The expected tasks for the consultancy are as follows:

#### A RE Technology Application Expert - RTAE

- Review existing and/or planned legislations and policies (environment, climate change, energy, etc) that relates to RE and GHG mitigation in ROP and the key barriers for their appropriateness and effectiveness;
- Recommend measures for removing the barriers to the appropriateness and effectiveness of existing and/or planned legislations and policies identified;
- Review the technical sustainability of past and current climate change mitigation initiatives involving renewable energy and identify the barriers (technical, social, institutional, policy) for their success;

#### 2. Stakeholders and Beneficiaries involved in Project

The envisioned medium size project (MSP) will address all potential RE resources in Palau in meeting the energy demands in the various energy-consuming sectors of the Palauan economy. The following tentative list of proposed stakeholders in the participating countries may change as consultation through the proposed PDF-A exercise evolves: Some of the possible stakeholders of the project include the following: (a) Bureau of Public Works/Energy Office – Executing Agency; (b) Ministry of Commerce and Trade; (c) Palau Public Utilities Corporation; (d) Office of Environment Response and Coordination – National GEF Operational Focal Point; (e) Ministry of Finance; (f) Bureau of Foreign Affairs; (g) Bureau of Planning and Statistics; and, (h) Palau Community Action Agency.

# 3. Rationale for GEF Involvement and Fit with GEF Operational Programmes and Strategic Priorities

Consistent with its development objective of economic base diversification with specific focus on private sector development to achieve economic growth, and for the cost-effective utilization of its renewable energy resources, the Government of Palau will implement an EDF-funded solar energy project, under the ACP-EU cooperation (Contonou Partnership Agreement), which will promote and develop solar energy-based power generation to support the country's rural electrification program. The proposed MSP will widen the scope of the EU-funded solar energy development project by addressing all potential RE resources in Palau. It will involve activities that would overcome/remove barriers to the development and widespread use RE, as well as activities addressing the GEF strategic priorities on increased access to financing of RE projects, and productive uses of RE in line with enhancing socio-economic growth in country's rural areas. The envisioned MSP will be designed taking into consideration the: (1) current situation regarding the extent of RE technology utilization in the country;(2) forecast growth in the national energy demand; (3) other policies, programs and plans of the government that are relevant to RE development; (4) awareness about, and attitude towards, RE of the citizens of Palau; (5) overall interest of the communities and the financial institutions in investing in RE technology application ventures and their capability to finance and sustain such schemes; (6) level of technical capability in designing, installing, operating and maintaining RE system hardware in the national government, communities, and private sector; and (7) current level of development and application of RE technology in the country.

# 4. Expected Goal, Objectives and Outcomes of Final Project and Relevance to Outcomes of CPD and UNDAF

Overall, the project is intended to contribute to, at least in the reduction of the growth rate of GHG emissions from the diesel-based power generation in Palau. The success of the project is envisioned to encourage the widespread application of RE technology not only to meet the electricity needs of the country but also provide the other energy requirements in the other major sectors of the national economy. A detailed plan of project activities will be developed as part of the PDF-A exercise. Although the framework, mechanics and components of the intended project are yet to be defined, it is possible to at least have an idea of what could its outcomes based on previous similar project implementations. The following are some the possible outcomes of the planned MSP:
