Brief Description of the Project

The overall goal of the project is to support the implementation of the Climate-Resilient Green Economy (CRGE) strategies and to contribute to the fulfilment of the vision of the Government of Ethiopia to become a middle income and a low-carbon and climate resilient green economy by 2025.

The project will enable to increase Ethiopia's resilience capacity to climate change and to maintain its sustained growth by promoting a green and low carbon economy. The project interventions are articulated around two key issues.



The first issue concerns the need to foster the national policy, planning and institutional development processes related to low-carbon, resilience to climate change and green growth. The second issue addresses resilience building through the conservation and sound management of natural capital, which requires to be fostered.

To third issue is enhancement of NDC implementation in the identified NDC sectors to increase emission reduction potential in order to have a more realistic chance to achieve the country's ambitious target of 64% emission reduction by 2030 while building the country's adaptive capacity and resilience.



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

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
