step into a wider range of recovery efforts in which UNDP will be supporting the Government of Ecuador. Project Summary

Since January 2008, the heavy rainy season linked with other climate-related hazards have flooded the low lands of the Ecuadorian coast. Soil degradation as a result of sustained deforestation processes due to inadequate hillside and mountain slope agricultural practices has significantly contributed to the current situation given that vegetation acts as natural boarders to this region.

The complete destruction of 64.000 has. in six provinces of the coast and the extensive damage of up to 100.000 additional hectares has resulted in a severe loss of agricultural production, including crops that supply food and the main source of the income to the population in rural areas. Latest estimates suggest that at least 340.000 people have been directly affected by the floods, with a total population of 12.000 still living in shelters.

At this point in time, response to the disaster can still be characterized as in the humanitarian phase since the rain has not stopped, and it is expected to continue for at least two more months. Distribution of basic supplies,



food and medicines is taking place not only amongst those living in shelters but also with those who have decided to not move out from their dwellings and are still surrounded by un-safe water.

The Coordinating Ministry for the Coastal Region (Ministerio Coordinador para el Litoral) is in charge of the overall coordination of both the humanitarian and post-disaster recovery phases. They have identified a twofold strategy that will assist the affected population through the fast generation of income (temporary jobs), while assuring a rapid restitution of seeds to supply for the initiation of the next crop cycle. The floods caused the partial or total loss of most of the season crops, and a gap of at least 8 months will exist, should authorities simply wait for the next sowing season.

Therefore, the crop cycle will be foreshortened moving ahead in the organization of groups in the affected communities and the procurement of goods required for the project in the 2 months while the rains stop, 2 months for the flooded areas to recover, land preparation and basic infrastructure ready, and a total of 4 months to have the new seed bank ready to be planted.

As such, anticipating the process through the proposed nurseries the seed bank will be ready in four months and the gap in people's income generation and the food security situation will be minimized in the areas of intervention.

Under this framework, UNDP has been requested to contribute to this initiative by supporting the implementation of a pilot project that will be progressively replicated in at least five of the most affected provinces. This project will:

- 1. Create income generating opportunities, which will assure temporary employment for 500 heads of families (men and women) throughout the next 5 months. Mechanisms will be put in place to assure that 50% of the heads of families benefit women.
- 2. Implement 10 nurseries (Units for Agro-Forestry Training) to grow 250.000 plants including agricultural and non-agricultural varieties that will be transplanted once the rain has stopped. These plants will be used to protect hydrographic/water basins and also to commence the production of agricultural trees for food provision. It is expected that out of the 500 temporary employments that will be created by this project, at least 50 permanent positions will be established per nursery. Affirmative action policies will be put in place to ensure equal opportunities for women.
- 3. Ensure that a gender focus is mainstreamed throughout the different phases of this project, a thorough localized gender analysis and strategy will be developed with funds from the regular program.
