Brief Description

The National Information and Communication Infrastructure (NICI) of The Gambia has laid out its policies and plans where ICT can contribute to the attainment of the four (4) strategic issues identified in the Poverty Reduction Strategy Programme (PRSP) i.e. (a) enhancing the productive capacity of the poor, (b) enhancing access to and the performance of social services, (c) local level capacity building, and (d) promoting participatory communication processes. One of the components of the NICI policies, strategies and plans is the e-government strategy, which is formulated and is aimed to: (i) assist the country in its efforts to develop multi-sectoral e-government programme, and (ii) within the African Information Society Initiative (AISI) framework, support the projects prepared by the national technical committee with the assistance of ECA. The establishment of a government web portal that will provide sufficient information about the departments of state and its plans, programmes and services, is one of the priority areas of intervention areas identified in the national e-governance strategy. It will enable citizens to access those services and related information and provide their feedback on various policies.



1. Welcome & Opening Remarks

Following introductory remarks by the Chair of the meeting, Bashirou Garba Jahumpa, Officer in Charge, putting the project proposal in the perspective of Vision 2020, the PRSP, the Country Programme Document (2007-1011) and subsequently its implementation framework: the Country Programme Action Plan (CPAP 2007-2011). The initiation project which will take the duration of 6 months with effect from 15th October 2008, will be funded by UNDP (TRAC1/2) at the tune of US\$45,000 which is earmarked for implementation of the project.

2. Presentation of Project

A brief overview of the project was given by Edgardo Villena, UNV ICT Officer at the Department of State for Communication, Information and Information Technology. The project is developed to provide support to the establishment of a government web portal that will provide sufficient information about the departments of state and their plans, programmes and services. It will also enhance accountability by making government operations more transparent thus reducing opportunities for corruption. It will enable citizens to access these services and related information and provide their feedback on various policies. In this way, the web portal will serve as a platform to promote civic engagement by enabling the public to interact and express their views. The project aims to deliver the following outputs: (i)Design and Development of an Official Government Web Portal for The Gambia (ii) Building capacities on the use of the Web Portal (iii) Formulation of a fully fledged project document on Support to the National E-Government Strategy of The Gambia.

3. Discussion on Objectives & Quality of the Proposal

The meeting agreed to the pertinence and timely nature of the project at a time when The Gambia Government does not have one main websites where information is shared. The project will therefore, give rise to the creation of a single government website in addition to 12 new Department of States Websites. The project perfectly fits into UNDP thematic support areas as it will enhance transparency and accountability through the creation of a forum for increased government and citizen interface. Furthermore, the web portal will bring greater coordination between and among government data providers. This will have the added benefit of creating discrepancies in data information within government. The project has received government endorsement as it is in line with the current Country Programme Action Plan (CPAP).

4 Recommendations

- The meeting was notified of advertisements that have already been published on the papers in relation to the consultancy to develop the web portal. It was recommended that a meeting should be organized urgently to review the proposals received for the consultancy.
- Bearing in mind the late start of the project contrary to the envisaged start of implementation, it was agreed that 2 consultants would be hired to execute the activities scheduled for implementation.
- Majority of the scheduled activities will be implemented this 4th quarter of 2008.
- The proposal should be endorsed for implementation.
- An MOU should be done between UNDP and the Department of State for Communication, Information and Information Technology, to expedite the advance of funds to the latter for implementation of the activities stipulated on the proposal
