# RESILIENT LANDSCAPES FOR SUSTAINABLE LIVELIHOODS: 2013 QUARTER 3 & QUARTER 4 WORK PLAN

#### 1. Background

The RESILIENT LANDSCAPES FOR SUSTAINABLE LIVELIHOODS (RLSL) Project is a Joint Programme on climate change adaptation and disaster risk reduction with a focus on long-term food security in northern Ghana. Under Ministry of Food and Agriculture (MoFA)'s leadership, four UN Agencies - Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO), United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), United Nations University Institute for Natural Resources in Africa (UNU-INRA), and World Food Progarmme (WFP) - working in the field of climate change adaptation (CCA), disaster risk reduction (DRR), and sustainable land management (SLM) came together to provide comprehensive and catalytic support for the Government of Ghana to advance in their effort towards achieving their development goals within the agricultural sector sustainably and equitably.

The Project Document for the RLSL Project was endorsed in October 2012. The UN Joint Team then embarked on a series of resource mobilization efforts in the succeeding months based on a Resource Mobilization Strategy. By July 2013, while full project funds were yet to be mobilized, the following internal funds were identified to undertake initial activities.

In light of this situation, UN Heads of Agency met in July 2013, and recommended that:

- 1. In order not to lose funds available for 2013, we initiate implementation of the Joint Programme (JP) with the available funds
- 2. We undertake a phased approach giving priority to activities that can be implemented / completed with the available resources (2013 & 2014) in case we do not get all the funding needed to implement the entire JP
- 3. The resource mobilization strategy for the JP and associated documents (communication materials etc) should be resent to RCO for circulation to the HOAs

Based on this recommendation, after consultation and consensus with MoFA, a detailed Work Plan for 2013 has been developed.

#### 2. Goals and Scope

Activities and deliverables during 2013 will focus on catalytic efforts that would not only serve as the foundation of succeeding work of the RLSL project, but also for the implementation of MoFA's policies (i.e. METASIP Programme 4), as well as for resource mobilization efforts. Therefore, 2013 Q3 and Q4 Work Plan for the RLSL Project focuses on 1) a comprehensive baseline gathering and database development, and 2) participatory and rigorous pilot site selection.



### 3. Key Milestones and Outputs

Key Milestones for 2013 Q3 and Q4 include the following:

- 1) A comprehensive baseline report and database with information on:
  - o Scientific data and socioeconomic impact of climate change and disaster risks
  - Relevant projects, plans, and policies in the three regions in Northern Ghana on CCA, DRR, SLM (including agricultural microfinance efforts)
  - Mainstreaming status of CCA, DRR, and SLM in regional and district level plans and budget, and agricultural sector policies, plans, and budgets
- 2) Pilot sites (2 districts and 8 communities) selected based on rigorous criteria, analysis, and stakeholder participation

## Expected Outputs include:

- 1) A Comprehensive regional and district profile
- 2) Database of relevant information CCA, DRR, SLM in the three regions in Northern Ghana
- 3) Mission Report from technical mission for regional stakeholder engagement
- 4) Final Report with proposed Pilot Sites

Activities and Outputs in 2013 will deliver on the following Outcome and Outputs of the Project Document:

- (1.1.2.) Analyse existing efforts and information on scientific and socio-economic impacts of climate change and disaster risks in the three regions in Northern Ghana
